
UPCOMING LIBRARY CLOSINGS:

Alexander McCall Smith's <u>TINY TALES</u>—I needed 'charming' and McCall Smith delivered! The sort of book that was perfect to have at my bedside to close out the day. I have also been listening (via LIBBY) to Glennon Doyle's <u>UNTAMED</u>. Doyle has an honesty and insight that is well-spoken. It provided a lot of food for thought about empathy and self care.

Watching: I have absolutely been loving the series LOKI this past month. (Did you know Loki has his own <u>self-titled YA novel?</u>) and In preparation for the next Marvel TV series, I read the collected "<u>WHAT IF</u>?" comic collection available on Hoopla. This comic series reimagines the marvel universe by asking questions like "What if Cap and Bucky survived World War II?" and "What if the Avengers never existed?" This is great for anyone who has read a comic and wondered "What if..?

Reading: BOX IN THE WOODS by Maureen Johnson, This is the most recent addition to the Stevie Bell Series. After her adventures at Ellingham Academy, aspiring detective and true crime enthusiast Stevie Bell takes on a new case at a summer camp. It has all the grisly fun of a slasher film paired with the engaging and dynamic writing I adored from the original trilogy. This is hands down one of my favorite YA series and I am so happy to have the most recent installment on our shelves.

Playing: Stardew Valley, a darling farming game which has me looking at my backyard with new eyes. This game has led me to doing my own research and picking up <u>SMALL-SPACE VEGETABLE GARDENS</u>: growing great edibles in <u>containers</u>, raised beds, and small plots by Andrea Bellamy and "Plantiful: start small, grow big with 150 plants that spread, self-sow, and overwinter" by Kristin Green. Though with how quick this summer has gone I have a feeling my gardening will stay virtual for the time being.

Read: It has been the summer of non-fiction for me. <u>PREMONITION</u> by Michael Lewis highlights the reactions of some key players in the pandemic that you've probably never heard of. I also listened to <u>EMPIRE OF PAIN</u> by Patrick Radden Keefe. The book is a comprehensive history of the Sackler family and how they built their fortunes by marketing and manufacturing the drug oxycontin, a catalyst of the opioid crisis. These titles are available for download through the library's <u>UP NORTH DIGITAL COLLECTION</u>.

This month, I have been reading <u>CELLS AT WORK</u> by Akane Shimizu. It personifies all the functions and threats the human body experiences, especially focusing on a plucky red blood cell and a mysterious (and ferocious) white blood cell as they try to protect the body from pneumococcus, an allergy to cedar pollen, influenza, and a scrape wound. At once ridiculous, campy, and brutal, Cells at Work gives a very new (and downright cool) perspective on the inner workings of the human body.

I am also reading a manhwa by Kim Hyun Sook called <u>BANNED BOOK CLUB</u>. Banned Book Club is an autobiographical account of the author's experiences starting college in 1983, under the oppressive, totalitarian fist of South Korea's Fifth Republic. She soon finds herself as the youngest member of a banned book club, where she encounters the censorship and brutality of the regime first-hand. The book is massively entertaining and surprisingly informative. Not only did it educate me on the history of government reform in South Korea -- a topic I knew virtually nothing about -- but it also reminded me of the universal importance of reading and the rebellious power that uncensored access to information provides.
