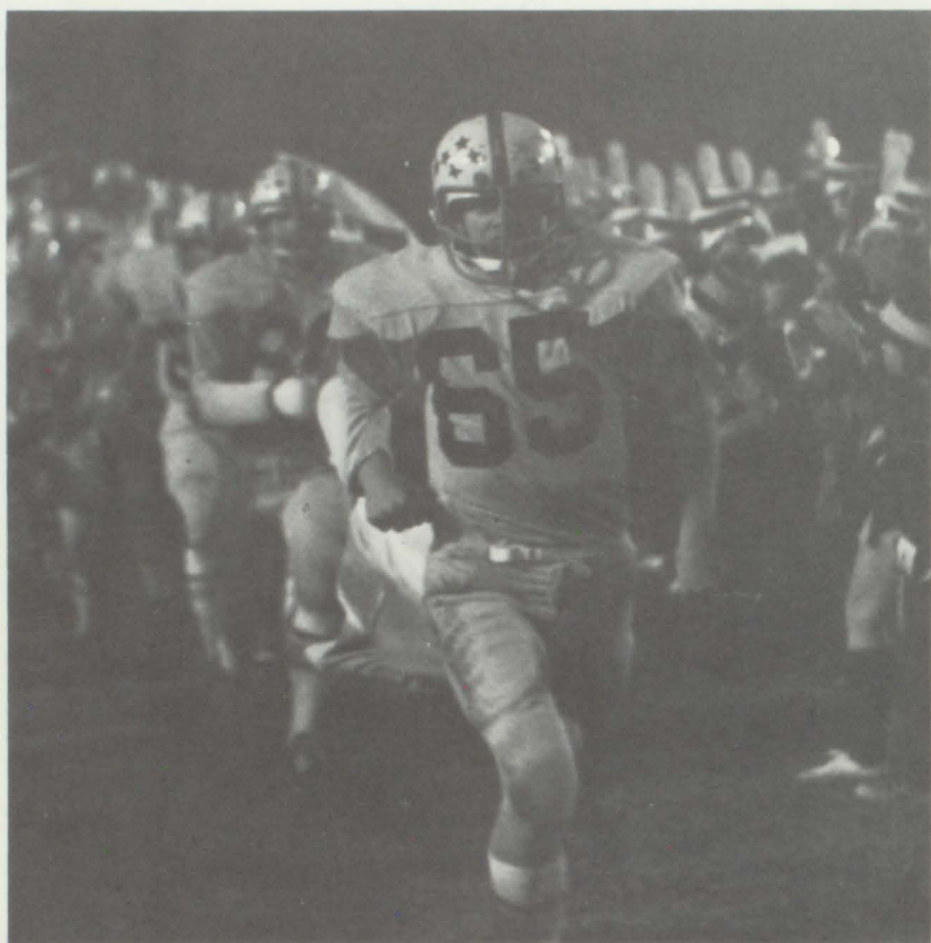




Homecoming — a Special Victory

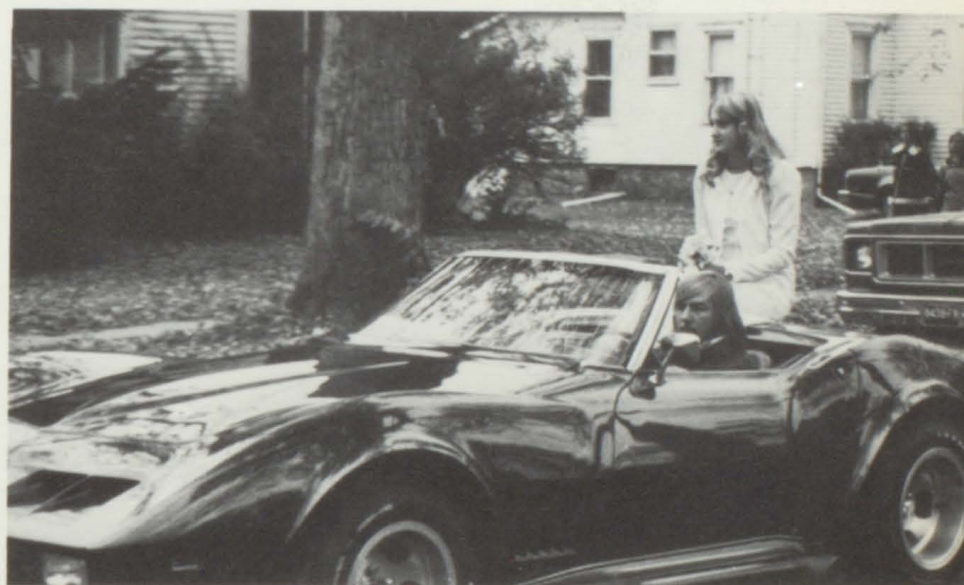

Class of '75 Moves On

