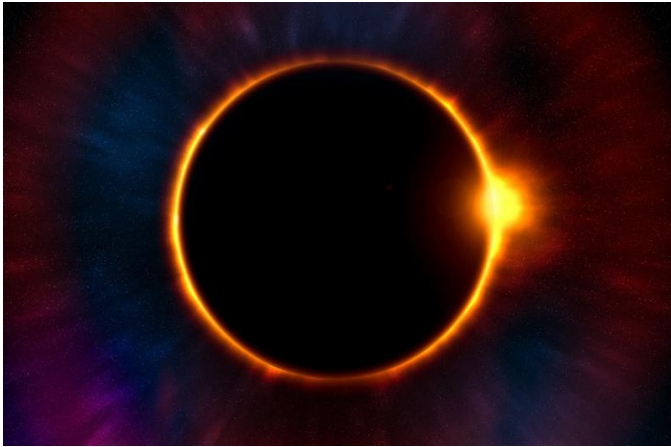
### **The Astronomical Event of the Decade**

**Professor Ian Durham discusses the details of this summer's solar eclipse**

On **Wednesday, August 2 (NEW DATE)** at 6:00 p.m., we will welcome Professor Ian Durham from the Astronomical Society of Northern New England to present on what experts are calling "the astronomical event of the decade." On August 21, the continental U.S. will see its first solar eclipse in almost 40 years, the first to fully cross the country since 1918. Though the path of totality will be

south of us, here in Kennebunk we will still be treated to a 60% partial eclipse. Professor Durham will speak about why eclipses happen, different kinds of eclipses, how to view them safely, and what Kennebunk can expect during the "Great American Eclipse." We will have free eclipse-viewing glasses available to take home.

Ian is Professor and Chair of the Department of Physics at Saint Anselm College in Manchester, New Hampshire. His research focuses on relativistic quantum information and the foundations of physics and mathematics. In particular, he is interested in the 'big questions.' As such, he is a member of the John Templeton Foundation-funded Foundational Questions Institute (FQXi) and is the founding editor of The Quantum Times, which is a publication of the American Physical Society's Division of Quantum



Information (DQI). He recently completed a three-year term as Secretary-Treasurer of DQI, the world's largest organization dedicated to quantum information and quantum computing. He is currently serving as Treasurer of the Kennebunk-based Astronomical Society of Northern New England (ASNNE), of which he has been a member for 15 years. He lives in Kennebunk with his wife, kids, and dog where he enjoys fly fishing, softball and other pursuits in his spare time.

## The Sky's the Limit

Come learn about the summer skies in a portable planetarium with Scott Negley, Solar System Ambassador. This event will take place at Kennebunk Free Library on **Wednesday, August 9**, at 2:30 and 6 p.m., and is open to all ages. Registration is required.

Scott will be presenting his Summer Skies program, where participants will be invited into the planetarium to learn about constellations that are visible during the summer. He will also describe some remarkable NASA projects involving the solar system. We will have free eclipse-viewing glasses available to take home. Join us and take a trip to the stars!



Scott Negley is one of NASA's Solar System Ambassadors. He is the director of Mainely Stars Planetarium, whose goal is to "help children reach for the stars". Scott Negley owns and operates a portable planetarium system for presenting astronomy programs to elementary and middle school classes in northern New England. Educated initially as an engineer, a binocular tour of the heavens ignited a passion for the stars that led him to the University of Pennsylvania for a M.S. degree in

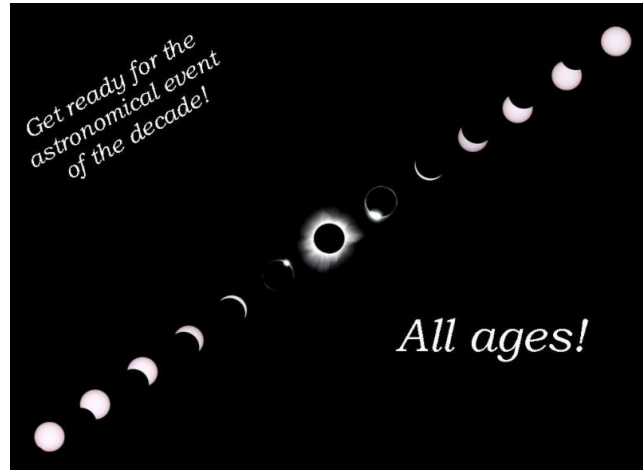
astronomy and a 40-year career as an astronomy educator. He has been privileged to convey the splendor of the universe to students of all ages, initially as a university instructor, then as a school district planetarium director, adult school teacher and elderhostel instructor. As a Solar System Ambassador, Scott enjoys the opportunity to educate and inspire others with NASA's magnificent discoveries.

## Make Your Own Solar Eclipse Viewer

On Monday, August 21, a total solar eclipse will sweep across America. Though we are not directly in its path, about 60% of the sun will be covered in Kennebunk. This is the first solar eclipse in almost 40 years to hit mainland America, and the first in almost a century to traverse the U.S. from coast to coast.

