Members authorized Adrian Williams to install screws near the molding in the children's room and around the walls behind the stacks faxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx from which wires may be hung for exhibit of art work, an exhibit started last year during Michigan Week by local artists. In the four-day reader survey 78 children were checked, 59 girls and 19 boys; 107 high school students, 65 girls and 42 boys; 61 adults, 49 women and 12 men.
