Veldhoff was named most valuable player, LCAA League meet and Regionals. They also placed second at Bath Invitational. Despite 4 meets being run in the rain, 9 new records were set. In the Long Jump B. Veldhoff jumped $18^{\prime} 13 / 4^{\prime \prime}$. In High Jump B. Bilby leaped to $5^{\prime} 4^{\prime \prime}$.
