The Big Read

Our library is participating in a state-wide read of *The Bear* by NH author Andrew Krivak. The Big Read is a program of the National Endowment for the Arts in partnership with Arts Midwest, and is being coordinated by NH Humanities.

A cautionary tale of human fragility, of love and loss, *The Bear* is a stunning tribute to the beauty of nature's dominion and explores powerful themes about the importance of intergenerational storytelling, our complicated relationship with the environment, and how to prepare for an unknown future. Krivak lives in Jaffrey, New Hampshire, in the shadow of Mount Monadnock, which inspired much of the landscape in The Bear.
