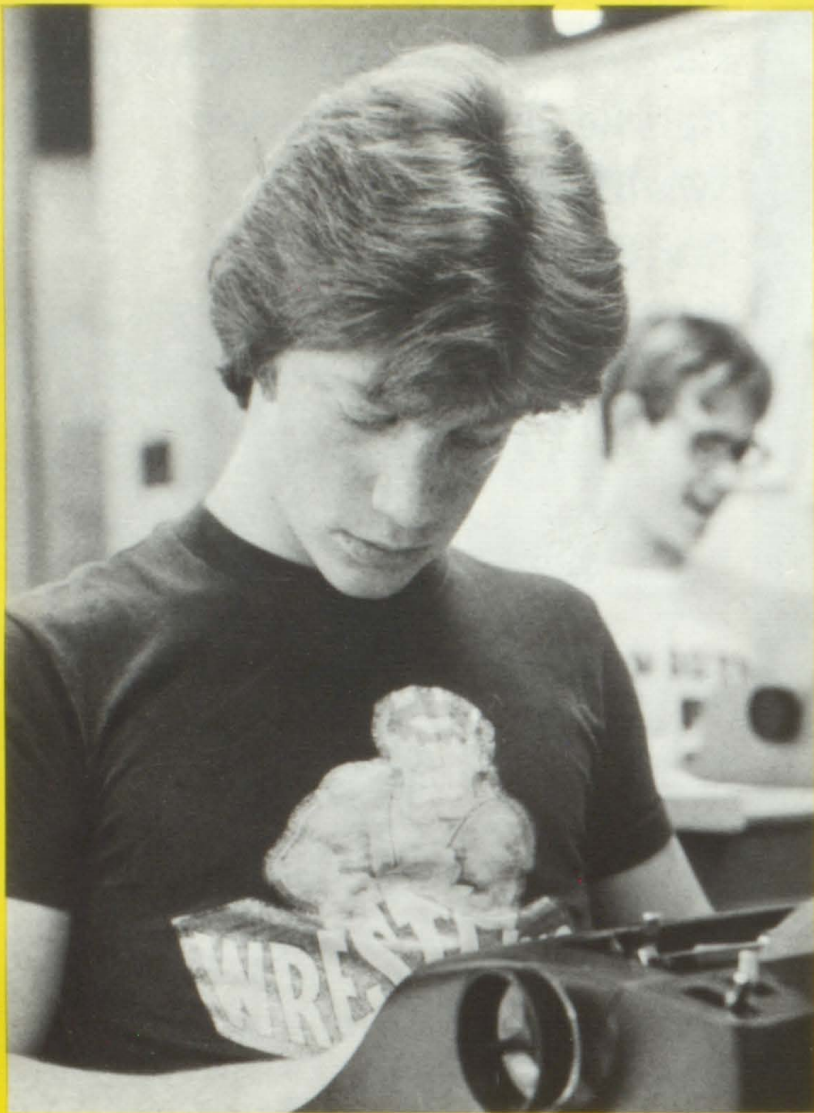

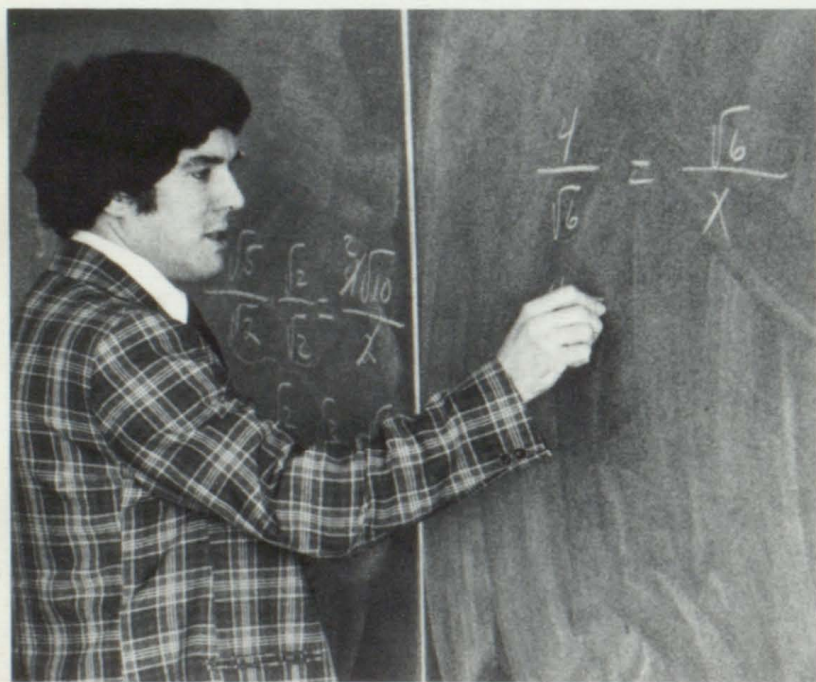

