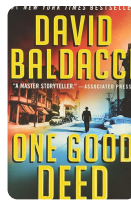


Historical Mystery

A WWII veteran is forced to investigate a small-town murder or risk returning to prison in this fast-paced thriller.



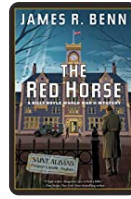

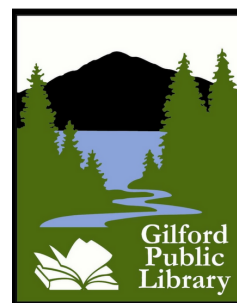

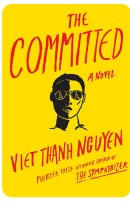


The Committed

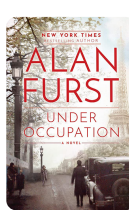


Under Occupation

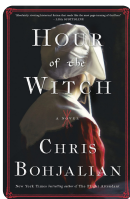


Hour of the Witch

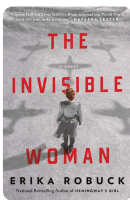


The Invisible Woman

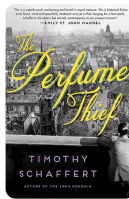


The Perfume Thief

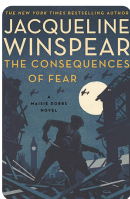

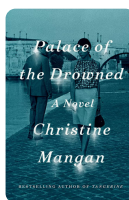


Palace of the Drowned
