Ever wondered about the details of the Blitz that killed 45,000 Britons in the early days of WWII? Learn about Winston Churchill, his family at the time (he still had a teenaged daughter at home), and his personal idiosyncrasies – right down to the need to have two baths a day. I have read several books on WWII but this one really digs deep into Churchill, including just about everyone in his inner circle (family and professional). I found it fascinating. Larson also provides great background on Germany and the major personalities within that country.

From the German pilots to the Londoners and people in the countryside, relive the thought processes and the personal experiences of not only the powerful people, but the everyday folks experiencing the Blitz. Larson's ability to toggle from one scene to the next and paint the whole picture is amazing. This was a book that I expect to re-explore in years to come as a great reference.

Coach Russell enabled the players to recognize their individual and collective talents and to see themselves as winners. Russell's strategies continue to shape coaching.