Except for a few minutes during a total eclipse, it is *never* safe to look directly at the sun. So, how do we prepare for this exciting event? Children and adults of all ages are invited to the library on **Thursday, August 17** at 3:30 p.m. to make a pinhole viewer, one of the easiest ways to watch an eclipse. Come learn about eclipses, how to safely view them, and what to expect on Monday. All materials will be provided. Make sure you are prepared for the astronomical event of the decade!

## A Statewide Summer Reading Program with a Maine Twist

Author Debra Spark discusses her book for the Read ME program

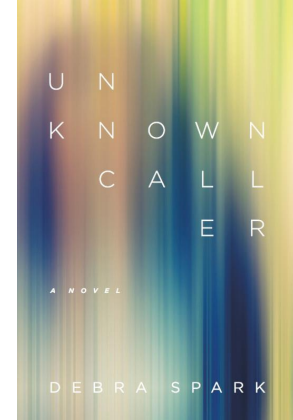
Join Debra Spark on **Saturday, August 5** at 10 a.m. as she discusses her fourth novel, *Unknown Caller*, which was selected for the Read ME program. *Unknown Caller*, tells the story of a brief, failed marriage and its complicated aftermath. Leaping effortlessly across decades and continents, it works to uncover the reasons for Idzia and Liesel's disappearance and the deeper puzzle of Liesel's identity. Spark's candid, intricate novel highlights the near-impossibility of truly knowing another person, the pain in failing relationships, and the joy in successful ones.

Debra Spark is a senior writer for Maine Home+Design and has received several awards including a National Endowment for the Arts

Fellowship. She lives with her husband and son in North Yarmouth, and teaches at Colby College and in the MFA Program for Writers at Warren Wilson College.

Read ME is a new statewide summer reading program that gets Maine's adults all reading the same books - by Maine authors and recommended by a Maine author. This year's recommendations, one fiction and one non-fiction (*The Moth*) by new or lesser-known Maine authors, were selected by Monica Wood.

KFL will also have a discussion of *The Moth* on Tuesday, August 22 at 1 p.m.

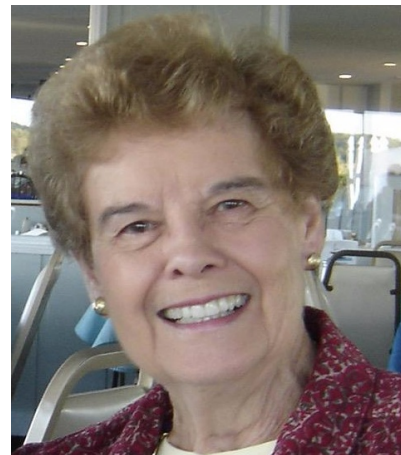

Join author, Lorraine Dutile Masure at Kennebunk Free Library on **Monday, August 21** at 6 p.m. as she discusses her book *Growing Up Franco American* (with no black patent-leather shoes). A Q&A session and signing will follow and copies will be available for purchase.

Intended for all, *Growing Up* is the intriguing story of courageous grandparent and parent immigrants who heartily embraced their new country, the United States, yet remained inherently true to many of their cherished Old World traditions. Acting as a cultural tour guide, Masure tells stories of what it was really like growing up with a rich Franco heritage across multiple venues of home, family, church, school, and other settings.

Lorraine Dutile Masure, a former university administrator, has lived in Maine most of her 83 years with a salty ardor she avows is incontrovertible. She joyfully enjoys presenting oral paraphrases of her book and leads Senior College classes about Broadway musicals. Although this is her first attempt at "book writing," she has been published a number of times locally, regionally, and once nationally. Otherwise she delights living in Maine, often penning observations of a more current nature under the supervision of her Jellicle cat, Molly.

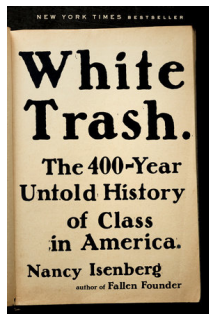

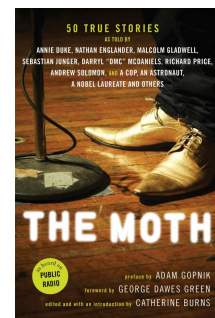

## Did You Know? Text Notifications

Do you find yourself impatiently checking your e-mail to see if the book that you requested has arrived? We have great news for you! You are now able to get real-time notifications via text when your items arrive. You will also get notices when items need to be renewed.

There are just a few simple steps to set up your text notifications: In the library catalog:

- click on "My Library Account" in the top right-hand corner and log in using your last name and barcode number
- select "Modify Personal Information" and fill in the box marked "Mobile Phone Number" (use xxx-xxx-xxxx format) and check the "Opt In" button underneath.
- scroll all the way down to the bottom of the screen and click "Submit."
- within a few minutes, you'll get a text message asking you to "Reply YES to subscribe to SMS Library Alerts."
- you will then get a message "Congrats! U subscribed to SMS Library Alerts."

The only "catch" is that you will receive one text for each item that arrives. If 15 books come for you in one day, you will get 15 texts. You can, of course, opt out at any time. All you have to do is text "STOP." If you have questions or problems, give us a call - we'll be happy to help.
