March 6, 1972

The Regular meeting of the Library Board was called to order by President Pat Riley. Alys Saxton was absent. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as read. The treasurer's report showed a balance of \$5,974.66 in the budget. Circulation reports were read.

Permission to hire a new girl to replace Robin Anderson as she is graduating in June was granted.

A new policy was adopted by all members of the Board concerning the censorship of books. A copy of this policy is attached to these minutes. Sally Hagenbuch and Mary J. McColl will serve as liason officers between the Board and the High School.

It was decided to raise Alice Gurica's salary to \$1.80 per hour. Miss Goff reported that Arnold Klump was hired to do the janitorial work while Mr. Desseranto was ill. The Auditorium rental was set at \$4.00 for a 4 hour daytime rental; \$10.00 for a four hour Sunday, holiday, or evening rental. Any additional time will be at \$1.50 per hour.

The Board toured the Library and it was decided that some of the older books given to the Library that have not circulated for many years should be given to the Goodwill. This would give us more room for other newer books. The adult table will be eliminated and in accordance with the new "freedom to read" policy all books will be available on shelves. It also was decided that Miss Goff should hire another girl whose sole job would be to keep the books straightened, read, and repaired. This would give her a good background of knowledge so she would become an assistant when the need arises.

It was decided by the Board that since our Campbell and Hall Book Guides didn't arrive in time for this meeting, that we will keep them for next months ordering use, thus we will always have the order book in reserve. Miss Goff read her list of books to order and the meeting was adjourned.

New Library Policy

The members of the Library Board adopted the following "freedom to read" policy at their regular monthly meeting on March 6, 1972:

In as much as it is impossible to determine a person's maturity by his chronological age, it is also impossible to determine what he should or should not read. Therefore all books will be available for circulation. Censorship by parents should occur at home, not at the public library. We encourage all parents to examine their children's reading material. Different parents have very different feelings about what their children should or should not read. It is impossible for us to know how each child's parents feel; therefore, we cannot censor for all parents. When a child obtains his own library card, his parents know that he has the privilege and responsibility of choosing what he is to read. If parents do object to their children reading certain books, it is their responsibility, not ours, to keep these books from their children.

The Schultz-Holmes Memorial Library Board

April 3, 1972

The regular meeting of the Library Board was held with Helen Goble conducting the meeting and Elsa Klenk being present. The minutes were reviewed. The treasury budget showed a balance of \$4,584.57.

The Nursery School has asked Miss Goff to explain the Library to their group at 10:00 a.m. on April 14. Miss Goff has also been asked to be on a Forum for the High School Family Relations Class.

A salesman from Doubleday has presented a plan wherein five times a year books (High School level) would be sent in a group lot. We have the choice to examine them and keep as many as we wish; and return the ones we do not like. The maximum cost of this is \$200 a year. The following officers were presented to the board;

The regular meeting of the Library Board was called to order by Mary Jane McColl in the absence of Pat Riley. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as read. The treasury showed a balance of \$219.45 in the budget. Circulation reports were read. Total readers through April were 5,776.

A motion was made by Helen Goble, seconded by Alys Saxton and passed by the Board that we accept the following wage scale; Librarian, \$4200.; Assistant Librarian \$1.85 per hour; experienced aids, \$1.35 per hour; new aids \$1.10 per hour. Miss Goff reported that she has received a check from Gary Houghtby for \$265. for the shelving given by the family in memory of Earl Houghtby. The engraving of the memorial plate was discussed and also placing the plate in a position where it can be easily read by the public. The air conditioning was checked. The Board decided to accept all the books Doubleday sent under the High School Service Plan.

Miss Goff reported that she will get three weeks of paid vacation, Alice, two weeks, and the experienced aids one week. Robin Anderson has expressed her wish to conduct a Story-Hour on alternate weeks; thus giving the children a Story-Hour every week. The Board decided to permit her to do this and that she would be paid her regular hourly wage for this. Many gift books were discussed. The Book-of-the-Month was cancelled. The next meeting of the Board will be held July 10. Meeting was adjourned after book orders.
