What is JSTOR?

JSTOR is a digital library of more than 2,600 top academic journals, over 90,000 ebooks, and 2 million primary sources for the intellectually curious that provides a platform for discovering and connecting research, images, and primary sources. JSTOR is a highly selective digital library of academic content in many formats and disciplines with collections that include top peer-reviewed scholarly journals as well as respected literary journals. JSTOR works with a diverse group of nearly 1,200 publishers from more than 57 countries to preserve and make their content digitally available.

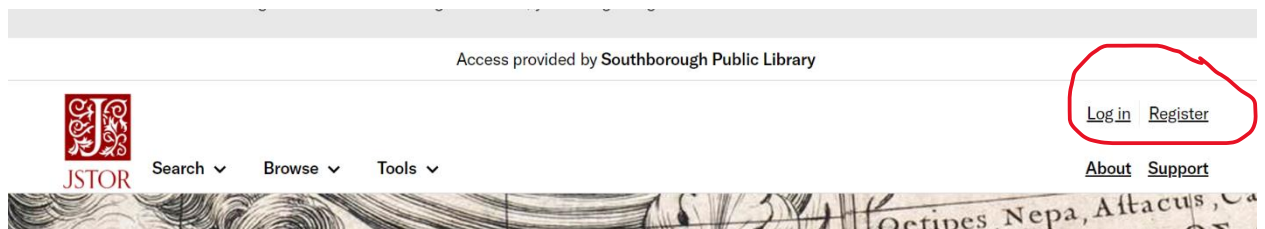
How do I use JSTOR?

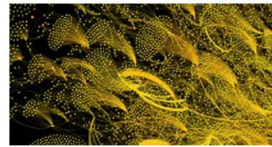
