Library Director's Report

- Monthly Financial and Statistical Reports: Everything looks good. Salary line is where we should be. We are ahead on the book budget, we should be 25% by the end of the month. July and August print, circulation and digital were all up. The museum passes were well used. Overall a good summer.
- <u>FY24 State Aid Expenditures:</u> We will review next meeting.
- <u>Friends Update:</u> Their first meeting is next Monday. They will do a book sale in April of 2025.
- OCLN Update: The first members council meeting is next week. They will review the budget at that time.

- <u>Programming Update:</u> Summer went well. Fall Toddler Time registration is coming. Kids programs sign ups are going well. Amy has school class visits scheduled. Touch-a-Truck was last Saturday and there were over 200 people. There were 20 people for the Saturday story hour.
- ARIS Highlights: The report has been complete. We are in good shape. The financial report is due the first Friday in October.

Building Issues

- <u>Roof:</u> After a roof inspection the EPDM (the rubber part) has some issues. It
 is still being reviewed. There was a very small leak after a recent storm. We
 are waiting to hear back.
- HVAC: It is doing what is supposed to do.
- <u>Electrical Issues:</u> We have an electrician who is available for smaller jobs: emergency lights in the restrooms, etc.
- <u>Water:</u> There is a demand for a water bottle filling station. There is no grant available at this time. We will continue to work with the town.
- Other: The hot water heater is no longer working. Gouthro installed a new one today.

Current Library Issues

- <u>Civic Hub LSTA Grant Update:</u> The grant ends on September 30th. We are in good shape. We can spend the rest of the grant money on books. The final report is due October 21st.
- <u>Summer Reading Program Update:</u> The Summer Reading Program ended. Summer reading read a total of 2,654.13 hours of reading time. Kids/teens read 1,334.68 hours. The programs went well. A great success!
- <u>Town Wage and Classification Study:</u> No updates.
- <u>Patron Chromebooks and Hotspots</u>: The policy change is working. The hotspot has been returned. Two new Chromebooks have been ordered.

Old Business

- Fall Story Walk: The Story Walk is due to go up soon. It is ready to go.
- TAB Overnight Follow Up: There were 15 participants. They had a wonderful time.

New Business

- <u>Holiday Schedule:</u> October 31st we will close at 5pm. Monday December 23rd close at 5pm. Closed 12/24, 12/25.

- Afterschool Student Behavior Expectations: We have created YA Room Guidelines for students using the Teen Room.
- <u>Code of Conduct Revision:</u> We reviewed revision of the Code of Conduct policy.
 - Motion was made by Mary and seconded by Sue to approve the Code of Conduct. It was approved unanimously.
- <u>Abington Reads 2025:</u> We are in negotiations with Amanda Peters, author
 of "The Berry Pickers", to be the next Abington Reads book. We are looking
 to do a program in late March, early April.
- <u>Website:</u> We may need to update the website with federal updates. We may need to find a new vendor.
