A. ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

B. SITE DESCRIPTION

16. LANDSCAPE FEATURES: Built - ornate metal lamposts

Natural - the top of Arch Hill is mostly grassed, giving excellent view of villages below and surrounding countryside

C. SIGNIFICANCE

17. ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE: One of the very few monumental arches in New Hampshire.

18. SITE INTEGRITY: A regional landmark, highly visible to every traveler on I-93.

19. HISTORY: While visiting Rome, Charles E. Tilton was so impressed by the Arch of Titus, that he decided to erect a similar arch as a memorial to his family. Tilton once planned to be buried under the arch, but after Northfield successfully resisted an attempt to annex the town to Tilton, he decided to be buried in the Tilton village cemetery.
