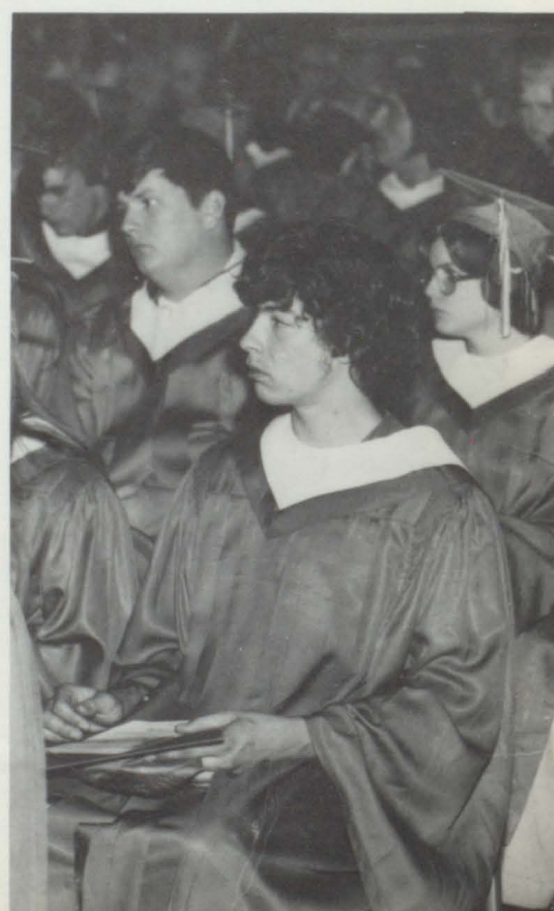




Baccalaureate: Nearing The Beginning

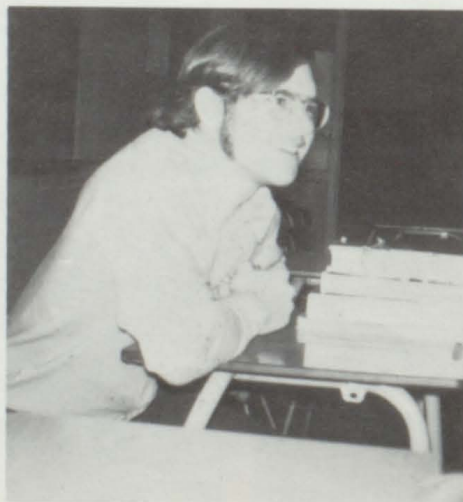
American Legion Awards went to Jean Porter, John Riley, and diplomas were presented to 135.

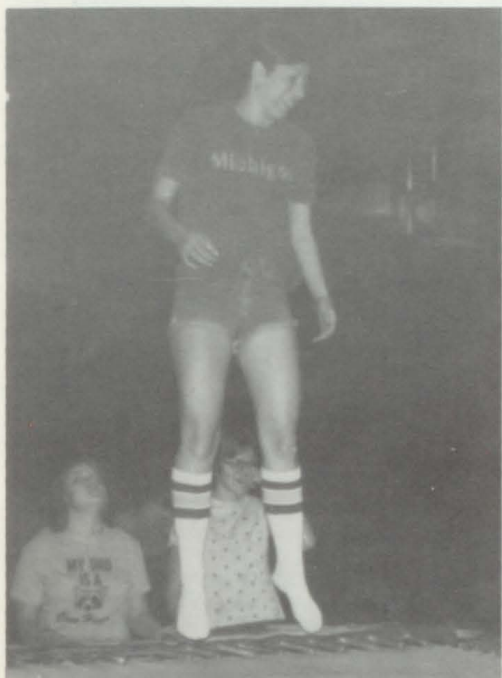
And As We Wind On Down The Road . . .