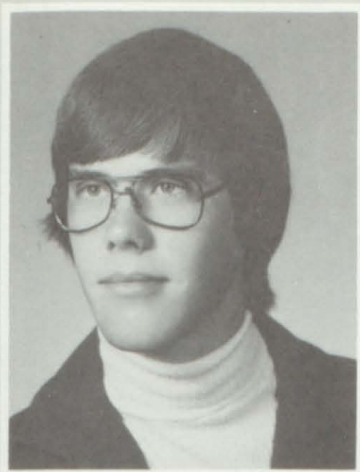

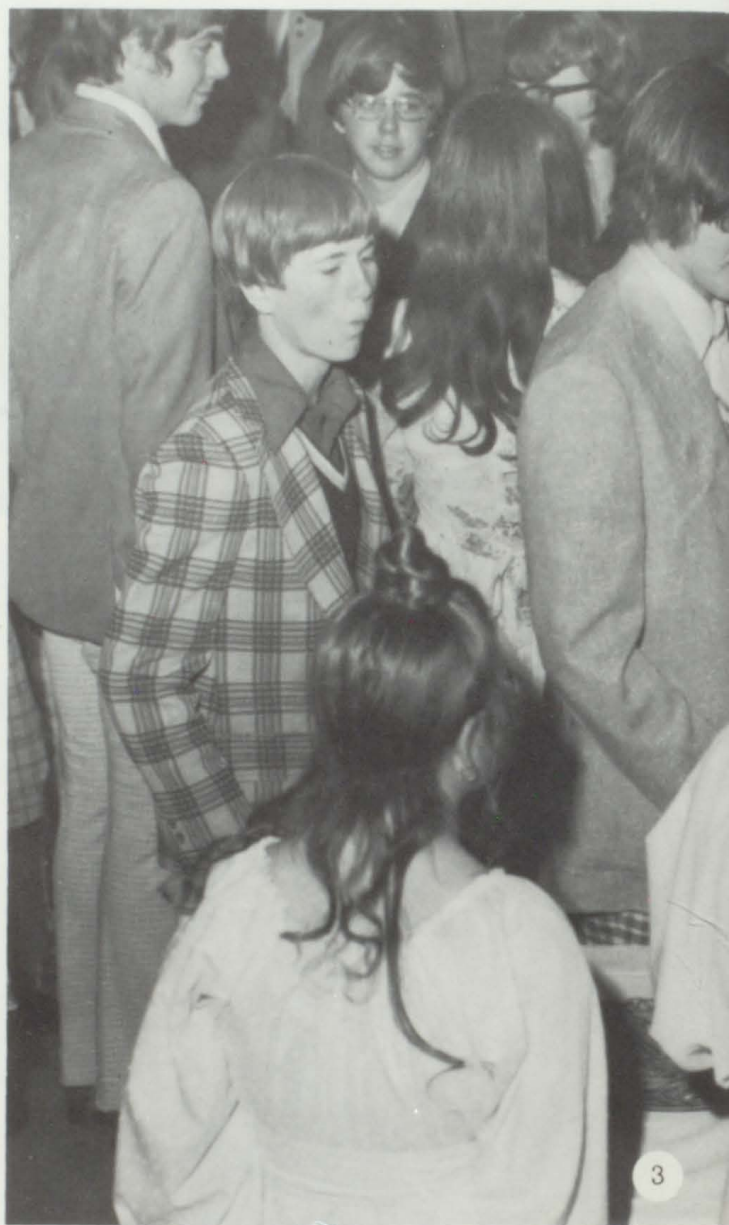
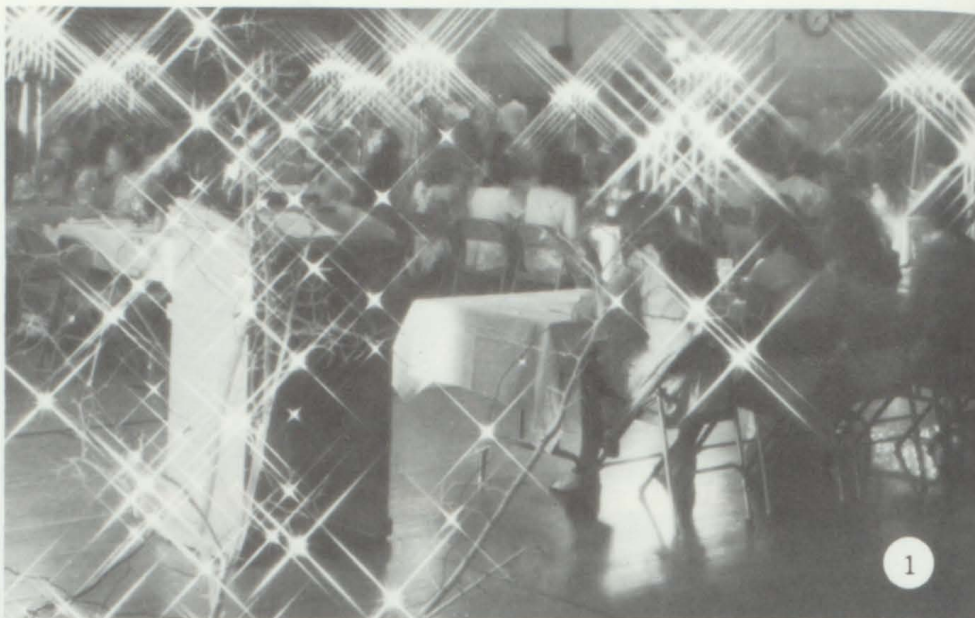
Dates and Mates

