
Upcoming Program Tale of Two Poets: Poetry Programs this Month



April's book is *Carrying Albert Home* by Homer Hickham. Same book, two discussion times.Copies are available at the Circulation Desk.





Library Trivia


* There are 123,627 libraries in the U.S.; there are only 13,515 McDonald's.
