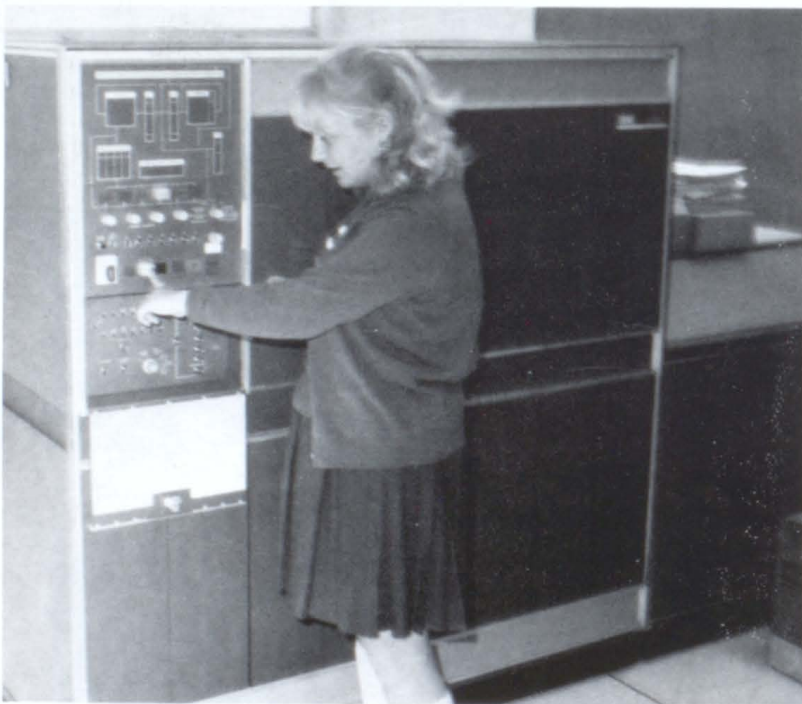
The 53rd edition of the Elysium chose as its theme, "Youth Is ...". Evidence of youth was conspicuous throughout the year.

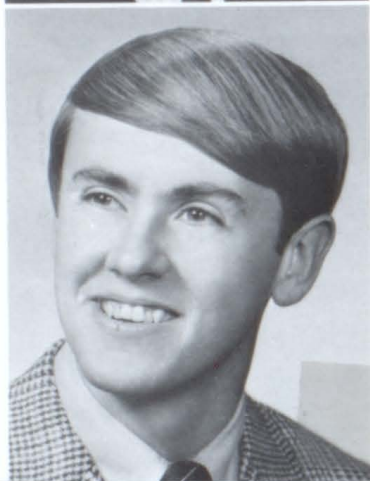
MRS. JAN DURBIN

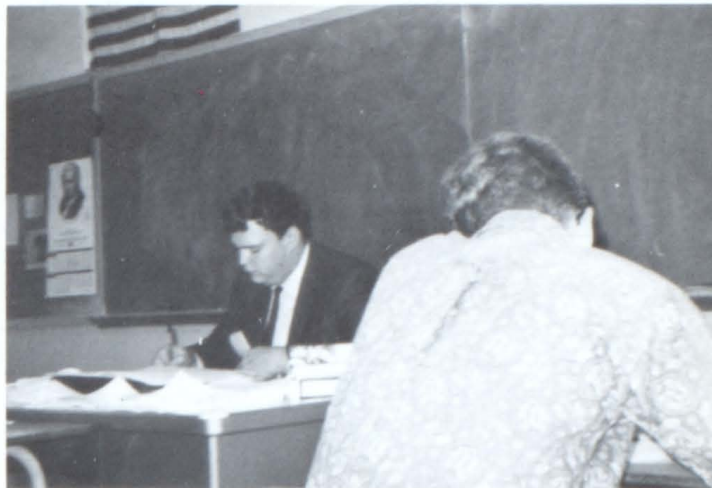

Mrs. Logan was graduated from Berry College with a B. A. degree. She is Senior class advisor and a sponsor for the French Club. She teaches French I and II and English II.

