



La Grange Public Library

The StudioGC team worked with La Grange Public Library to address a major dilemma they were facing. The building had a great presence on the street but when you came through the oversized vestibule you were presented with dark, uninviting spaces, with significant wayfinding issues. Patrons often commented on the ambience of the Library resembling an office building. The Library and its community wanted a space that was more inviting and practical.

StudioGC reconfigured the plan, capturing 850 square feet of underutilized exterior space, which was under the second floor, to transform the lobby and children's area into an exciting, transparent, and light filled space. The new spaces within the lobby allow for Patrons to hang out, read a book, catch up with their friend, or play with their kids in the new and updated children's space.



In the 20-plus years since the last building upgrade in 1989, the Fossil Ridge Public Library served the community well with a range of library services. By 2015, it was time for a refresh and a re-think. When Rich Ashley came on board as Library Director, he made modernizing the library priority and built support for a project among the trustees.

Fossil Ridge Public Library District hired StudioGC to help them identify their needs and examine the potential of the existing library building. Working with the Library Board and staff, StudioGC recommended a general refresh, opening up the interior to improve sight lines, expanding children's services and providing a defined teen area. We worked with the Library to establish collection weeding targets to open up the space and to select furnishings and finishes that energize the interior and appeal to a wide range of ages and backgrounds.

The new library plan is centered around a flexible social space where customers enjoy reading new books, conversation and coffee. StudioGC specified wheeled furnishing for the social area to enable it to quickly be modified for functions and events. The newly revitalized Fossil Ridge Public Library opened to great acclaim in January 2017 and has truly become a community center; the StudioGC Library Team is honored to have played a part in this transformation.

StudioGC's new library for the Lake Villa Public Library District began construction summer 2017. The library's building program was done by an outside consultant and was prepared in a traditional library-planning manner. By looking at the client's goals and applying our new approaches the StudioGC library team was able to work with library staff and trustees to meet their service and design goals in a library that is 67,000 square feet rather than the 80,000 square feet suggested in the building program, saving the district over \$6,000,000.

The design emphasizes flexibility, efficiency, views to the adjacent lake and maximum use of natural light. The library opened its doors in August and has received overwhelmingly positive reviews. The Lake Villa District Library sets a new standard for what 21st-century libraries can be.

The reimagined library includes space for social gatherings, small group meeting rooms and a large flat screen display area optimized for movies and events.

We also designed an exterior shading system for the original south-facing windows to wash the interior with reflected natural light and eliminate overheating that had plagued the library since its construction.

Gail Borden Public Library District - South Elgin Branch

The Gail Borden Public Library District had long searched for a way to provide better library service for the South Elgin portion of the District's service area and selected StudioGC to create a branch library in an unfinished storefront space.

StudioGC's design features ample natural light, lively colors and a flexible interior arrangement that provides high-tech library service and meeting space that was critically needed in South Elgin. The branch utilizes self-service technology and mobile computing to maximize the efficiency and provide the maximum amount of service within a compact footprint.

The South Elgin branch opened to great acclaim in summer 2016 and is receiving rave reviews from the community.



















Cost Estimating

StudioGC has excelled in controlling cost through construction. With 25+ years of experience with library projects we understand what library buildings cost. We begin with a clear understanding of the project scope and identifying and tracking all hard and soft costs that make up the project budget. Based on our experience, by the time we are in the programming phase we will have a good idea if the project is aligned with your cost expectations. If there is a discrepancy, we will bring it to the fore and sit down with you to discuss the options. If required, we will work with you to adjust the program as required to bring the project cost in line.

The second part of cost control is developing clear and concise drawings in which the contractor uses to develop their bid price. After the bids are received, our company provides a weekly site visit throughout the course of construction. During this visit our staff discusses the work with the contractor's team and observes that the work is progressing per the documents. Working together, unforeseen conditions and questions can be assessed and answered quickly in the field. Being proactive in identifying issues is an important practice to avoid delay in the work and additional cost. Our library project sheets show the contract cost and the final cost at the end of the project. Our estimates average within approximately 2.5% of the final cost.

When we go to bid, we usually carry a 7% contingency and a carefully selected group of alternate bids to allow us to respond to any unanticipated conditions we may encounter.

Effective cost control is a critical part of our service. Almost all of our projects are publicly funded with fixed budgets. We understand the need for constant monitoring of project cost.

We typically prepare comprehensive estimates at a number of pre-set points of project development. They include;

- Program Phase conceptual estimate as described above
- Conceptual Design Estimate when the program is completed

• Schematic Design phase estimate prepared around 75% of the way into Schematic Design; we prepare this estimate early enough to allow for any design modifications that might be required to keep the budget in line

• Design Development Phase estimate. At this point we will work with you to establish an appropriate number of alternate bids that will allow us to respond to bidding conditions when the project goes out for pricing.

• 50% Construction Document Estimate. As with the Schematic Design Estimate we prepare The CD estimate early enough to allow for any design modifications that might be required to keep the budget in line.

Architectural Fees

We initially base our fees on fee guides that were used by various state governments, typically Wisconsin and Illinois, for state projects. These are usually in the form of a percentage of the estimated cost of construction. These are then negotiated with the client to address any conditions particular to that project. No fee is determined until you understand it and we reach a consensus.

Services beyond the scope of the AIA contract

We do not anticipate that any services beyond the scope of the AIA contract will be required for your project.