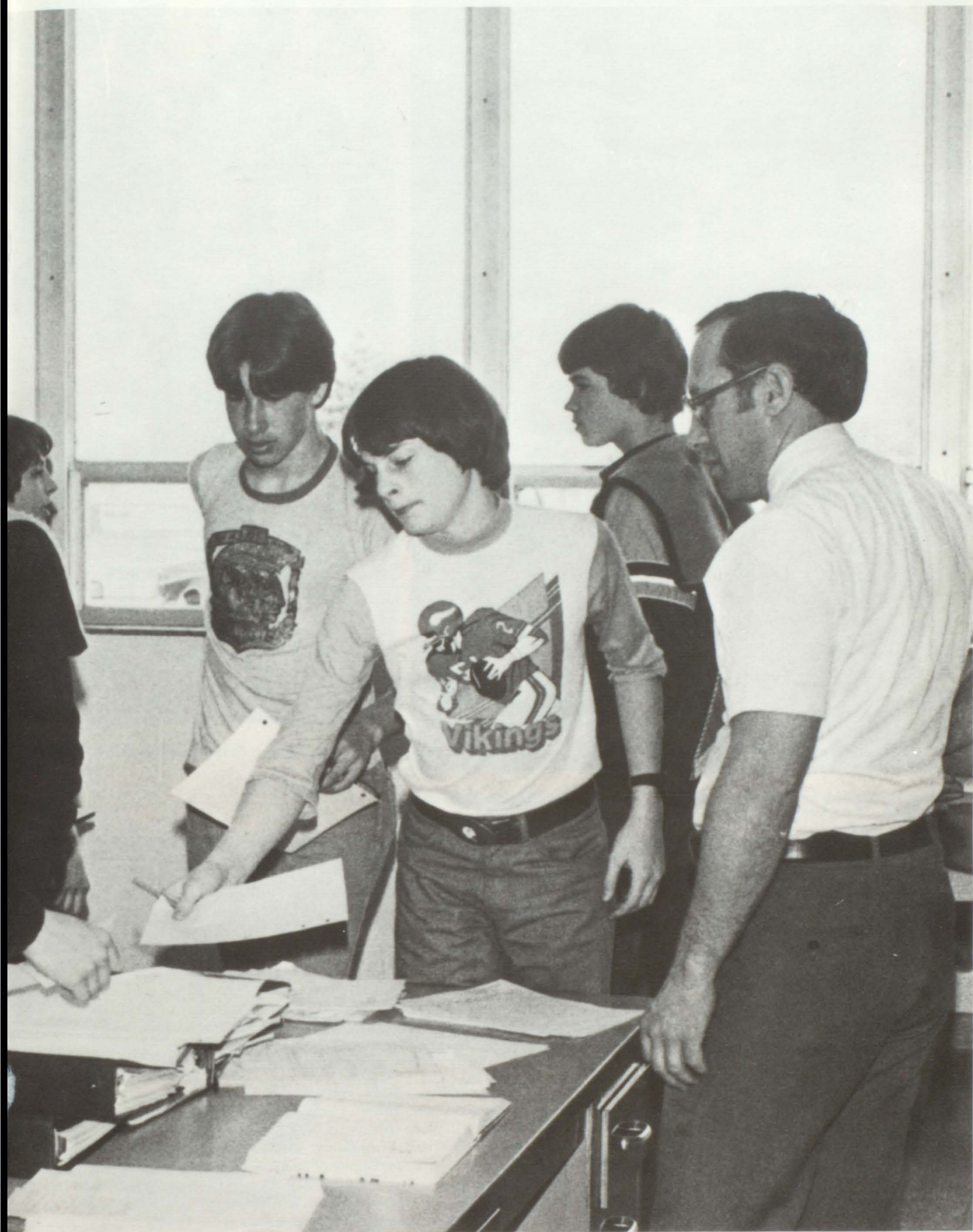

