THE 1941-42 basketball season proved very successful for the Passaic Valley team with the Green Hornets winning 17 games in 22 starts. They posted double wins over Eastern Academy, Ramsey, College High, Paterson Central, North Arlington and three wins against Pompton Lakes. The Hornets entered the State Tournament and defeated Pompton Lakes by a score of 28 to 10 in the first round, but they were defeated in the second round by Weehawken 54 to 42 . Only one team, Hawthorne, beat Valley twice during the season. Hawthorne won the first game by a score of 26 to 25 and the second game 25 to 21 .

The Green Hornets scored a total of 780 points in 22 games against only 523 for their opponents. This was an average of about 35 points per game as compared to an average of 23 points for the opponents. The Hornets reached their peak against Union when they scored 59 points.
