


Este dragón sencillo te lo puedes llevar a tu casa en tu bolsillo.




Lo que necesitas:

- papel verde 8½ x 11 (o el color que escojas)
- trocitos de papel rojo y amarillo
- crayones
- pega

Lo que tienes que hacer:


- 1. Dobla el papel en tres partes a lo largo.
- 2. Dobla el papel por la mitad y entonces dobla cada orilla hacia el doblez en el centro.
- 3. Invierte el doblez del centro para que puedan entrar tus dedos y el pulgar.
- Usa crayones para darle escamas, ojos, orejas, narices y dientes. Usa el papel rojo y amarillo para la lengua y el 'fuego'.







Dóblalo por la mitad.



Dobla el papel en tres partes.

Abre la parte doblada y lleva cada orilla al doblez del centro.








