TAX BILLS

We anticipate tax bills will be mailed in mid-May and will be due the first week of July. As a reminder, the spring bills are a prepayment typically based on the prior year's tax rate and assessed value. New construction values have been added this spring. If you have any questions about your assessment, please stop by Town Hall to get a copy of your property tax card.

Bulky Waste Disposal

Please note that Casella will continue this program even after automated collection is in place. On the 1st Wednesday of each month, Casella Waste will collect your bulky items curbside. Please note this is for Town of Belmont Residential Customers ONLY; service is not available to commercial property owners. Piles of debris, trash, yard waste or a single item too large for one person to collect WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

A request for pickup must be made in advance by calling Town Hall at 267-8300, Extension 118 or 124 only. You will be asked to list the items you want picked up, you will be



advised what the cost is, and you will need to drop off a check made payable to the Town of Belmont prior to the collection day. Please visit the Town's website at www.belmontnh.gov for the full details on the program and a price list.

Town Clerk's Corner



The warmer weather is upon us! We hope everyone gets out and enjoys the beautiful scenery and lakes that New Hampshire has to offer. The Town Clerk's office can process boat registrations. For renewals, bring in your prior year's registration or the renewal notice from the State. For new boats, bring in your detailed bill of sale and we will get your boat registered and out on the water as soon as possible.

Beach passes are now available! Please bring in your current registration so that we can put your plate number on your beach pass.



It is hard to believe that that our first issue property tax bills will be hitting mailboxes later this month. The first issue tax bill covers the period from April 1st – September 30th. The first issue tax bill is called the estimated tax bill due to the fact that the tax rate is not set by the New Hampshire Department of Revenue until October. The bill will be due in July. You can make a payment several ways. You can go to our website for the Town at www.belmontnh.gov, we have a drop box in the front door of the Town Hall, you can come into Town Hall to complete your payment or you can choose to mail in your payment. Please send any payments to PO Box 310, Belmont, NH 03220. We ask that you please include your payment stub, an account number or some information on your payment so that we know where to apply the money on your account.



Last call on dog licenses! Dogs are to be licensed by April 30th; we do offer the month of May as a grace period to complete the licenses before the \$25 civil forfeiture will be added to the license fees. You may provide us with your email address to add it to your profile to receive the e-reminder. We have sent out two sets of email reminders to our residents to get those pups taken care of on time. Effective June 1st there will be an extra \$1 late fee per month in addition to the fees.



Town Clerk's Corner



In addition to tax bills going out; water, sewer, and/or taxes that were due in 2022 that are not paid in full will be part of the 2023 liens. Certified notices will go out this month to property owners who are in the position to have a lien recorded at the Registry of Deeds. The lien will be executed 30 days from the certified notice date. Just like property taxes you can make your payments the same ways. We also suggest that you call to get an updated interest amount so your payment will be in full.

Be prepared when visiting our office. Please have your driver's license, car registration or new vehicle paperwork from the dealership. This helps cut down on your visit time with us and helps the process move along a little smoother.


Chief Newhall Retires!

Dirt Road Maintenance

Every year the spring thaw leads to muddy dirt roads for an uncertain amount of time. The 2023 thaw was one of the most relatively painless "Mud Seasons" in recent history. Mild temperatures coupled with minimal amounts of frost made it easy to keep up with what are normally the worst areas. We are actively out grading and raking roads to remove potholes and washboard areas and restore the crown winter maintenance removes. Grading roads to reestablish a center crown allowing water to run off into the ditches will ensure a safe, smooth ride that will last for some time. This spring, your Public Works Department has a couple new team members who showed interest in spending a little time behind the "Antler Rack" (the graders controls). Our Operator, Chris, was happy to share his knowledge and experience, so the Depart-



ment decided it could invest some extra time and give the new recruits a chance to learn and grow. It takes a little longer to get around to every road, but Belmont will have another team member or two who can help out if Chris is unavailable to get things back into shape.








Parks & Recreation—Old Home Day Committee



Heritage Commission

Hello From the Heritage Commission!

The Heritage Commission is proud to congratulate the Dudley Gilman Homestead as it has been bestowed the honor of being added to the National Register of Historic Places. The two and a half story clapboard home was built around 1785. Along with its 1800's barn it is one of the oldest documented homes in Belmont. Not only does the farmhouse hold its heritage through its age, but the history behind the builder is quite significant as well. The house was built by Corporal Dudley Gilman, a Revolutionary War veteran whose regiment served under General John Stark at the Battle of Bennington. The Dudley Gilman Homestead marks the sixth Belmont building added to the register. It is the first homestead to receive this honor in the Town of Belmont. It joins the Belmont Mill, the Belmont Bandstand, the Gale School, the Province Road Meeting House and the Belmont Public Library to be listed on the prestigious National Register of Historic Places in New Hampshire.



On Valentine's Day the Heritage Commission members organized a Food Drive for Belmont Senior Citizens, the Baptist Church Food Pantry and the Got Lunch Program in Gilford. Belmont Elementary School students and their Student Council, along with the Belmont-Gilford Hockey team assisted with the collection. The students also contributed handmade Valentine's Day cards. It was a huge success and a sweet surprise for the elderly as well. Recently, we received a bundle of heartwarming notes from some of the Senior Citizens. Connecting the young and the young -at- heart certainly shows the importance of being part of our Belmont Community. Building/Code Enforcement

Building Department News

from the Building Official

The Building Department would like to caution homeowners before starting any projects around the home.

It is important to know that building/construction contractors are NOT required to be licensed by the State of New Hampshire.

We recommend that you all do your due diligence before hiring a contractor for your next project.

- Obtain quotes from at least 3 contractors.
- Ask if they are fully insured to cover any and all work-related accidents.
- Compare the quotes. If they are consistently priced, that is good. If one is significantly lower, there could be a reason to do some additional research. If one is very high, it could mean that they are very busy and not interested in taking on any additional work.
- Be sure to have a signed contract with payment terms clearly spelled out.
- Be cautious about giving too much of a deposit in advance. Paying in 1/3's is a great way to do it.
- Be careful of contractors insisting on one form of payment, such as wire transfer.
- Ask to see portfolios of their work and references from past clients who you can call.
- Ask about the length of time the project will take from start to completion.



Moderate-Income Program

The Home Performance with ENERGY STAR - Moderate-Income (HPwES-MI) program is open to qualifying customers of Eversource, Liberty Utilities, Until, and NH Electric Cooperative. The HPwES-MI looks to support those NH residents that are over income for Home Energy Assistance (income eligible weatherization program) yet may struggle to cover the customer co-pays in our market rate Home Performance program. HPwES-MI offers higher incentives on weatherization measures and 0% finance options to help cover the customer co-pay.
