**Community Conversation: Youth Mental Health -**

How do we Help our Kids?



Thursday, August 22nd 6pm Community Room After more than a decade of stability or improvement, the mental health of adolescents plunged in the early 2010s. Rates of depression, anxiety, self-harm, and suicide rose sharply, more than doubling on many measures. Why?

Join this important conversation, facilitated by Ben Woo, a Licensed Clinical Mental Health Counselor at Crossroads Counseling in Franconia, and Laura Clerkin, Bethlehem Library Director. Both have recently read *The Anxious Generation: How the Great Rewiring of Childhood Is Causing an Epidemic of Mental Illness* by Jonathan Haidt. They will summarize the key points of the book as a jumping off point to the discussion.

Adults and youth are encouraged to speak about what they are seeing, how they are feeling, and to share ideas for solutions for our community.