A Week of Activity at BHS



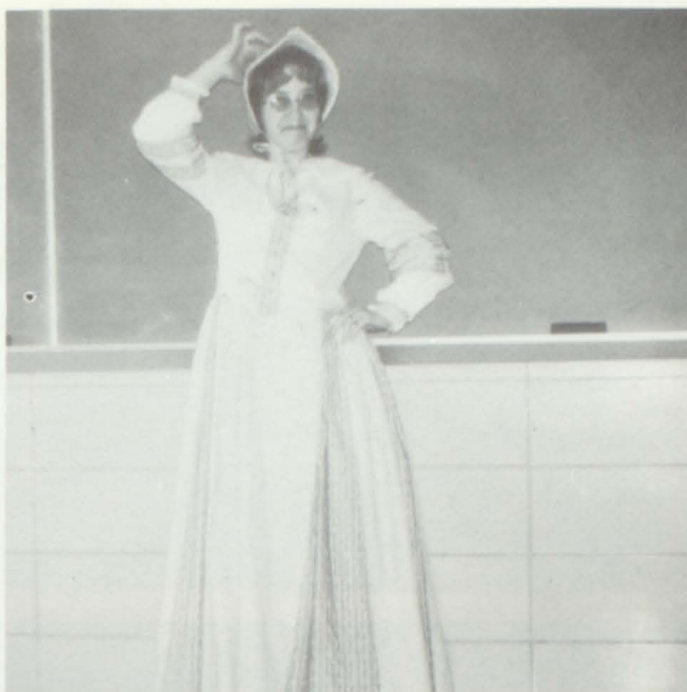
Activities Week started on Monday with a breakfast consisting of donuts and milk.

The seniors won the paper airplane flying contest and the volleyball games.

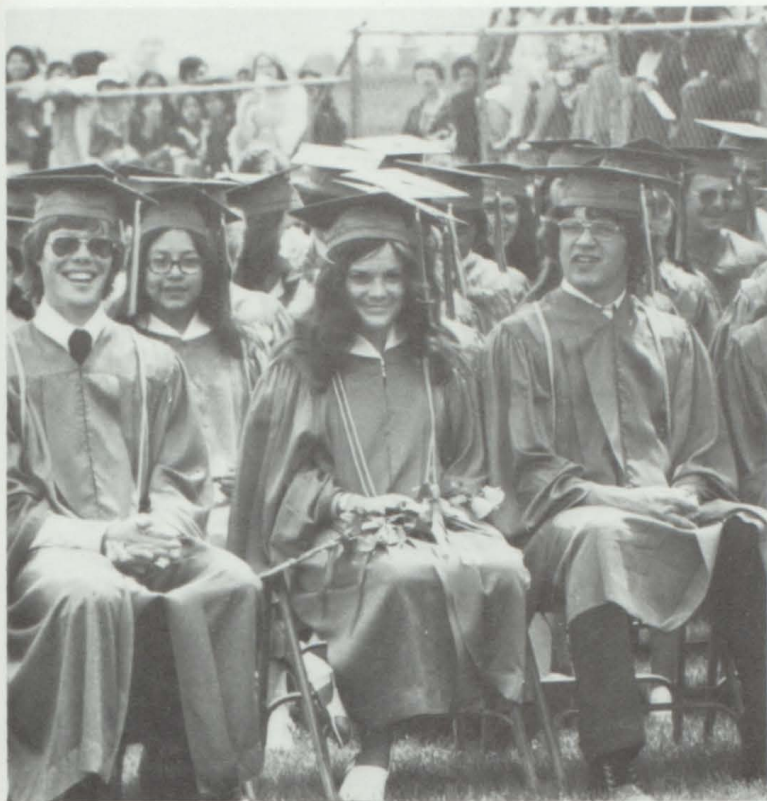
The Volkswagen stuffing contest was won by the juniors, who got 15 kids in the car within 13.3 seconds.

