The regular meeting of the Library Board was called to order by President Pat Riley with all members present except Helen Goble. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. The treasurer's report showed abalance of \$3,401.37. The library circulation report was read.

A report was given by Alys Saxton about copying machines. A Smith-Corona could be purchased for \$2,795. The A.B. Dick machines uses paper in a roll and could be purchased for \$1,650. Discussion followed as to which machine would give the most trouble-free service. Sally Hagebuch made a motion to lease the A.B. Dick machine for three months with leased money to apply to purchase price.

Alys Saxton will order the flower Standards for the Schultz graves for Memorial Day. It was announced that Michigan Week was May 18-25. A coffee hour will be held on May 18th in the auditorium preceding the eleven o'clock parade on Mayor Exchange Day. Mary Jane McColl will take charge of the coffee hour, with Pat Riley and Elsa Klenk assisting.

Miss Goff said that Debbie Zimmerman will be leaving the library. A letter of application from Laurie Hoffman was read. The board approved Miss Goff's request for extra hours of help. British Authors of the 19th Century, Kuntz and Haycroft, and New Light on Juvenile Delinquency ed., Ronald Steel were purchased with fine money. Where Eagles Dare by Alistair MacLean was selected as the Memorial Book for John Scully from his high school class. Several books were suggested for the Memorial Book for Joseph Fredrichs but nothing was decided.

Dick would let us rent the copying machine for three months at the cost of \$100 per month with 100% applied to the purchase price. Mary Jane McColl made a motion that Helen Goble and Alys Saxton use their own judgement in making a payment on the machine before June 30th.

Miss Goff said she had to redirect a letter to Remington Rand Co. and so we will be unable to make any decisions concerning the Memorial money for Durwood Hahn. The yet remaining balance of \$700.00 due for the copying machine is to be paid. All reports concerning the machine have been favorable. Two books, Creative Years and God is for Real, Man, were selected from a list supplied by the donor in memory of Iva Grinage. The Past Presidents of the Service Club will donate God's Smuggler in memory of Iva Grinage and Merry Widow in memory of Hazel Shepherd.

Helen Goble discussed the budget and in light of the Village Council granting the increase it was decided that the library will be open on Wednesdays from now on. Miss Goff was confident that Alice and she could work out the hours so that she would only work five days. The decision as to how much money be put in the certificate of deposit was left up to the discretion of Helen Goble. Meeting was adjourned.