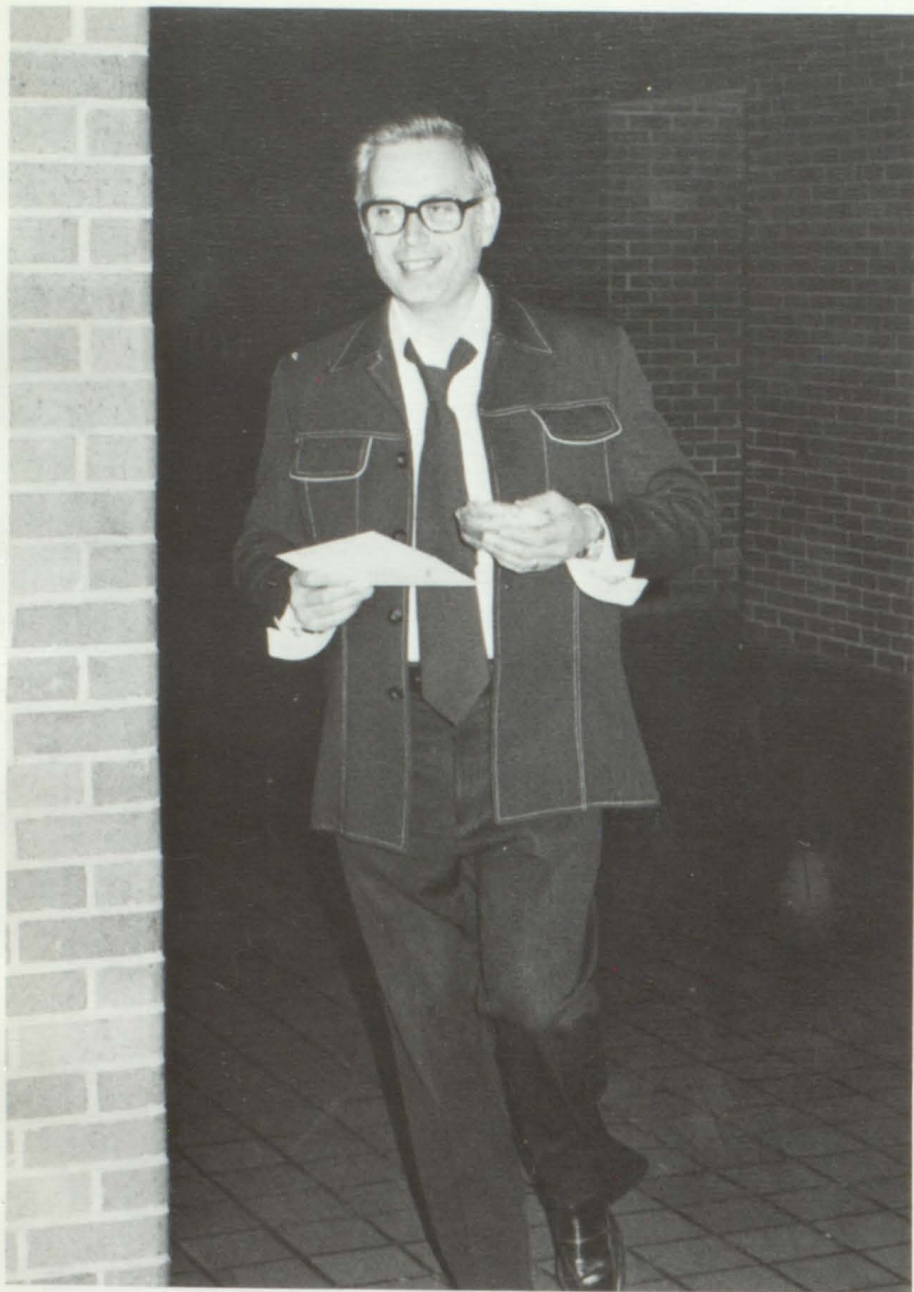

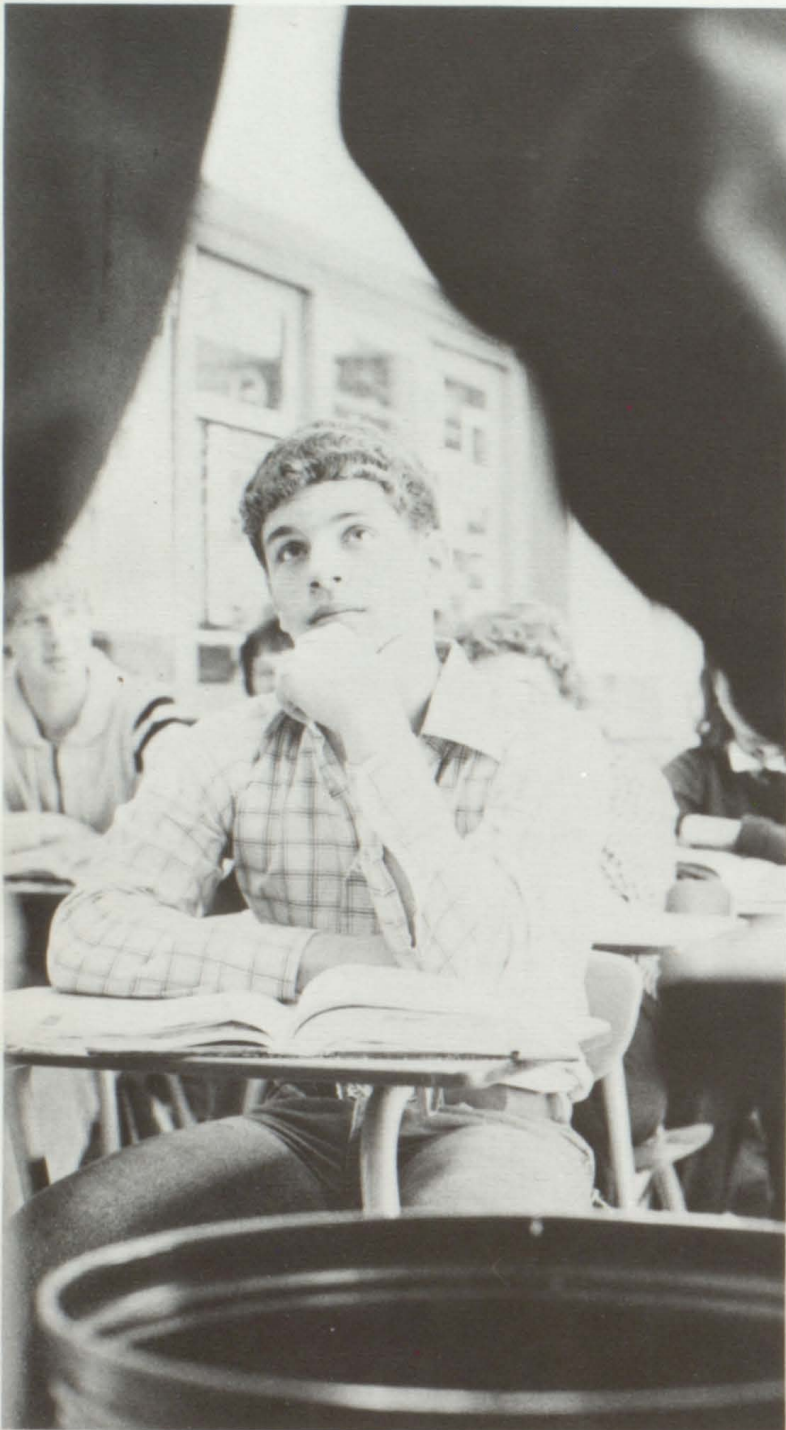

