

















DEDICATION


The second act is what Zadoc Grimes imagined to be the ending. However, in the third act, Mrs. Carlton is rescued from murder by a trusty State Trooper.

With the promising look of the J.V.'s, who finished their season with a fine record of 16 wins and 3 losses, the outlook for the coming 1960 season is a bright one.






Basing his hopes on the many returning members of last year's co-conference championship team, Coach Griswold was able to look forward to another victorious season.
