'Tis the season for family, celebrations, and warmth!<u>A YEAR FULL OF</u> <u>CELEBRATIONS AND FESTIVALS</u> by Christopher Corr and Claire Grace is a treat for readers of all ages. This book takes us through one year on Earth and introduces us to festivals from every corner of the world.

For mystery enthusiasts, Anne Perry's new book, <u>A CHRISTMAS LEGACY</u> will put you in a winter mindset without losing the spirit of suspense and intrigue for which she's known.

For those seeking less mystery and more meditation, Ted Kooser's collection of poetry, <u>WINTER MORNING WALKS: ONE HUNDRED POSTCARDS TO JIM</u> <u>HARRISON</u>, compiles one hundred poems which Kooser wrote on his daily predawn walks and then pasted to postcards and sent to his friend, Jim Harrison. The poems, spanning November through March, offer diary-like accounts of the temperature, the weather, and the snowy natural beauty surrounding Kooser, as well as incisive and poignant musings on life, the passage of time, and our place in the world.

We also have seasonal comics and graphic novels for enthusiasts of all ages! <u>HAPPY NARWHALIDAYS</u> by Ben Clanton will have younger readers tickled as our hero, Narwhal, prepares for a visit from the mythical Merry Mermicorn while giving fascinating facts about sea life in wintry oceans. For young adults, the graphic novel <u>PERSEPHONE</u> by Loïc Locatelli-Kournwsky, provides a re-imagined version of the Greek myth of Persephone and Hades, wherein Persephone's consumption of six pomegranate seeds while in the underworld causes her to spend 6 months of each year there— a fate which causes her mother, Demeter (who also happens to control the seasons), to mourn for the entirety of those months. In her sadness, the world is plunged into winter. Only upon Persephone's return does spring begin.

For fans of horror, Stephen Chobsky's <u>IMAGINARY FRIEND</u> will have you questioning the motives of every deer you see on the side of the road. In this tale, young Christopher goes missing for six days. When he mysteriously returns, he discovers he has a voice in his head telling him to build a treehouse before Christmas or the world is doomed.

For those of you crafting and baking this December, we have a large selection of cook and craft books to inspire you. Do you prefer something like a Hallmark movie in convenient paperback form? We have a variety of holiday romance novels to chose from. Books by Fern Michaels, Debbie Carr, Nicholas Sparks and Debbie Macomber will provide all the holiday "feels." Don't know what you're looking for? Stop in and browse the stacks and let that perfect book find you.