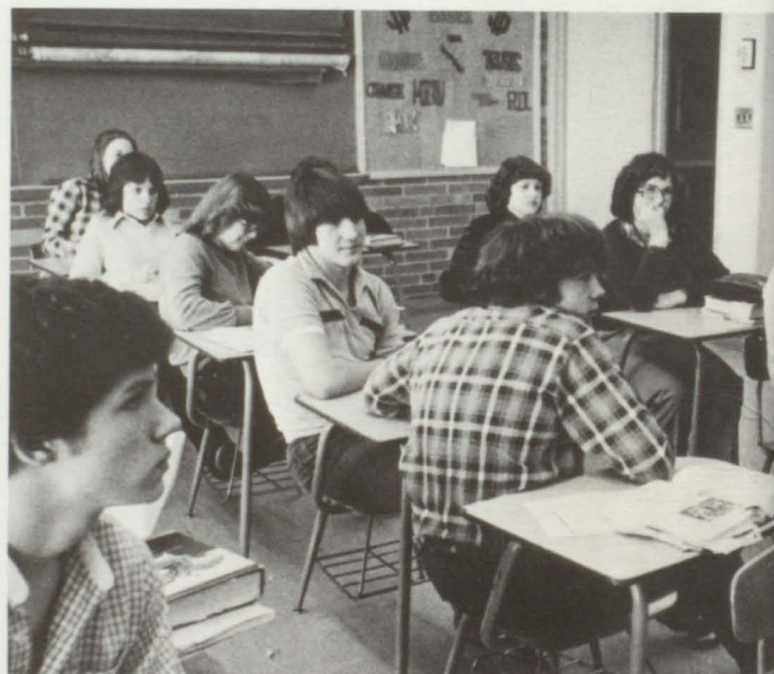

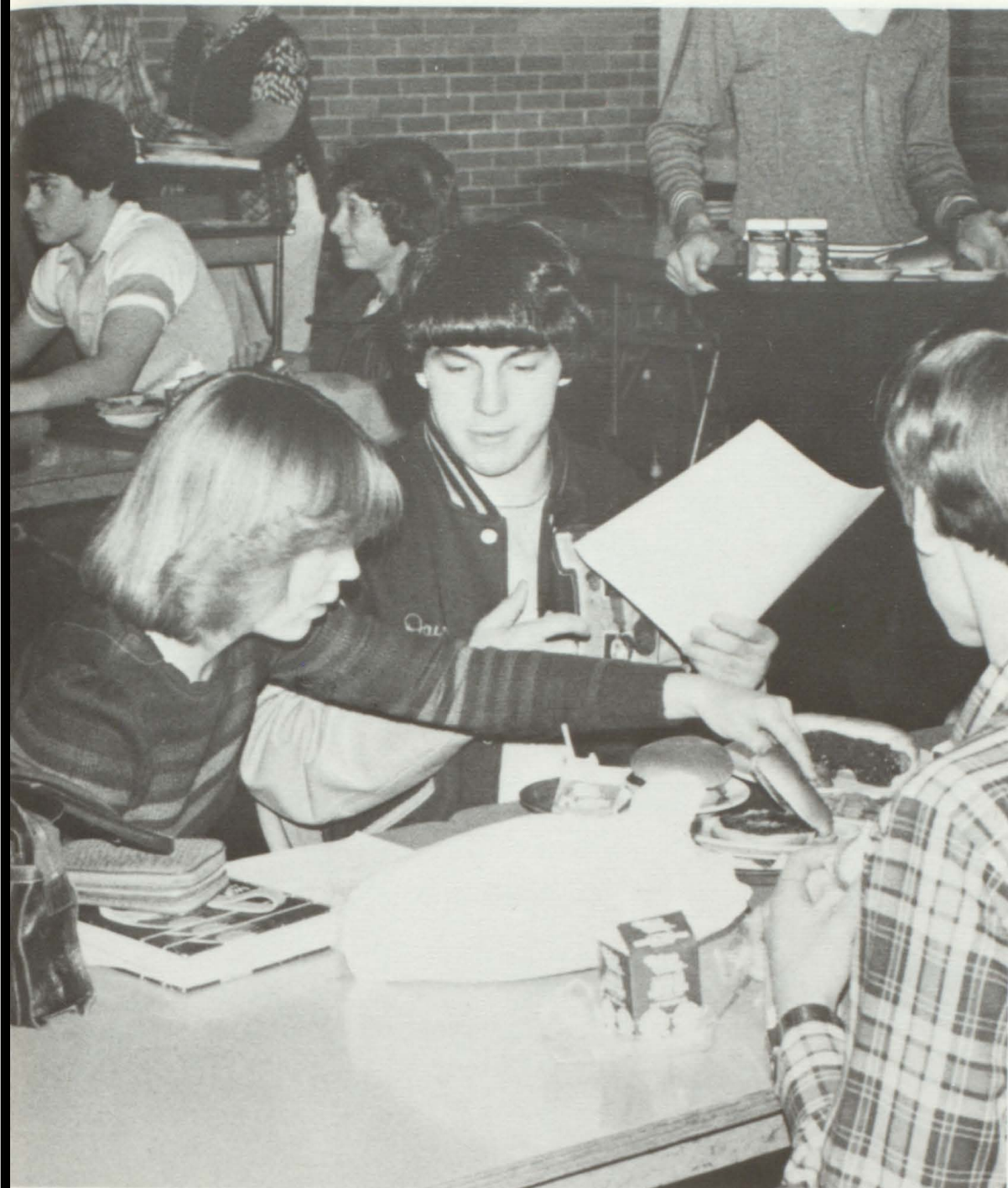

