

Jan. 6, 1964

Regular meeting of the Library Board called to order at 7 p.m. by president Sarah Eudora Crist. All members present. Library reports were read by Janice Zink and Evelyn Granzow. It was reported that the Village Council and Consumers Power planned to install new lights at each driveway to the library, and members felt this would light the premises sufficiently so no additional lights will be needed. One of the thermo-pane windows at the front of the library was found to have a large crack, caused perhaps from a sonic boom. This is to be replaced in the spring, after checking on insurance coverage for this and other coverage of the building and contents with council. A gift of \$13.25 was received from a now abandoned Ward school. Members voted to purchase a new edition of "Birds of America" with part of the money and asked librarian Carol Goff to order additional children's books when suitable ones become available. The board accepted the offer of Dr. Charles Huttula to purchase and give to the library books on the Canadian wilderness written by a friend of his. The treasurer reported a balance of \$7,989.32 on Dec. 1, receipts of \$341.10, including interest on bonds of \$337.50, expenses of \$661.77, leaving balance Jan. 1 of \$7668.65. Regular meeting of the Library Board was called to order at 7 pm. by president Sarah Eudora Crist with all members except Evelyn Granzow present. The treasurer reported a balance on hand Jan. 31 of \$6,788.65, receipts of 50¢, expenses, \$967.13, leaving a balance Feb. 29 of \$5,822.02. Library reports were read by Helen Goble and Janice Zink. It was reported by the librarian that at the present time 50% of the books ~~in the library are~~ non-fiction. Two hundred thirty-seven survey cards from State Library used recently showed 33 1/3 % of the readers at Schultz-Holmes were children under high school age; 42% high school age and 25% adults. Our library is third in circulation. Members discussed putting up molding around the walls in the children's room and behind the stacks for yearly art exhibits. Adrian Williams is to give an estimate on the cost. Mrs. Crist will invite members of the new library committee of the village council to meet with the board in April.

April 6, 1964

The April meeting of the Library Board was called to order at 7 p.m. by president Sara Eudora Crist with all members present. The treasurer reported expenses of \$2,205.09, which included \$1456.74 for the new aluminum awnings installed by order of the Village Council at the front and side entrances to the library, receipts of \$16.77, leaving a balance March 31 of \$3,633.70. The cost of the canopies, along with that for repair of cracked windows at the front of the library, will be paid for by selling bonds left in trust for maintenance, repair and upkeep of the building. It was suggested to the council that sale of the bonds be delayed until after July 1, so interest could be collected. Officers elected were: Janice Zink, president; Jane Kilchenman, vice president; Alys Saxton, secretary; Helen Goble, treasurer; Sara Eudora Crist, corresponding secretary; Evelyn Granzow, secretary of auditorium rental. It was decided that Mrs. Crist, Mrs. Goble and Mrs. Saxton would attend the council meeting Monday evening, April 13, when the budget is to be reviewed, and present the anticipated budget for the library. Mrs. Crist was to contact DPW supt. Al Curnow and ask to have the holes in the driveway at the rear of the library given their annual spring fill. Members authorized Adrian Williams to install screws near the molding in the children's room and around the walls behind the stacks ~~xxxxxxxxxxxx~~ from which wires may be hung for exhibit of art work, an exhibit started last year during Michigan Week by local artists. In the four-day reader survey 78 children were checked, 59 girls and 19 boys; 107 high school students, 65 girls and 42 boys; 61 adults, 49 women and 12 men. It was suggested

the librarian have a table of books by Michigan authors during Michigan week. The library committee of the council, unable to attend this meeting, said they were happy to come to the May meeting. Lights at the side and rear of the library are to be turned off earlier and turned on later during the summer months.

Regular meeting of the Library Board was called to order at 7 p.m. by Janice Zink, president, with two members, Helen Goble and Evelyn Granzow, absent. The treasurer's report, read by Sarah Crispan, showed a balance July 1 of \$1421.80, expenses during the month of \$843.53 and receipts of \$2633.89, which included \$2614.15 from tax money from the village, leaving a balance July 31 of \$3,212.13.
