July 27th: **Meredith** 17 (Jeness Hill Rd) and **Gilford** (55 Cherry Valley Rd)
August 3rd: **Bristol** (Newfound Reg. High Sch.) and **Moultonborough** (68 Hwy Garage Rd)
September 26th: **Tuftonboro** (20 Sargent's Crossing – off Route 171)
September 28th: **Laconia** (27 Bisson Ave)

These locations and dates are available to New Hampton residents. You may be asked for proof of residency.