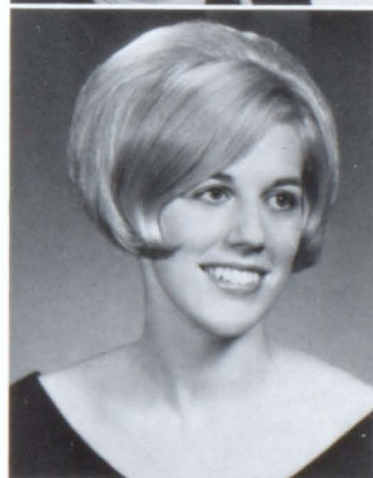
MRS. CAROL GREENWALD

Mrs. Onofrio obtained her A.B. degree from Indiana University and her Certificat of Librarian from Western Michigan University. She is Junior Class advisor.



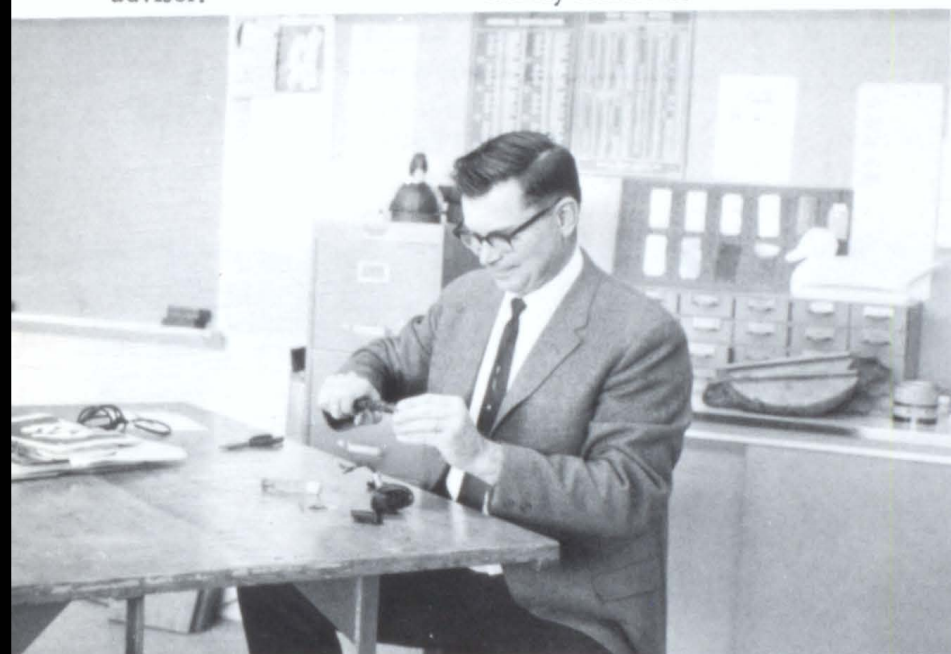
MR. WALLACE RIDGLEY

The processional and recessional were played by the BHS band.

