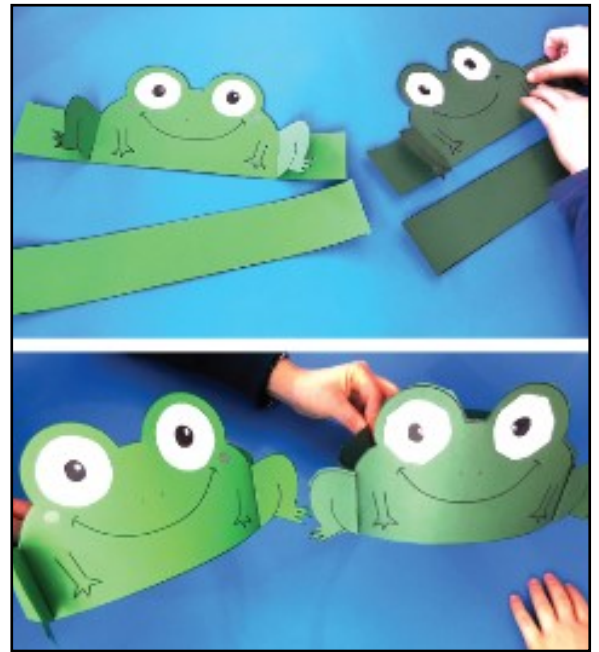


Art Exploration

FROG PAPER CROWN



Cut out a green frog to wear as a crown, with pop-out legs!

Materials Provided:

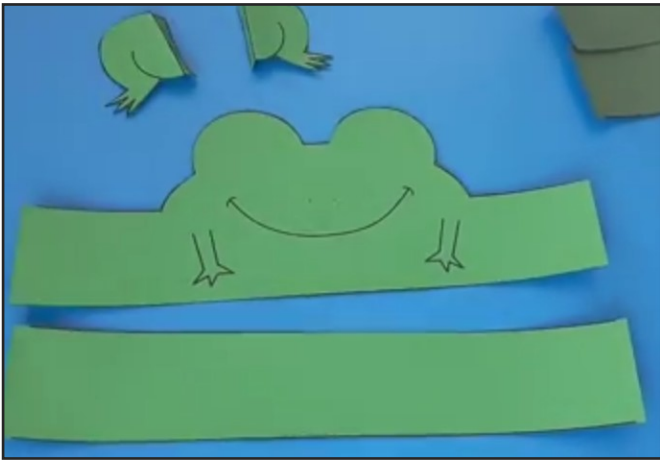
Frog Template
Eye Templates

Materials Needed:

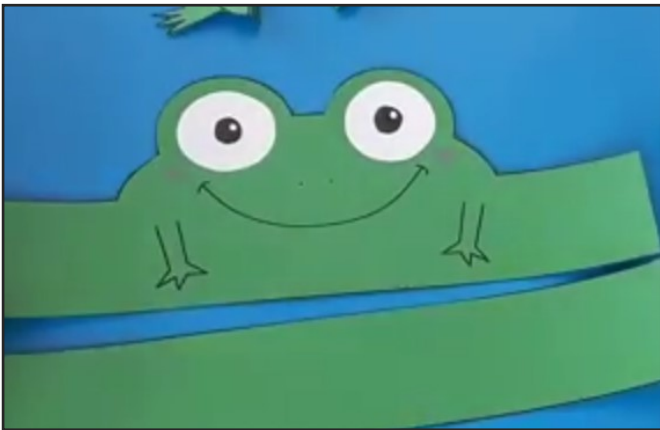
Glue stick
Stapler or tape
Markers, Crayons

Instructions:

1. Ask a grown-up to help you cut out all the pieces of your frog template. You should have four pieces in total: a head piece, a long strip that will wrap around your own head, and two legs.
 - There is an extra rectangle on the end of each leg -- keep this attached to your leg pieces. Once the shape is cut out, fold along the inside border of the rectangle on each leg.



2. Color and/or decorate the frog's head, attaching the two white circles included in your kit as eyeballs. Color in the eyes, and add any other features you'd like.



3. Attach your leg pieces by gluing down the folded rectangle only, so that each leg "pops" out from the crown. They will be glued down at each end of the frog's face.
4. Staple or tape the long green strip of paper to one end of your head piece. Wrap it around your child's head, then staple or tape the other side together once you have the sizing right.



5. Wear your frog crown and get hopping! See if you can spot any live frogs outside this month.