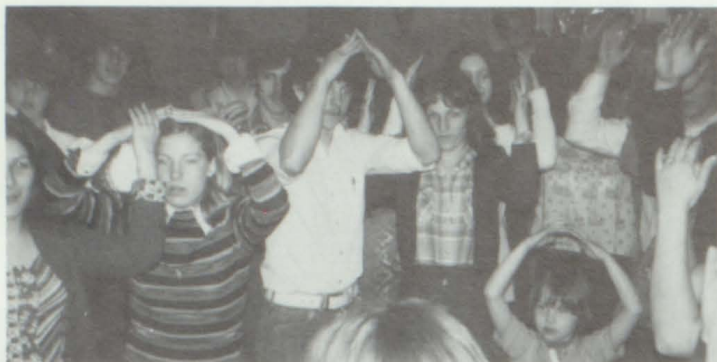

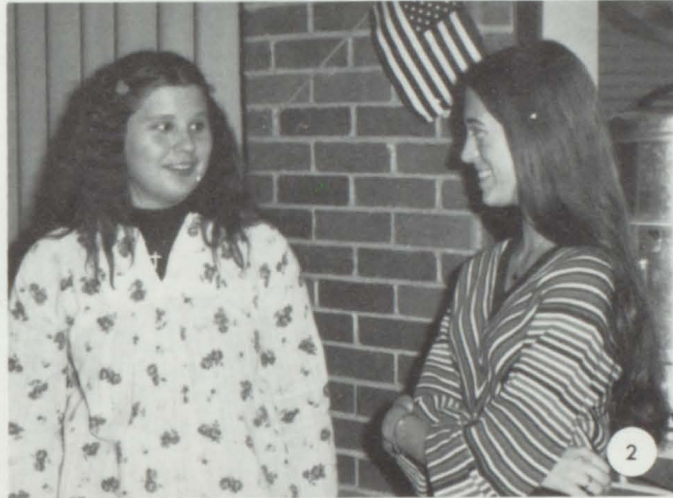


FHA Has Busy Year

Good Times During Activities Week

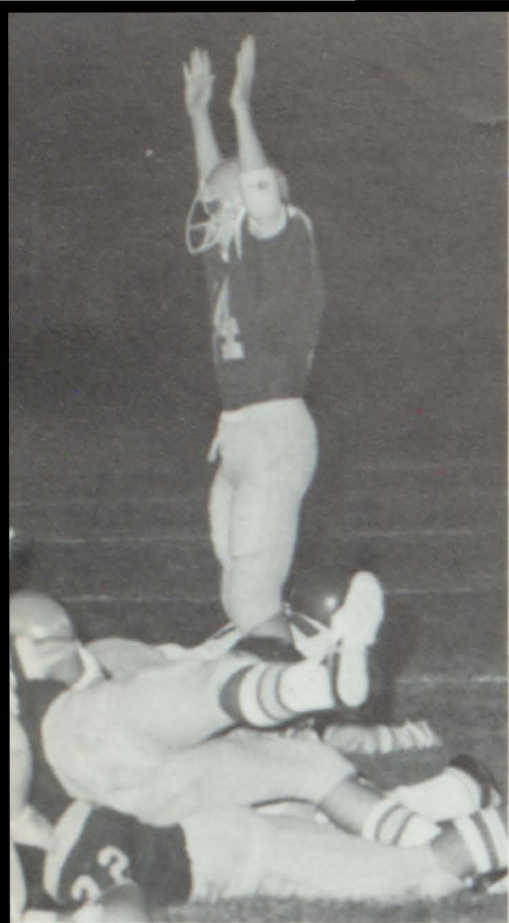


Activities Week started out with a bang on Monday with Cowboys and Indians day and a SC sponsored donut breakfast.

The Girls' softball team ended the season with a 2-10 record. C. Spotts, pitcher, was MVP.



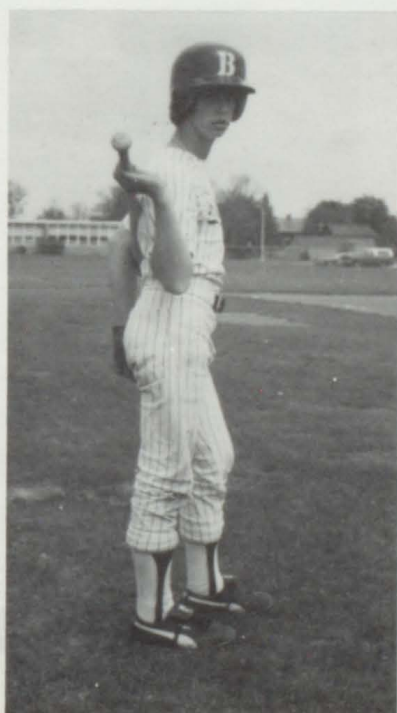