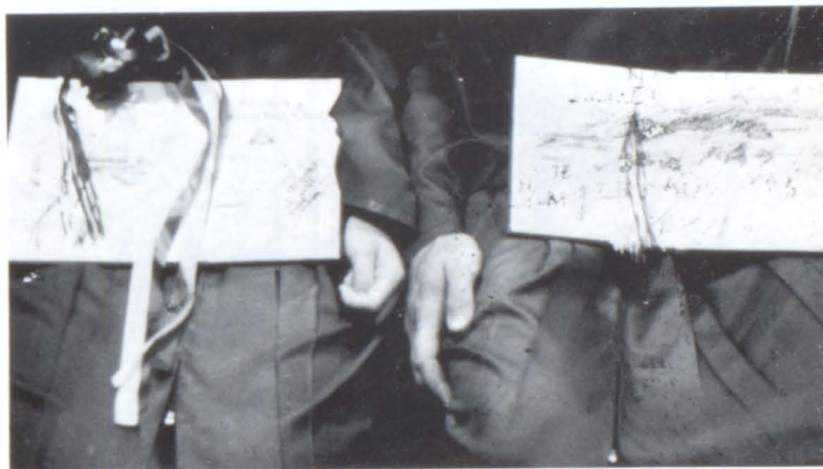

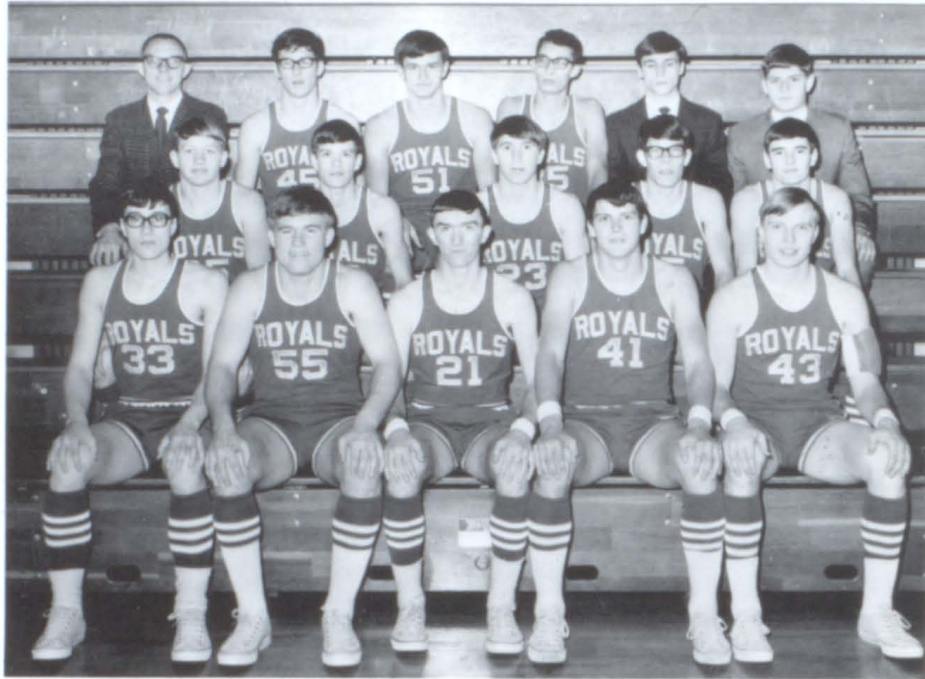

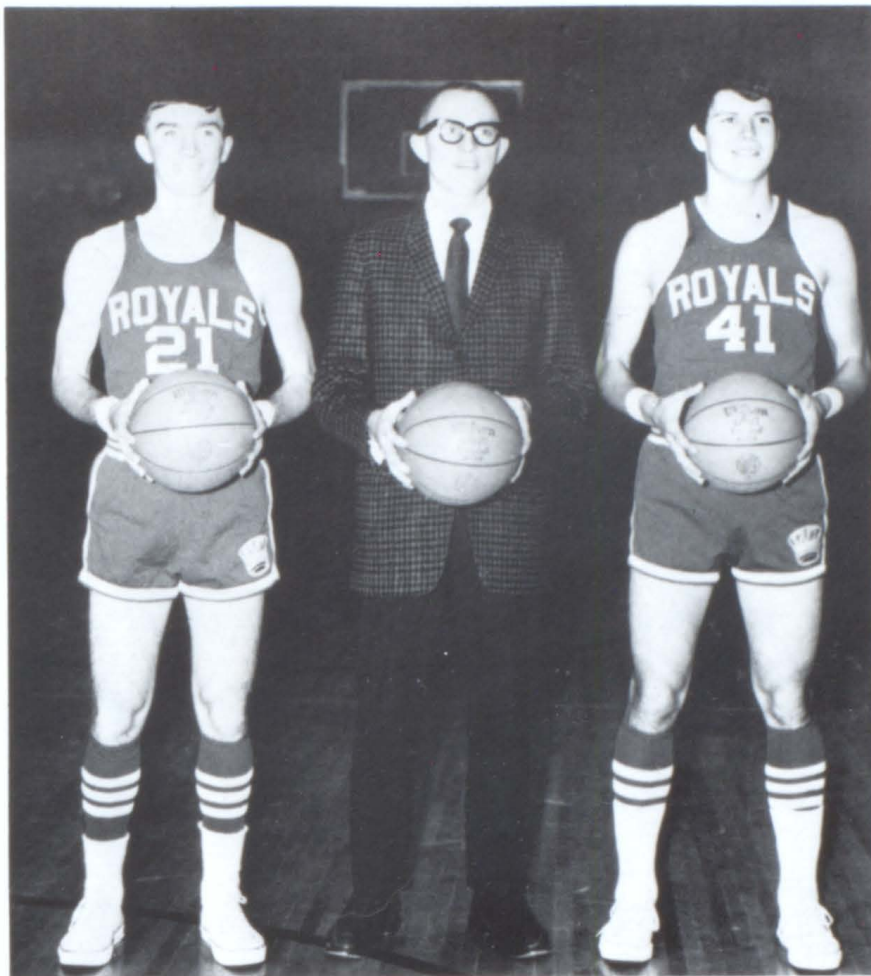

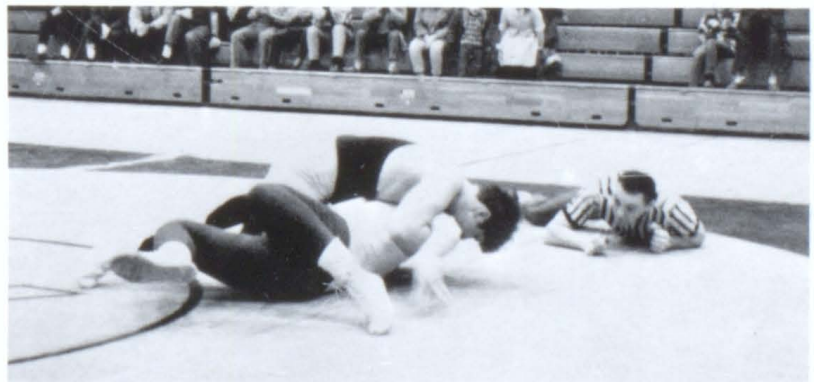

