

# Report presented to the Board of Trustees by Margaret Morrissey, Director presented June 25<sup>th</sup>, 2024

#### Building

- Opacum Land Trust team has planted six trees and provided care instructions 6/18. Three are along the perimeter at Wardwell Court, three at the east side of the building at two different areas They also replaced the water bag on one of the trees.
- Patron had concerns that a bump in the handicap drive entrance is very difficult and that they
  plan on calling the DPW. I have followed up with the patron and demonstrated to her the
  correct traffic pattern which does not impact the berm. She agreed that there is no barrier to
  entry.
- DiMauro Carpet installed the carpet 6/5 and the rubber treads on the main staircase completed 6/7.
- National Grid inspector checked on the 1966 insulation project and approved it 6/3.
- Sewer department conducted the regular evacuation of the manhole 6/5
- DPW installed the two plaques onto the granite plinths at the sculptures 6/10.
- DPW picked up the custom-built display case from Cornerstone Bank
- Norel called 6/13 to report a burglar alarm at 8:45 PM. Police dispatched. Called again at 8:58 to report a fire alarm, fire department was dispatched.
- The Finance team is planning on a comprehensive review of all capital projects and prioritizing and consolidating the projects that are already approved
- Issues continue with the elevator, periodically. Municipal Grant submitted to the MA Office of Disability requesting \$200,000.00 to 'modernize' the elevator 6/11.
