The regular meeting of the Library Board was called to order by the president, Gretta Peinhardt. Mary Case and Sally Hagenbuch were absent.

The Secretary's report was read and approved. The treasurer's report showed expenses of \$4096.29, leaving a remaining budget of \$19,132.15.

The authenticity of purchase of twelve furnace filters on Schaedlers bill was questioned. It was decided to pay for them. The bill for the new shelving will be paid excluding the end panels. Elsa Klenk reported that she had been unable to contact Mary Case concerning an appropriate date for Mrs Klump to accompany them to purchase new drapes for the work room and office. Mrs Klump reported a slight improvement in the janitor's services. She also stated that Amy Wolfe and Barbara DeVantier were satisfactory. The windows and head registers need cleaning, but we will need help from the village on this.

The Pres. asked Mrs. Klump if she had any suggestions for new equipment that might be included in the next budget. She recommended a child sized table and chairs, and some type of record holder or browser. Although the library has never purchased any records we do have some gift P.C.A.s and the county will be buying some.

It was decided to ask Lynn Southard to make an estimate on a record browser stand. The cost of Copying machine paper was discussed and it was decided to buy it through the village as their price is four rolls for \$36.00. Gretta Peinhardt will check with the village treasurer on reinvestment on the Schultz Holmes money.

Renewals for Yankee, Campus Life and Antique Trader were approved. World Book Yearbook will be ordered. The meeting was adjourned and book orders were given.

A motion was made and seconded to purchase a child's size table and chairs closely matching the other furniture as possible. A motion was made and seconded to buy 12 card board record holders.

New Business.... Mrs. Klump is to make a periodic report to the Library Committee of the Council. One Outside Light is not working and it is to be repaired by taking parts from the one that is not in use. It was moved and seconded to subscribe to the School Library Journal and the New York Times Book Review. Sally Hagenbuch will take care of the Shultz Holmes grave urn this Year.

Mrs. Klump asked that the castor on her office chair be checked.


Sally Hagenbuch now Member at Large suggested that she or anyone in her office assist if one of the other officers needs help.

Alice and Barbara request that we set a definite amount for a fine for everybody. Sally moved that we charge a blanket fine of 5¢ per day per item.

M.J. seconded. Board approved.

Barbara had a letter from Baker and Taylor to Woodlands Library Coop of which we are a part that we shall be allowed a 39½% discount instead of 33%.