Due to our previous experience with your building and your project we have a significant amount of backup material on hand and will be able to offer you a meaningful discount on future architectural fees for work done to date. The discount will be based on the amount of previous work that can be applied to this project. We will mutually arrive at an appropriate discount during contract negotiations.



Why do you want to be chosen?

From StudioGC Library Team Leader Rick McCarthy


My personal association with the Irvin Young Library extends over nearly a decade. I want to see this project through and be a part of giving the residents of Whitewater the library that they deserve.

The initial project began with a larger scope – and hence a larger price tag. That initial scope was defined by Anders Dhalgren's 2012 space needs summary but may have been an over-reach when compared to local resources at that time. My personal goal is to work with you to get the maximum public benefit at a cost that the community can accept. The current program of expanded meeting space, smaller meeting rooms, children/young adult expansion and expanded maker space address some of the library's most pressing needs - we feel that this is an appropriate project scope. The original project size required an addition to the south which was a relatively costly option due to the grade change in that direction. The current scope opens up a number of other less costly options. Our team evaluated a number of other potential additions during our previous studies and is ready to hit the ground running with options that will be appropriate for the current project scope.

As implied above, lot of the work that my team did over the years is still applicable to the project. We understand the challenges posed by the existing building, the grade change across the site, storm water drainage, parking, the need to fit into the existing context and a host of other project-specific conditions. These are all items that need to be addressed. We can approach this project with an initial level of understanding that no other team can offer. As mentioned elsewhere in this response, we can also offer a reduction in professional fees to account for background work that has already been completed. At the same time, we are happy to take a fresh look at everything and not be limited by any of our previous conceptions of architectural expression or earlier solutions. This is your library; our team will listen to you and work with you to provide a design that reflects you and the community

What is the greatest challenge?

We see 2 primary challenges;

• The existing library building and site present a number of architectural challenges ranging from minimal roof slopes that are difficult to drain, a site that drops toward the south and inconveniently placed utilities. We are intimately familiar with all of these conditions and will provide an affordable and attractive solution that meets your goals at the lowest cost.

Techniques and Project Approach

Our planning process is flexible and will be tailored to meet your specific needs. The StudioGC Library Team will work with you to schedule internal and/or public events for discussion and collaboration with stakeholders. These meetings will promote investigation, challenge preconceptions and identify solutions that are relevant to your organization and to the community.

We begin master planning projects with a series of logical, progressive steps.

Educate

The rapid rate of change in the industry have left many questioning the place of libraries. We will interactively discuss the future of public libraries and review relevant local topics.

StudioGC excels in fostering effective public and library team involvement; it is a core part of our process and we are noted for our engaging and interactive presentations. We feel that participants need a real understanding of the potential of a 21st century library before we engage them in the planning process. We cover new technology, collection trends and design for collaboration. This discussion can involve community members, library and municipal boards as well as library staff. It will create a basis of knowledge for ongoing discussions and decisions during the master planning process. Even a forward-looking and educated staff such as yours can benefit from interactive exchanges that present new ideas and different outlooks.

StudioGC uses social media to encourage participation in the planning process. We have had great success engaging library clients using Pinterest Boards and similar social media platforms. These tools help us interact with community stakeholders on many different levels and allow us to hear from stakeholders that may be unavailable for meetings.

Engage

StudioGC will meet with stakeholders, identify aspirations and establish goals. We will engage administration and staff to plan the public conversation and work with you to create a variety of input portals.

Sometimes low tech, face-to-face is the best approach. The picture on the left shows one of our interior designers leading a StudioGC "Block Party" in which we invite library staff to work with the Design Team to explore the relationships between the various spaces and activities within the library. Not everybody understands architectural drawings, but everybody understands blocks – we find that utilizing the right tool is often the key to successful participant engagement.

We began by promising to hear what has been said. We never know where the next great idea will come from and are always willing to listen. The adjacent photo is from a recent public event we hosted at New Richmond Wisconsin's Friday Memorial Library where we asked children and teens to contribute ideas for their respective areas of the library.


There are many ways that we can let you know what we've learned from the engagement process. When possible, we like to use graphical representations to allow you to quickly take in our findings.


Prepare the Program

The building program is the road map that provides a basis for subsequent design exploration. At the close of the engagement phase the StudioGC team will work with you to prepare a program that succinctly summarizes your goals. The program will outline proposed collection sizes, room requirements for all spaces that are to be redesigned, adjacency requirements, staffing, lighting, appropriate noise levels and other unique requirements. Our programming is an interactive process; our team will work closely with the Library's staff and administration to produce a program that reflects your aspirations and your community.





Project Understanding/Approach



Explore and Discover

We begin planning explorations only after completing the Education and Engagement phases of the planning process and ensuring that the Community, Board, Library staff and planners have a similar understanding of the project's goals.

We will start with the big picture; how customers first encounter the library, how they enter, how they find what they are looking for and how we can promote serendipitous discovery along the way.

As we begin to refine the big picture, the plan will become more detailed. Using information garnered during the engagement and programming exercises we will create conceptual layouts to review with stakeholders. We will see which ideas stick and identify those that need to be discarded.

At this time we will begin to look at conceptual estimates to confirm that they are in line with your proposed project budget and an initial phasing analysis to determine what should happen when. Every step from this point forward will include an update of conceptual project costs to confirm that the planning is in line with your financial expectations.

A happy staff is reflected in great library service. We pay special attention to planning considerations that have an impact on staff operations and workload. We understand that an engaged staff is behind every successful library. We must create a good environment for those that spend their working lives within its confines.