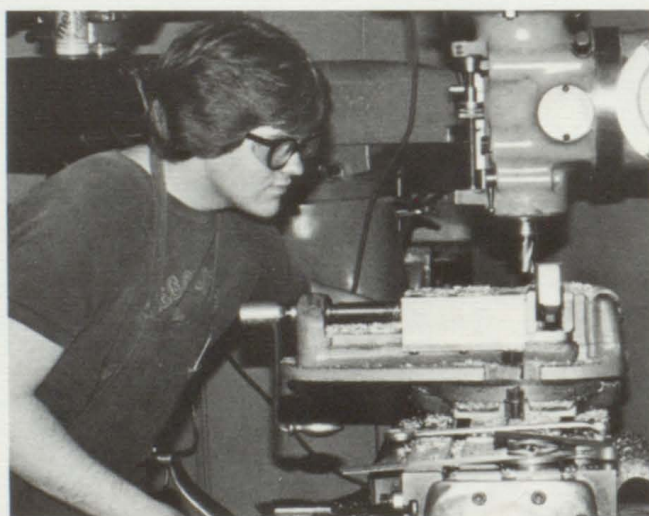

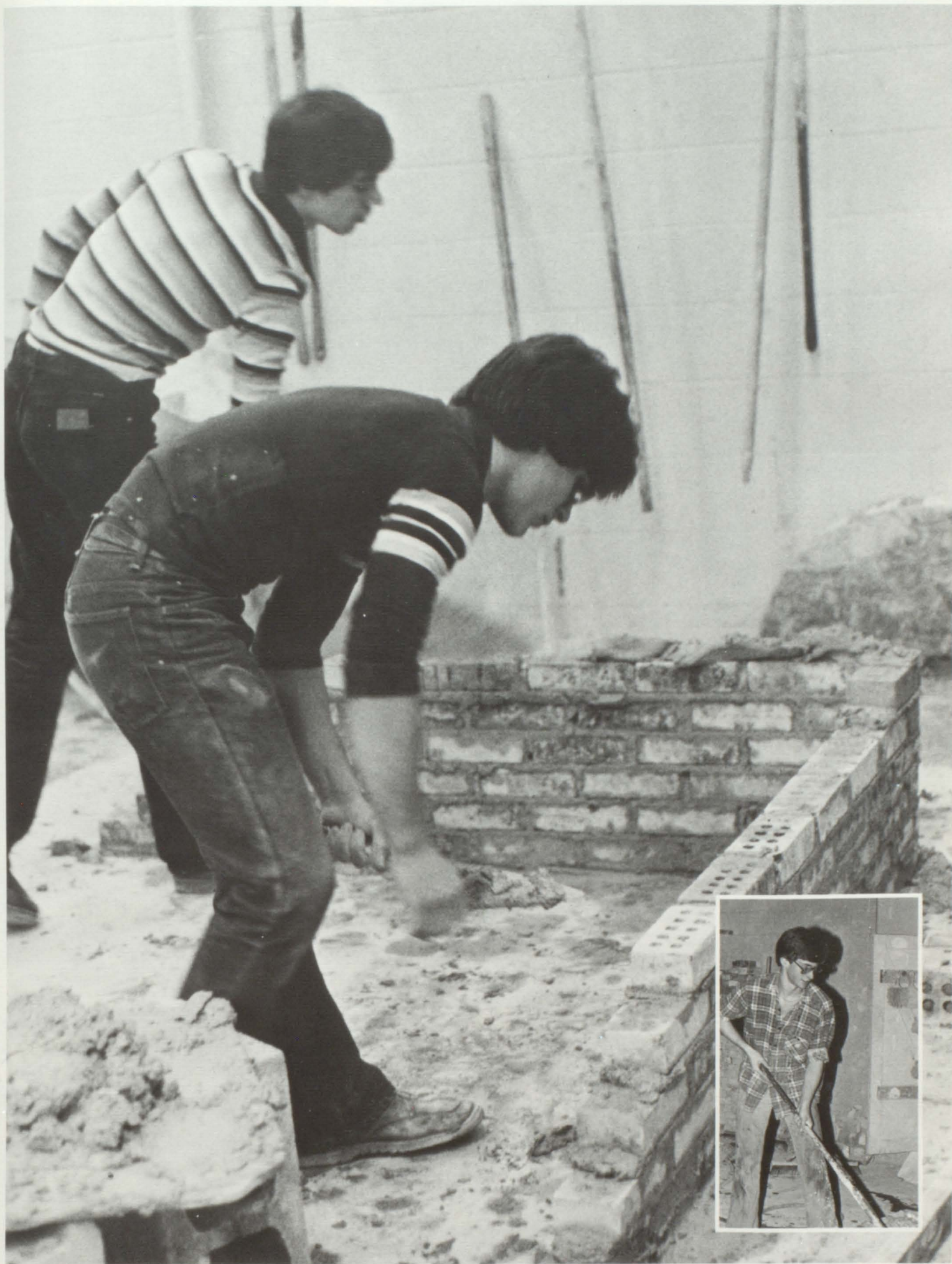

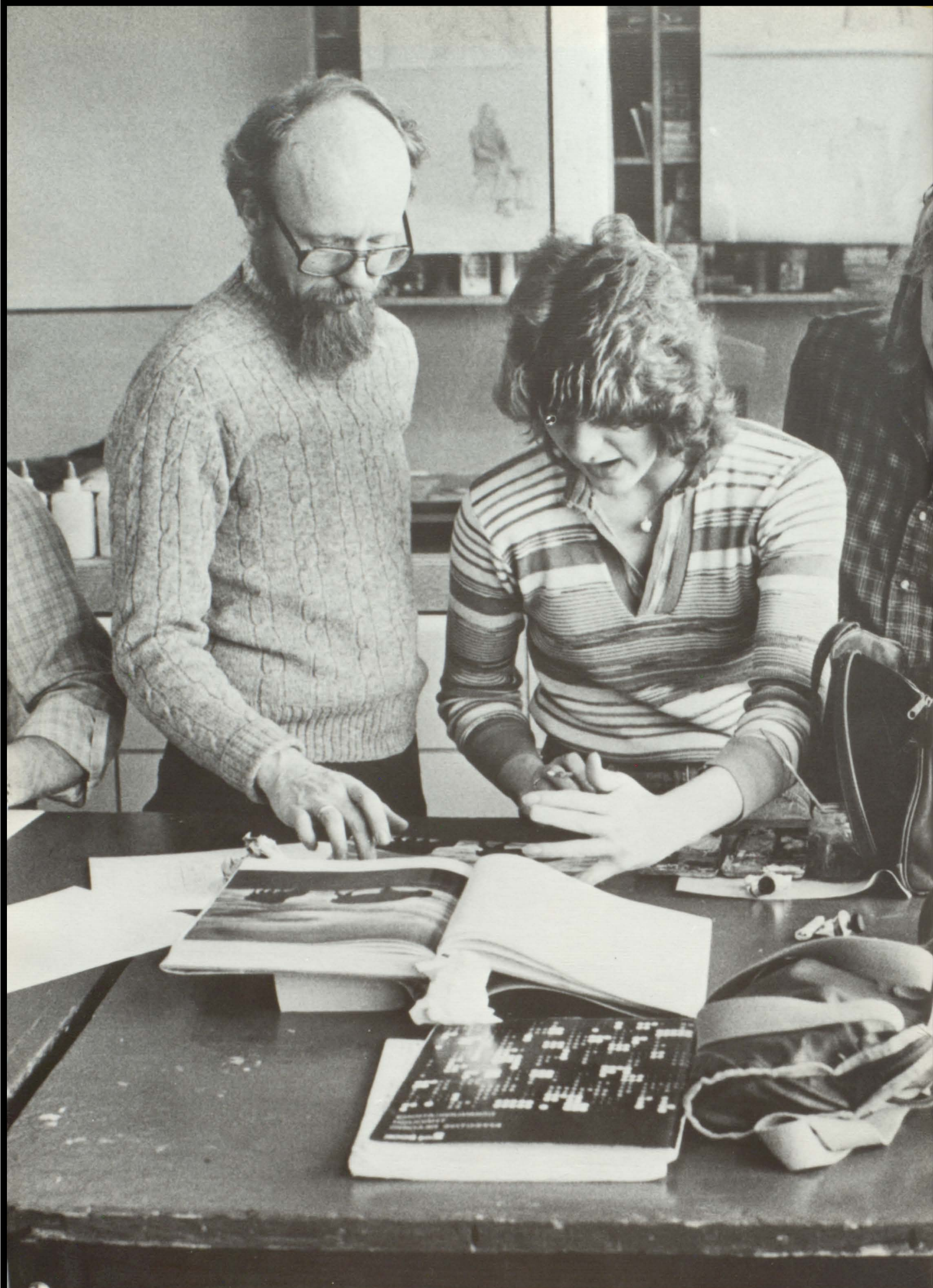