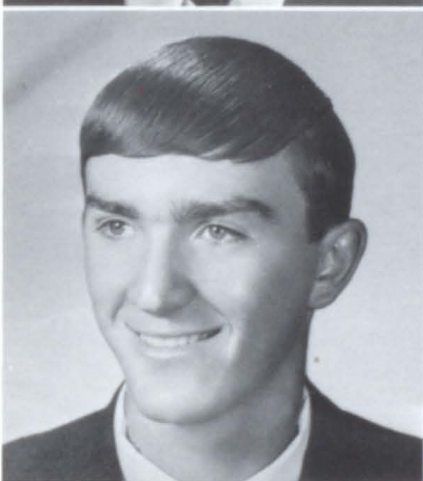
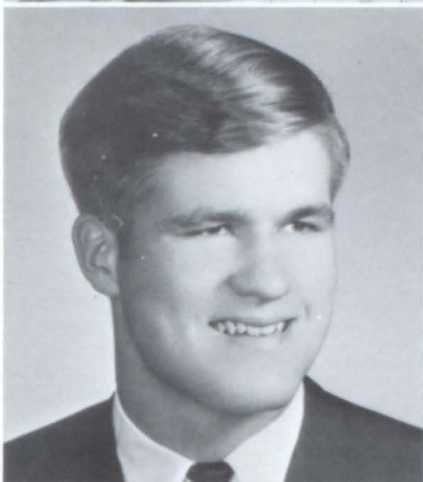
The Senior Class was run by V. Pres., L. Pagel; Pres., T. Labert; Treas., P. Anderson; and Sec., K. Flanagan.
