







The yearbook staff chose "Sounds" as the theme for the 55th edition of the Elysium.


Each school year is full of sounds. The sound of homecoming and the prom, the sounds of sports events, and finally the sounds of students who made the school year what it was.










CONNIE JO SMITH






OUR MISS BROOKS



The Royal Cagers won their first game in the tournament by beating Jefferson 91-69, but lost the second game to Monroe C.C. 58-65.








