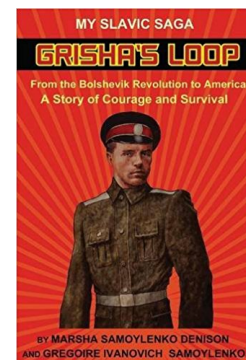
Grisha's Loop Explores Slavic Roots

The Kennebunk Free Library Genealogy Group will host author Marsha Denison on **Saturday, September 9** at 10 a.m. Denison will discuss her book *Grisha's Loop: My Slavic Saga*.

Intended for all, *Grisha's Loop* is a story of courage and survival. The book chronicles the life of Gregoire Ivanovich Samoylenko (endearingly called Grisha), and shares his journey as a little boy growing up into a young man through his participation in the Russian Revolution as a member of the Tsar's army. As he fulfills his duty to his country, he abandons his plans to continue his education at Petrograd University to pursue a peripatetic journey through Russia and around the Black Sea.

Marsha Denison was born in Boston and grew up in the nearby suburb of Newton. She has two daughters and three grandchildren, and since her retirement from health care in Connecticut, she and her husband retired to their beach home in Ocean Park, Maine. Although she has written other published articles, this is her first book: an attempt to record, share, and encourage others to cherish the written word and memories of years gone by.

The Genealogy Group is open to the public and meets nine times a year.

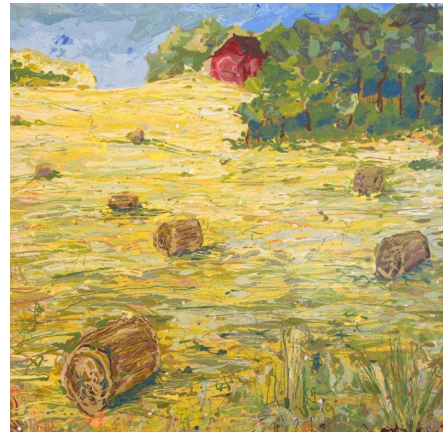

Marbled Maine

An exhibition entitled "**Marbled Maine**", the enamel oil on canvas works of Jonathan Byrer, will be on display in the Speers Gallery from September 1 to 29. The public is invited to view the exhibit during regular Library hours when the gallery is not in use for library programs.

Jon Byrer graduated from the Maine College of Art where he received a degree in photography and studied the fine arts. Jon creates enamel oil paintings, experimental photography, and watercolor illustrations for a children's book series. Jon has been creating art since a very young age and has been living and working in the mid-coast area for the past 15 years. He developed this new poured paint marbled landscape technique after an inspiring trip to Europe. After arriving back in Maine, he wanted to transform the iconic Maine landscape into something no one had ever seen before; a poured paint marbled landscape!



"My work is my view of the complex beauty in the Maine landscape. From bodies of water to country roads, I strive to capture the movement in each scene. My art is inspired by Maine's raw natural beauty. This landscape is constantly changing; intermingling light, color, and shadow in an evolution through time. My objective is to convey this sense to my viewer through my painting style and technique."

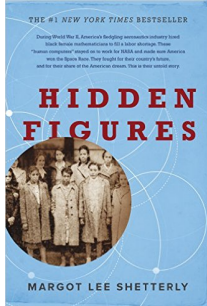

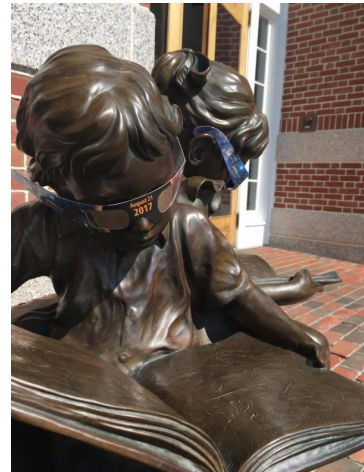
