Rules for Use of Auditorium

1. Rental is for four (4) hours from the time door is open until it is locked. Daytime rental is \$4.00; rental for Sundays, legal holidays, and evenings is \$10.00. If additional time is needed, the charge will be \$1.50 per hour.
2. The maximum capacity of the auditorium is 100 people. Although the doors between auditorium and library are left unlocked, according to Fire Regulations, the library is not to be used for overflow crowds.
3. The furnishings and equipment of the auditorium or the kitchen are not to be loaned or taken from the building. Dishtowels and tablecloths should be taken for laundering.
4. The rental includes the use of the kitchen for teas and light refreshments, and the use of the projector.
5. People using the kitchen should take away all garbage.
6. Any breakage of dishes must be paid for according to schedule posted in kitchen. Money may be paid to the Village Treasurer with the rent, or handed to the Librarian.

A pull cord needs replacing in the auditorium and an estimate will be given to us for shortening these draperies as they interfere with the heating vents. A set of World Book will be ordered for \$123. A leak in the roof has been repaired. Miss Goff requested that another pamphlet file be purchased. The estimate of the cost from Typewriter Sales is approximately \$100. Gift books were discussed. The September meeting will be held September 10 due to Labor Day. Meeting was adjourned after book orders.