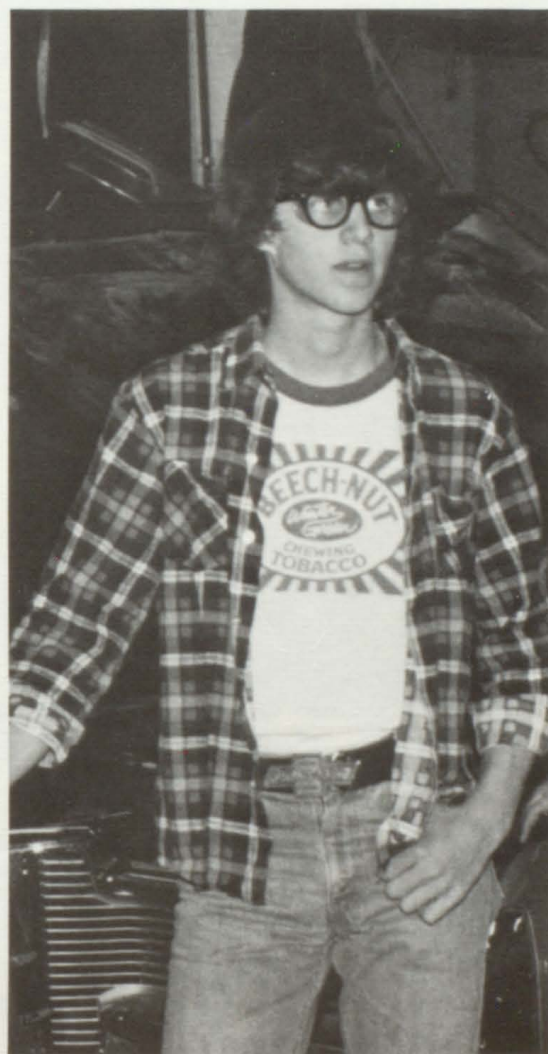

