
Mary Case asked for suggestions for the 1976 budget. Discussion was held on the girl's wages for the coming year. Discussion will be continued next month.

The Secretary's report was read and approved. The Treasurer reported expenses of \$2,345.28 leaving a remaining budget of \$11,846.69.



April 5, 1976

The regular meeting of the Library Board was called to order by Vice-President, Elsa Klenk, in the temporary absence of President Mary Jane McColl. Sally Hagenbuch was absent.

The Secretary's report was read and approved. The Treasurer reported expenses of \$1,294.56 leaving a remaining budget of \$7,005.30.

Gretta Reinhardt reported that a calculator had been purchased out of our Book Sale money at a price of \$16.52 which is to be used by the Library staff.

Mary Case reported on the roof. She has checked into the matter and we will be required to obtain 3 bids from 3 different architects.

Elsa Klenk reported that Mr. and Mrs. Fred Black had resigned as janitors after 2 weeks. Mr. Art Doepler has been hired to take their place.

A discussion on filing many items that might be more accessible to Board members in the event Miss Goff might be disabled for any length of time. Miss Goff will establish this file, with the Board volunteering to help.

Discussion was held on the regular Wednesday night Bridge Group which plays in the auditorium. Mr. Doepler does not like to stay the whole time and close up. Mary Case moved, supported by Patricia Riley, that we do not require Mr. Doepler to stay the whole time only to come after they are finished and lock up. Motion carried. It was decided to check with Fire Chief, Stuart DeRousie, to see if we could possibly lock the inside door which goes directly into the auditorium.

Elsa Klenk reported on tables for the auditorium. Three (3) bids were submitted, namely: Steger-Showel, Toledo, choice of table top finish \$62.20 each; Industrial Mill, Adrian, plastic top \$81.50 each; Tagsolds, Blissfield, formica walnut finish top \$50.00 each. Patricia Riley moved, supported by Mary Case to purchase 6 new tables from Tagsolds at a price of \$50.00 each. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on continuing the Wednesday closing. Patricia Riley moved, supported by Gretta Reinhardt to continue the Wednesday closing until September. Motion carried. Miss Goff reported that last year the Library closed at 5:30 P.M. on Maunday Thursday and was closed all day on Good Friday. Gretta Reinhardt moved, supported by Patricia Riley, that we do the same for this year. Motion carried.

Discussion on the book "Jaws" was held. The Board instructed Miss Goff to put the book out on the paperback carasoul. As we are a public library and have the policy that we will not be censors for parents on what their children may or may not read, we feel this book should be made available to the general public.

Patricia Riley moved, supported by Mary Case, that we accept the following slate of officers for 1976-1977. Motion carried.

May 3, 1976

The regular meeting of the Library Board was called to order by President, Elsa Klenk.

Guests at the meeting were the Library Committee of Council consisting of Thelma Seethaler, Les Frank and Robert Lips. Also present was Al Curnow, Superintendent of Public Works.

The Secretary's report was read and approved. The Treasurer reported expenses of \$2,478.47 leaving a remaining budget of \$4,526.90.

Discussion was held on the problem of our roof. Mr. Curnow suggested that perhaps we could get an estimate of the cost of repairing the roof as is before contacting architects in regards to a new roof. After much discussion the Library Committee favored this approach and we are to proceed on this matter. Mary Case will contact Watson Brothers Roofing for an estimate and contact a builder for an estimate.

It was reported that a new lock was put on the back door. Those who have this key are Miss Goff, Janitor, Mr. Curnow, Consumers Power and one in the office. Elsa Klenk and Herb Kodelman of the Wednesday Bridge Club, have a key to the auditorium.

Elsa Klenk reported on the findings of Fire Chief, Stuart DeRousie. For up to 100 people we must have 2 exits, 2 feet by 6 feet. As we do have such exits it is possible for us to keep the inside door lock which goes directly into the auditorium.

Elsa Klenk also reported on new card tables. She had 4 bids, namely: Gambles \$19.95; Gilson's \$16.25; Tagsold's \$12.95 and Best \$9.93. Three (3) new card tables were purchased for the auditorium from Best at a total price of \$29.79.

Elsa Klenk reported that our scrubber-buffer is broken and cannot be repaired again. She had three (3) bids on a new scrubber-buffer, namely:

Mary Jane McColl will take care of contacting Mrs. Allen about getting the flowers for the Schultz graves for Memorial Day.

Letters of application were read from Susan Barger and Vicki Olsen. Miss Goff reported that Kelly Isaacson will be leaving when school is finished as her family is moving out of town. Gretta Reinhardt made a motion, supported by Pat Riley that we hire Vicki Olsen. Motion carried. The board felt that any additional summer help which we might need should be given to the girls presently employed at the Library by allowing them extra hours, therefore our Corresponding Secretary, Pat Riley, was instructed to advise Susan Barger that we would not be hiring any additional help this summer.

Michigan Week is to be May 17 and the Library Board has again been asked to put on the Continental Breakfast consisting of juice, rolls and coffee. Pat will take care of getting the rolls and Sally will take care of getting the rest of the groceries. Flowers for the tables will be taken care of by Mary Jane McColl and Gretta Reinhardt.

Kirkus Review was discussed. Sally Hagenbuch made a motion, supported by Mary Jane McColl that we continue to subscribe to the Kirkus review for another year.

Miss Goff gave us a demonstration of the new Microfilm Reader. This machine gives the person operating it a list of books that are available through the Lenawee County Library, Monroe County Library and Tecumseh Library.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

The old floor scrubber is to be disposed of by Elsa Klenk in a manner which she feels is satisfactory.

Elsa Klenk reported that Mr. Doerfler needs some additional help in moving the furniture etc. as he is stripping the floors. Mr. DeSerrano was contacted and will be glad to help him. Mary Jane McColl made a motion supported by Pat Riley that we pay Mr. DeSerrano \$2.30 an hour for his help. Motion carried.

The Maple and Locust trees are diseased and Sally Hagenbuch will contact the Michigan State Extension Service to find out if anything can be done to save them.

Miss Goff reordered the Kirkus Review for 1 year and also the Booklist for 1 year.

Miss Goff also reported that a letter had been received in regards to the Estate of Edna Beery whereby the Library Board may select any books from her collection they may wish to have.

Mrs. Sam Bell has 3 paintings by Erma Schulz Holmes which she would like to give to the Library. These pictures were on display and the Board decided to keep them to be hung in Miss Goff's office.

Miss Goff reported that Patti Weinlander will be commuting to Siena Heights and she will be continuing to work until the first of the year.

The book of the month selection was cancelled.

The next meeting of the Board will be Tuesday, July 6 due to the holiday on July 5.