The tug of war was won by the seniors.

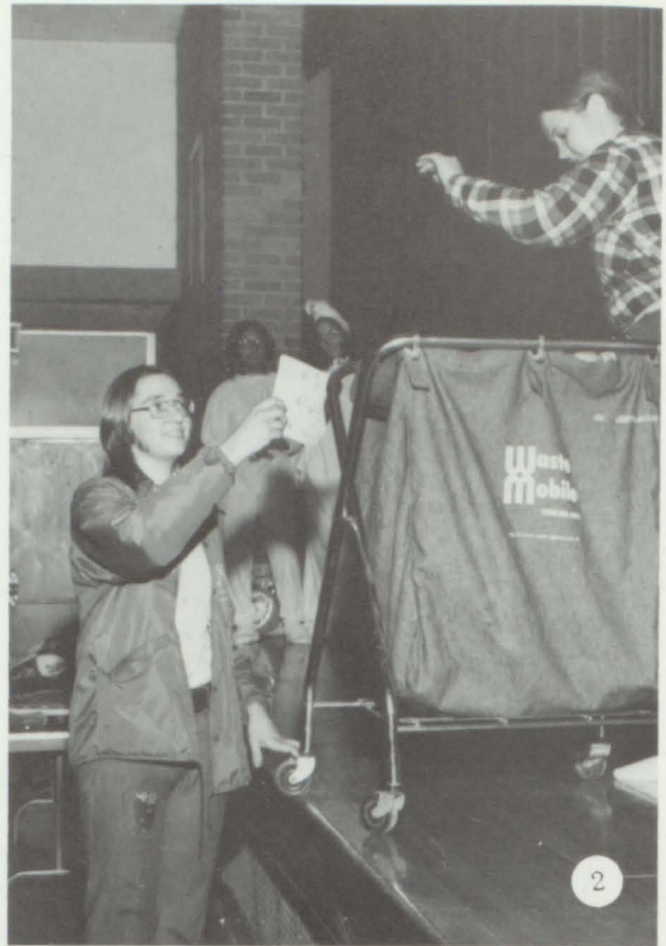
The final scores for competition showed the seniors won with 117 pts.; juniors were second with 77; sophomores were next with 50; and freshmen followed with 26 pts.

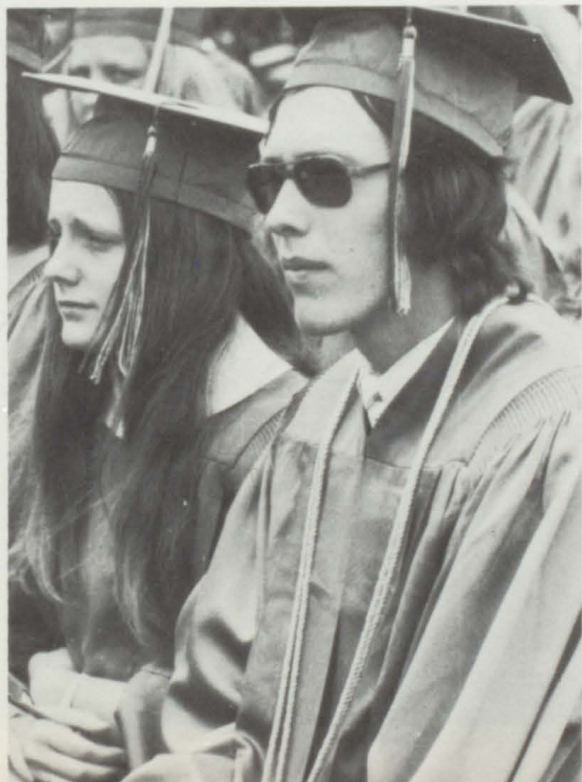


We've Only Just Begun
