#### **Town Administrator's Monthly Report**



#### COVID-19 Update

#### **2021 Road Construction**

Construction continues on Plummer Hill, please be aware of equipment and crews in the road and use caution. Lane closures may be necessary so we do recommend that you avoid Plummer Hill for routine travel.

#### 2021 Tax Rate

We anticipate our 2021 Tax Rate to be set in early November with bills due 30-days from the date of mailing. Based on current revenue estimates we anticipate the Town's portion of the tax rate to increase by about .20 cents, which is slightly below our anticipated target of .30 which we had estimated and provided to you in 2020 relative to the cost of the bond for the new Police Station

Town Hall will be closed on Thursday, November 11, 2021 in observance of Veteran's Day. We will also be closed on Thursday, November 25 and Friday, November 26 in observance of the Thanksgiving Holiday.

#### What's Flushable or Not

We continue to stress the importance of the "Not everything is flushable", please check out the "Do Not Flush!" list to protect your sewer and septic system. A "Flushable" label does not mean it is SAFE for your septic system or the Town's sewer. #### IT IS THE LAW! (RSA 466:31 II (c)

Our message to all Dog Owners is to remind you of the importance of picking up your dog's waste from property not your own. The town installed at three different locations, dog waste stations where you can obtain a plastic bag to pick up the waste and deposit it in the numerous garbage cans located in the Village.

#### Casella Facility – Route 140

We have received numerous calls regarding the facility located on Route 140 turning away residents who wish to dispose of construction and demolition debris; we have reached out to the facility and have been advised that this type of debris **if originating in the Town of Belmont**, may still be brought to the facility and dropped off for a fee. Capacity for the final disposal of this type of waste and trash is becoming a serious concern across the country; permitting of new landfills has become harder and there are a limited number of facilities that still continue to incinerate trash. We will continue open discussion with Casella regarding these issues and keep you informed should there be any additional changes. Please keep in mind if you are a Belmont contractor and you are working in another community, you cannot presently dispose of the debris at the Belmont facility

**Bulky Waste Disposal** 



Beginning Wednesday, September 2, 2020, and on the 1st Wednesday of each month following, Casella Waste will collect your bulky items curbside. Please note this is for Town of Belmont Residential Customers ONLY; service is not available to commercial property owners. Piles of debris, trash, yard waste or a single item too large for one person to collect WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. A request for pickup must be made in advance by calling Town Hall at 267-8300, Extension 118 or 124 only. You will be asked to list the items you want picked up, you will be advised what the cost is, and you will need to drop off a check made payable to the Town of Belmont prior to the collection day. #### **Highway Department News**

#### Fall Clean up

As the last of the leaves hit the ground fall cleanups are underway throughout town. The Public Works Department is headed out to remove leaves and other debris from troubled areas regularly with the intent to keep drainage flowing properly. Your help is still needed. Please continue to remove all yard debris as clean ups are completed. Leaving them roadside or near drainage systems can cause flooding and negatively im-

pact the Town roadway system.



#### Winter Prep.

The arrival of November usually brings cold, blustery conditions and serves as a reminder of what's about to come. The Public Works Department spent the last week of October mounting plow frames, exercising spreaders, and inspecting plow gear. The mower gets removed from the Trackless and sidewalk plows and snowblowers are set and ready to clear and treat town sidewalks. The installation of On Spots (automatic tire chains) and swap to studded snow tires complete the equipment makeover. All of this is to insure that they are ready for whatever Mother Nature decides to throw at them for winter weather during the next few months.

Along with vehicle prep, crews will be out marking obstacles and potential hazards. Reflective delineation and whips are strategically placed so once covered with a blanket of snow, items found in the right of way such as stone work, trees, or fences can be noticed hopefully avoiding damage to both property and equipment. Drainage is marked in a similar manner and if necessary, yellow arrows are painted in the roadway to mark catch basins and water bars that could be hard to find in the same conditions.





#### As a PSA reminder, please make sure you remember the following guidelines:


- Storage Containers are popping up like weeds and seem to be everywhere. Storage containers are not allowed in Residential/Rural Zones without being tied to a current building permit. Please see Table 5-2 in Zoning Ordinances if you would like to see additional information on storage containers/trailers and where they can used. If you made the simple mistake of not permitting your storage container, please reach out to Elaine Murphy in Land Use, and she will gladly help you with creating the needed permit, otherwise your friendly Code Enforcement Agent will probably pay you a visit.
- Do you have an older car/truck/boat that is no longer running but has taken up residency in your yard? If it is 2000 model year or newer and you have a title, any of our local scrapping yards will be willing to remove them from your property. If it is older than 2000 model year no title is needed, and it is a simple call to arrange removal. If you need assistance in finding a local salvage yard, applying for a replacement title, or arranging removal of cars/boats/RV's, please contact me and I will assist you with this.
- Belmont Business Owners. If I have reached out to you regarding our Aquafer Inspections, please get back in
  touch with me as soon as possible so we can schedule an inspection. If you are a business and are unsure if you
  should be part of the State's Aquafer Protection Program, give me a call. Based on what type of business you conduct I can guide you through it easily.




## **Building Inspector**

The Building Department would like to take this time to remind you of some important items to address and consider around your home this time of year.

- Change the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors
- Check/reset your time on any electronic heat systems to accommodate for the end of Daylight Savings Time (Sunday, 11/07/2021)
- Have your furnace cleaned/serviced by a professional and change out filters
- Keep exterior vent systems clear of snow
- Attic access should be well insulated
- Check plugs and wires for damage on holiday lights before stringing inside or out
- Take care using any portable heaters and follow all precautions and instructions
- If you need to use a generator, be sure to keep it well away from windows and doors


