We should like to inform you of our dissatisfaction with the drapes installed by your company at the auditorium of the Schultz-Holmes Memorial Library in Blissfield. We have expressed this several times to your representative, Mr. Carl Silberhorn, and his advice was that there was nothing he would do other than press and lengthen them. We felt his attitude and manner were most discourteous.

Feeling you were specialists in the field, a fabric recommended by Mr. Silberhorn was chosen for that window. The twenty year old drapes that were being replaced certainly never looked as bad as these new ones. The drapes were lengthened and pressed at your workroom but it is apparent that this fabric has no resiliency for the did not hold the press. The lower 12 inches are pulled up and wrinkled and the hem is uneven. Certainly after a drape is pressed it should hold that press.

The auditorium is used weekly by the Kiwanis Club and Rotary Club. The men have commented on how disheveled the drapes appear. Perhaps we should post a sign on them, "These drapes by Elder Brothers." This certainly will not afford good advertisement for your business.
