## Graduation

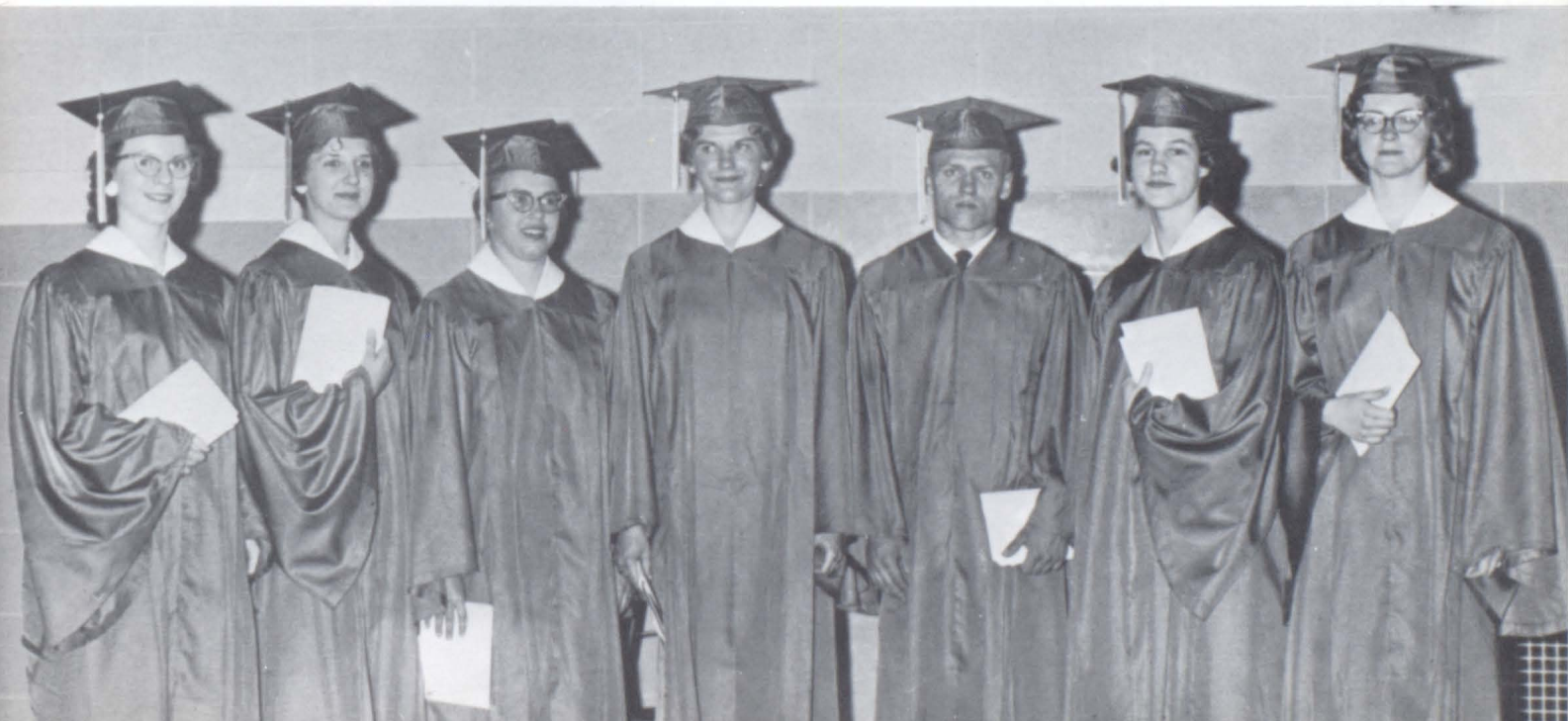
Baccalaureate services for the class of 1961 were held on May 28. Reverend Price of the United Brethren Church addressed the assembly.
