Beginning Wednesday, September 2, 2020, and on the 1st Wednesday of each month following, Casella Waste will collect your bulky items curbside. Please note this is for Town of Belmont Residential Customers ONLY; service is not available to commercial property owners. Piles of debris, trash, yard waste or a single item too large for one person to collect WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. A request for pickup must be made in advance by calling Town Hall at 267-8300, Extension 118 or 124 only. You will be asked to list the items you want picked up, you will be advised what the cost is, and you will need to drop off a check made payable to the Town of Belmont prior to the collection day. Town Clerk's Corner


2021 is flying by, can you believe summer is almost over?! We have seen some very positive moments here at Town Hall. There were two different residents in one week that helped to pay the difference for another resident's transactions when they did not have enough to cover it. These random acts of kindness shows how great our community truly is. The Belmont way is a great way!

Planning a New Hampshire wedding this year? You will need a marriage license for your big day! As long as you will be getting married in NH you will be able to go to any town or city hall within 90 days of your big day to obtain the license. If either party has previously been married, we will need a certified copy of how the previous marriage ended i.e. divorce, death, or civil dissolution. Both parties will need to be present when obtaining the license with a governmental ID. The cost of the license is \$50 and we offer a prepayment of a certified marriage license which will add \$15 for one copy. If you are interested in printing out the worksheet ahead of time to make your trip into the office quicker, it is located on the Town Clerk/Tax Collector page, there are two pages to complete.

Attention lease vehicle owners! Have you recently bought out your lease? You will need to come by Town Hall to transfer your plates. We will need the paperwork from the dealer as well as the original current registration to the plates that you will be transferring out of the lease company name into your name. Effective January 2020 lease vehicles are now being registered in the lessee's birth month and no longer in the lease company's month. All leased vehicles going forward will be registered this way when it comes to new leases and transfers.

With the hot summer coming to a sad close, just a reminder that if you want to go to the beach you will need a beach pass. Residents of Belmont and tax payers are able to come by Town Hall to get the window decal. Please have your registration with you when you come in to get the pass, as we put the plate number on the decal.



Highway Department News

Paving Update

The Town of Belmont's summer paving program is underway. Prior to any resurfacing, the town conducts roadside ditching operations to correct any drainage deficiencies. Culvert pipes that show signs of deterioration are changed and underdrain is installed in areas that show signs of high-water saturation at subgrade levels. All of this is achieved prior to the town's contractor proceeding with shim and overlay hot top applications.

To date, Sargent Lake Road, Forest Drive, and Seavey Road have received this treatment. Silkwood Avenue and



Sunshine Drive have received a maintenance shim. Upper Parish Settlement Drive and Bennington Drive are on deck waiting for a slot to become available in the contractor's schedule and you will see the crew out on unfinished areas of Jamestown Road starting the prep process soon.

Please do your part to help keep our pavement looking good. Loading and unloading equipment in the towns Right of Way is unsafe and discouraged by the town. If you must unload any equipment in the road, please use some form of advanced warning and flaggers to keep yourself and other motorists using the roads safe. Be mindful of what trailer ramps and equipment tracks do to pavement, especially in the summer heat. A couple sheets of plywood placed under ramps and tracks of equipment, although expensive can help save the pavement and all of us headaches in the future.

Roadside Mowing

Now that we've received some much-needed precipitation roadside vegetation has taken off. DPW crews will be out conducting roadside mowing and trimming intersections for sight distance. Watch for MOWING AHEAD signs and cones placed to give advanced warning and do your best to give them space.



from the

Building Inspector



The Building Department would like to caution homeowners before starting any projects around the home.

It is important to know that building/construction contractors are NOT required to be licensed by the State of New Hampshire.

We highly recommend that you do your due diligence before hiring a contractor for your next project.

- Obtain quotes from at least 3 contractors.
- Ask if they are fully insured to cover any and all work-related accidents.
- Compare the quotes. If they are consistently priced, that is good.
 If one is significantly lower, there could be a reason to do some
 additional research. If one is very high, it could mean they are very busy and not interested in taking on any additional work.
- Be sure to have a signed contract with the terms clearly spelled out.
- Be cautious about giving too much money for an advance deposit.
- Ask to see portfolios of their work and references from past clients who you can call.
- Consider checking their ratings online, and/or with the Better Business Bureau.
- Ask for their schedule, and when they would be able to start your project.
- Ask about the length of time the project will take from start to completion.
- Be certain your contractor obtains the necessary permits for any work being completed. Ultimately
 you, the property owner, are responsible for all permits.
- Ensure that your contractor schedules all inspections required by the Town Building Inspector.



BEWARE

As an inspector I have seen and heard of many different problems with building contractors. Be careful, ask questions and do your research!




