Mrs. Zink has served as a member for 15 years, from 1952 to 1967, and Mrs. Crist 12 years, 1955 to 1967. They are to select one book each to be placed in the library in recognition of their years of service.

April 3, 1967

Regular meeting of the library board was called to order at 7 p.m. with all members present except Kathryn Benner, she and Patricia Riley are the two new members replacing Janice Zink and Sara Fudora Crist. The rules were suspended and the unanimous vote of the members was cast for the following slate of officers: Helen Goble, re-elected president; Alys Saxton, vice president; Evelyn Burns, recording secretary; Kathryn Benner, corresponding secretary; Jame Kilchenman, treasurer, Patricia Riley, library auditorium rental. Reports were read by Pat Riley and Evelyn Burns. A thank you note was read from Sara for the coffee hour given she and Jan after the last meeting. The village treasurer will check on library insurance, including contents, and let us know the amount. The janitor has repaired broken tile in the entry. Members voted to have the piano tuned each fall, instead of xxx in the spring. It was decided to re-subscribe for those magazines we do not get from the government, and add one on business and one science at a total cost of a little over \$50. Mrs. Benner is to write to the general contractors who built the library asking who installed the thermopane windows, and what cost there will be for replacing one which has cracked. After general discussion the following salary increases were voted upon and approved: Librarian Carol Goff raised from \$2750 to \$3000 a year; the janitor from \$1.25 to \$1.50 per hour; assistant librarian, Alice Gurica, from \$1.25 to \$1.40 an hour and the high school girls from 75¢ to \$1.00 an hour, effective April 1. Alys Saxton is to see Jan Zink, get the easel and order flowers for the Schultz-Holmes graves for Memorial Day. Miss Goff will go to the Monroe county library for a week of library training to renew her certificate the week of May 22. Alice Gurica will work for her with Addie Diedrich assisting. Alice is to come in at 2 p.m. during the school year to relieve the congestion during the early afternoon.

The treasurer reported a balance of \$5725.39 as of November 30, 1967. Other reports were read by Pat Riley and Alys Saxton. The hiring of a new girl to assist in the library was discussed. Application of Linda Loar was discussed. Robin Lonski will be leaving shortly since it is the policy of the Library to let girls go when they reach age 18. It was decided to let Robin stay on until the end of school year and start Linda in working about 3 hours a week to train as a replacement beginning the latter part of January.
