Our message to all Dog Owners is to remind you of the importance of picking up your dog's waste from property not your own. The town installed at three different locations, dog waste stations where you can obtain a plastic bag to pick up the waste and deposit it in the numerous garbage cans located in the Village.

Bulky Waste Disposal



Wednesday of each month following, Casella Waste will collect your bulky items curbside. Please note this is for Town of Belmont Residential Customers ONLY; service is not available to commercial property owners. Piles of debris, trash, yard waste or a single item too large for one person to collect WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. A request for pickup must be made in advance by calling Town Hall at 267-8300, Extension 118 or 124 only. You will be asked to list the items you want picked up, you will be advised what the cost is, and you will need to drop off a check made payable to the Town of Belmont prior to the collection day. Town Clerk's Corner

June means summer is coming! That also means tax bills are about to be due. On July 1st the first tax bill due date will be here. If your payment is submitted by mail, it needs to be post marked for that due date to avoid interest. As a reminder we are open to the public, so you can make your payment in person! The EB2Gov section on the town's website has become a very popular way to pay bills, renew vehicle registrations, and license dogs. If you plan to use a card for any transaction there will be a 2.79% convenience fee added to the to-tal. That convenience fee will be charged whether you pay online or in the office.

If you recently received a certified notice from our office for the impending lien, the date the lien will be executed is June 14th at noon. At this point we will need guaranteed funds for payments; cash, cashier's check, or money order. If the past due bills from 2020 are not paid in full they will be executed in the lien that day. If you have any questions, please give us a call at 267-8300 ext. 2 or come by to our office.

Quarter two water and sewer bills are going out this month. This bill will cover the months of March, April, and May. They will be due thirty days after the bill date, which will be in July. Just like with property taxes you may send your payment by mail, drop it off in person, or pay online.

Missed the deadline to license your dog? At this point there will be additional late fees. For every month the dog's license is renewed late there will be an extra dollar per month affective this month. Also there will be a \$25 civil forfeiture fee in addition to the license fees and the late fees. It is important to license your dog before the expiration date of April 30th. Once May comes around your dog is no longer licensed. If your dog had a new rabies shot since last year, please bring the updated form in with you. It is not a guarantee the vet's office will send it to us.

MAILBOX REQUIREMENTS USPS & TOWN OF BELMONT

HELPFUL GUIDELINES TO FOLLOW WHEN INSTALLING YOUR MAILBOX

- USPS approved metal mailbox required
- Front of mailbox must be 2' from edge of pavement
- Position your mailbox at a min height of 46" from the road surface to the bottom of the mailbox support
- House or Apt. # visible on the front and sides of mailbox
- Minimum 4" x 4" wooden support post
- Supporting post shall be installed 2' below grade and a min 4' from the edge of the pavement

Dear Belmont Community Friends,

In 2019 Belmont celebrated its 150th year anniversary. The Heritage Commission began video interviews to document its history through stories of its townspeople. The first set of interviews of former Fire Chief Akerstrom, Everett Weeks, the LeRoux Sisters and Alyce Jewell of Main Street were highlighted in an article in both the *Laconia Daily Sun* and the *Winnisquam Echo*. The more people we interviewed the more names that were given to us to speak to next! In 2020 we continued our quest and we were stopped dead in our tracks due to Covid-19. The Heritage Commission decided to go to ""Plan B" and send out questionnaires to help gather information. We are now posting the questionnaire here in our May newsletter. The finished video and information gathered through the questionnaires is also hoping to get back into the schools to share Belmont's history using the information gathered as well.

Please take the time to help our cause by sending in your completed questionnaire by the end of May. Researching and documenting Belmont's historical facts based on accurate stories from families who lived in Belmont many years ago can only be done with your help.
