
BUSY BOOK CLUB

September 22-28 was Banned Book Week. The American Library Association's Office for Intellectual Freedom reported an increase in the number of book challenges of 65% from the year before. While we take the threat of book challenges very seriously, this year we added a bit of levity to our annual banned book week display. Celebrate not only your freedom to read but also your freedom to ROCK.

"Banned Books Week was launched in 1982 in response to a sudden surge in the number of challenges to books in libraries, bookstores, and schools. By focusing on efforts to remove or restrict access to books, Banned Books Week draws national attention to the harms of censorship. Typically (but not always) held during the last week of September, the annual event highlights the value of free and open access to information and brings together the entire book community — librarians, educators, authors, publishers, booksellers, and readers of all types — in shared support of the freedom to seek and to express ideas." -ALA Office of Intellectual Freedom.



BEER & BOOK PAIRINGS



Frankfort Beer Week 2024: Book & Beer Pairings

As part of the Frankfort Beer Week Celebrations, our Librarians sampled local (and some not so local) brews to create this beer and book pairing list for your enjoyment.

Beer: Northern Hawk Owl by Right Brain Brewer Style: American Amber. Description: Bitter, smooth and palatable. Would go well with Mo Rocca's Mobituaries.

Beer: Bell's Two Hearted Ale

Style: American IPA

Description: So named from the fishing waters in the UP, we'd be remiss if we didn't suggest Hemingway's Nick Adams stories, also inspired by these waters. Hemingway's writing has been described as "easy to imitate, difficult to match." We would say the same of this brew.

Beer: Old Style by G. Heilemann Brewing (now Pabst) Style: American Adjunct Lager Description: Reliable and always there. If it's cold enough, it's good enough. Try a John Grisham or James Patterson book. Like an Old Style, their books are fully kraeusened.

Beer: B., Sirius Dubbel by Stormcloud Brewing Co. Style: Belgian Dubbel Description: This is a stone fruit based beer that does have raisins. I would recommend a Stephanie Plum or Agatha Raisin mystery. Any mystery really, because it is a mystery to us why anyone would want fruit in their beer, but hey, to each their own. Librarians don't judge.

Beer: Buenaveza Salt & Lime Lager by Stone Brewing Style: American Lager Description: The wheaty finish of this brew gives off the faint taste of cereal- in a good way. Would pair nicely with Breakfast of Champions by Kurt Vonnegut

Beer: Negra Modelo Style: Munich Dunkel Description: What is that familiar flavor we can't identify? It's like candy wrapped in the fear of our inevitable mortality. Or is it anise? Try this with Silvia Moreno-Garcia's gothic thriller, "Mexican Gothic."

Beer: Sunrunner by Stormcloud Brewing Company Style: Kveik Ale Description: This local favorite is citrusy and brings beach vibes and good times. Transport yourself to the beach by pairing this with the comedic stylings of Carl Hiaasen or Dave Barry.

Beer: One String Puppet Style: Hazy IPA Description: Skunky, funky and just right. The perfect companion for "Nothin' but a Good Time: the uncensored history of the '80s hard rock explosion" by Tom Beaujour and Richard Bienstock.

Beer: Perrin Brewing Company Black Ale Style: Black IPA Description: Looks dark but has a deceptively light, nuanced flavor. Much like Jeannette McCurdy's I'm Glad my Mom Died.

Beer: Founders KBS Stout

Style: Bourbon Barrel-Aged Chocolate Coffee Stout

Description: There is so much going on in this beer- like a community of flavors. We recommend you sit a spell and savor this one over a Richard Scary Busytown book. It's 12% ABV may make finding Goldbug a little difficult.
