The Belmont Conservation Commission contracted the Student Conservation Association (SCA) to eradicate the non-native, invasive Glossy Buckthorn plant from on the Tioga River Wildlife & Conservation Area. The SCA's

Six-Person Team will return this month to work a 10-day hitch, helping control the Buckthorn. This Conservation Parcel has the highest rated Wildlife Habitat in Belmont.

If you would like to make a difference by helping to protect the ecological integrity of this property, please join us to eradicate this invasive plant.
