A Card plate machine was discussed. This would necessitate each person having their Library card with them. Mention was made as to whether we might offer some additional service to the public. Miss Goff reported that Bound-to Stay-Bound will raise their price; approx. 7¢ per book. Gift book was discussed. a Helen Steiner Rice book, given by Mrs. Jaeger. The Book-of-Month (Truman) was cancelled. Miss Goff has again been asked to select \$100 books for our Library to be paid for by the Adrian Co. Library. Meeting was adjourned after book orders.

The American Heart Association Cookbook presented by the Blissfield Service Club; and The Christian Family by Larry Christianson given by Sandra and Fred Hall were shown to the Board. Times Heritage Cookbook by Jean Hewitt will be presented to the library in recognition of Alys Saxtons' 12 years of service by Board Members and Carol Goff. April 1, 1974

The regular meeting of the Library Board was called to order with all members present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as read. The Encyclopedia Britannica and Encyclopedia Britannica, Jr. were shown. Sally will order a live planter (to be cared for by Allen's all summer) for the Schultz graves. It was decided to buy carpet rubber backed rugs for the entryways. Pat Riley will take care of this. The estimate of Enterprise Roofing to repair, regravell, and change level of roof grade to permit water to run into sump was \$420.00. Michigan Week was discussed. The fact that the visiting mayor and our mayor meet for breakfast somewhere just before our coffee hour led to the conclusion that perhaps we would make the Library facilities available to the visitors and eliminate serving rolls. We will wait to hear from the Council as our Board meeting will be previous to Michigan Week. Auditorium rates will remain the same. It was again mentioned that the entry way, and bathrooms and kitchen do not heat or cool. Miss Goff reported that a new outside light has been installed. The Board voted to raise Library Fines: 5¢ for Adult; (everyone 9th grade up) on books, phamplets, magazines, and records. The fee for children had been 2¢ per day, ; that rate will be 3¢ per day on April 15 when the new fine rates will take effect. None of the Board members got the Campbell and Hall Book Guides so Miss Goff presented all the book orders.