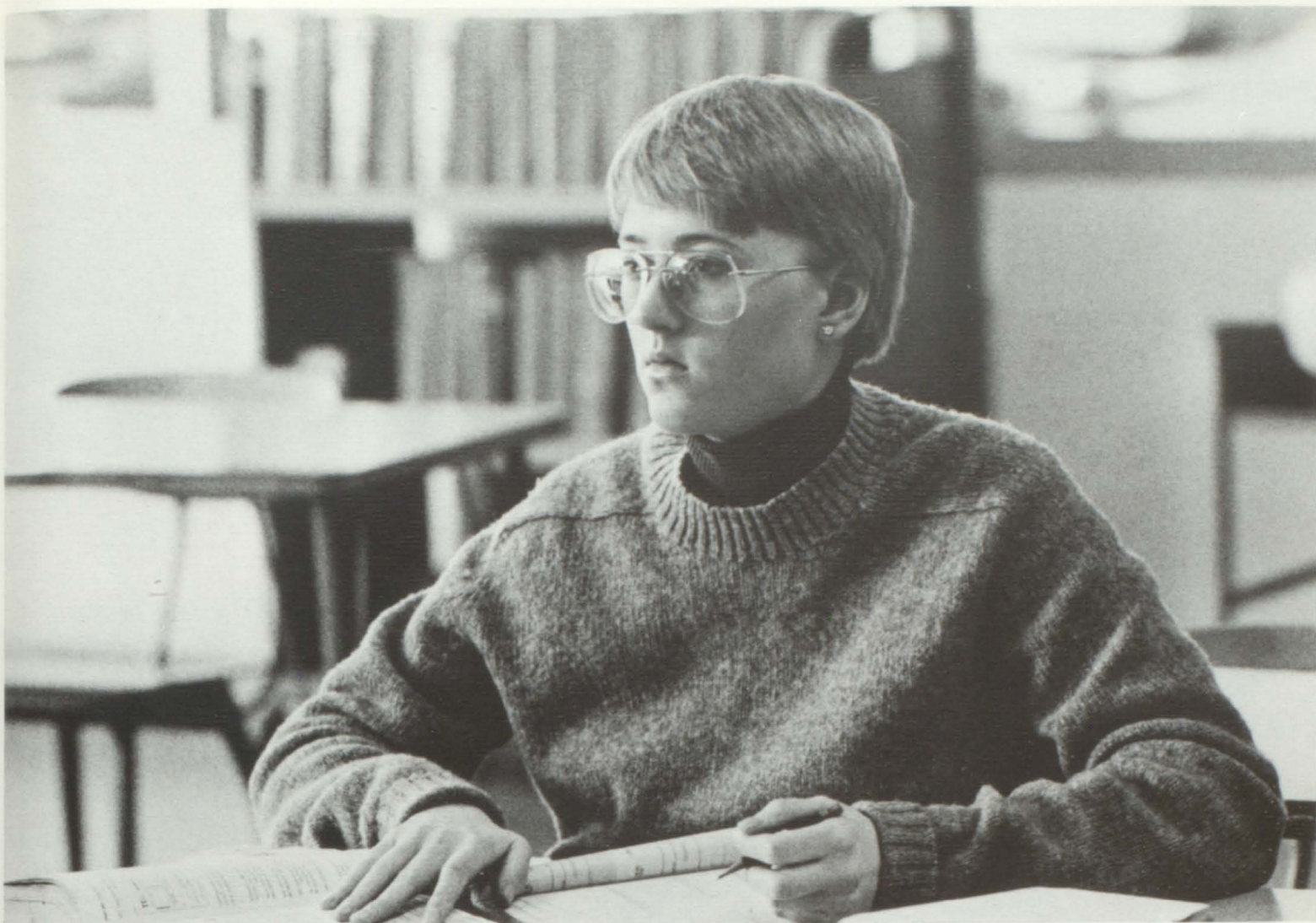

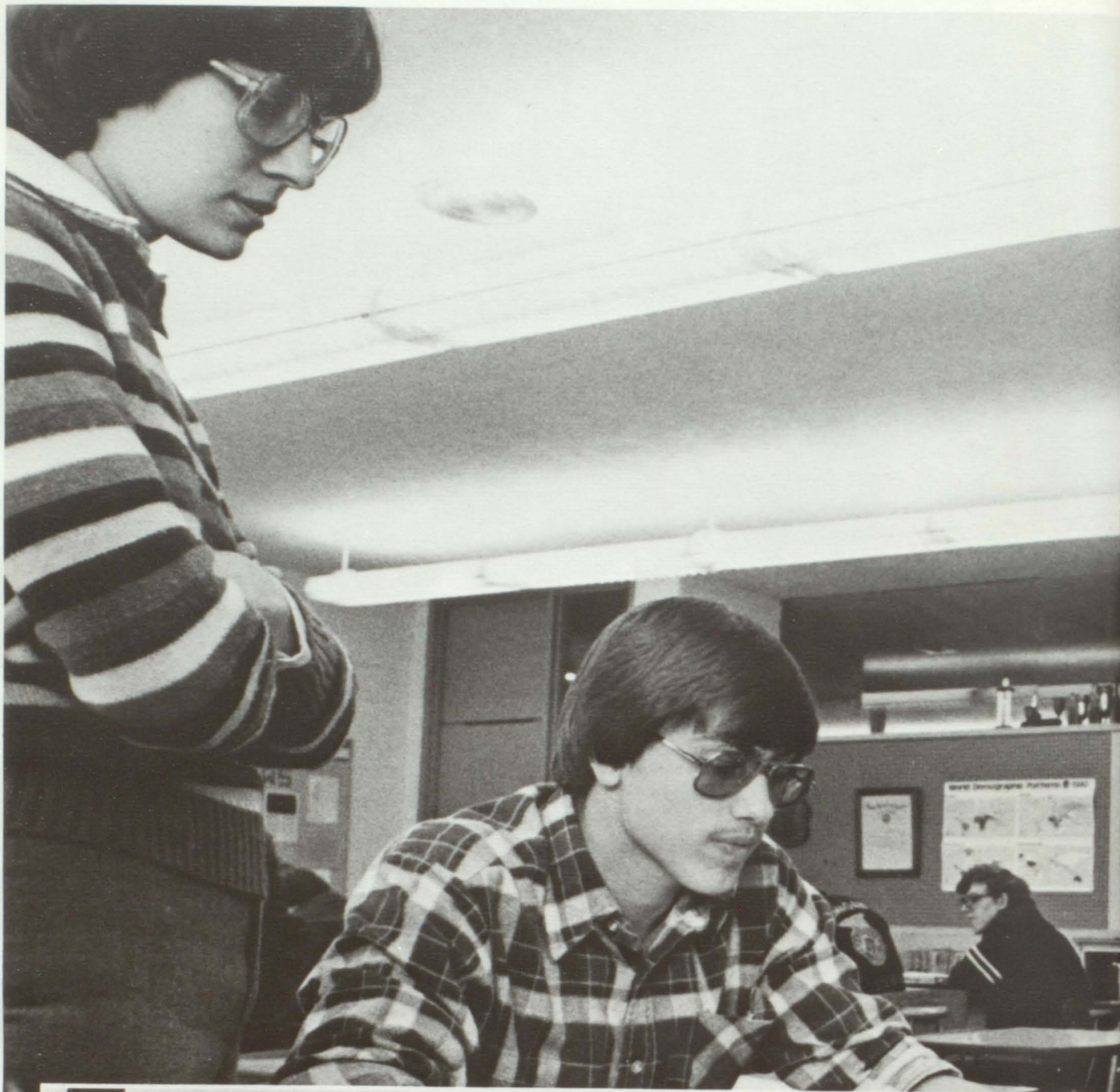

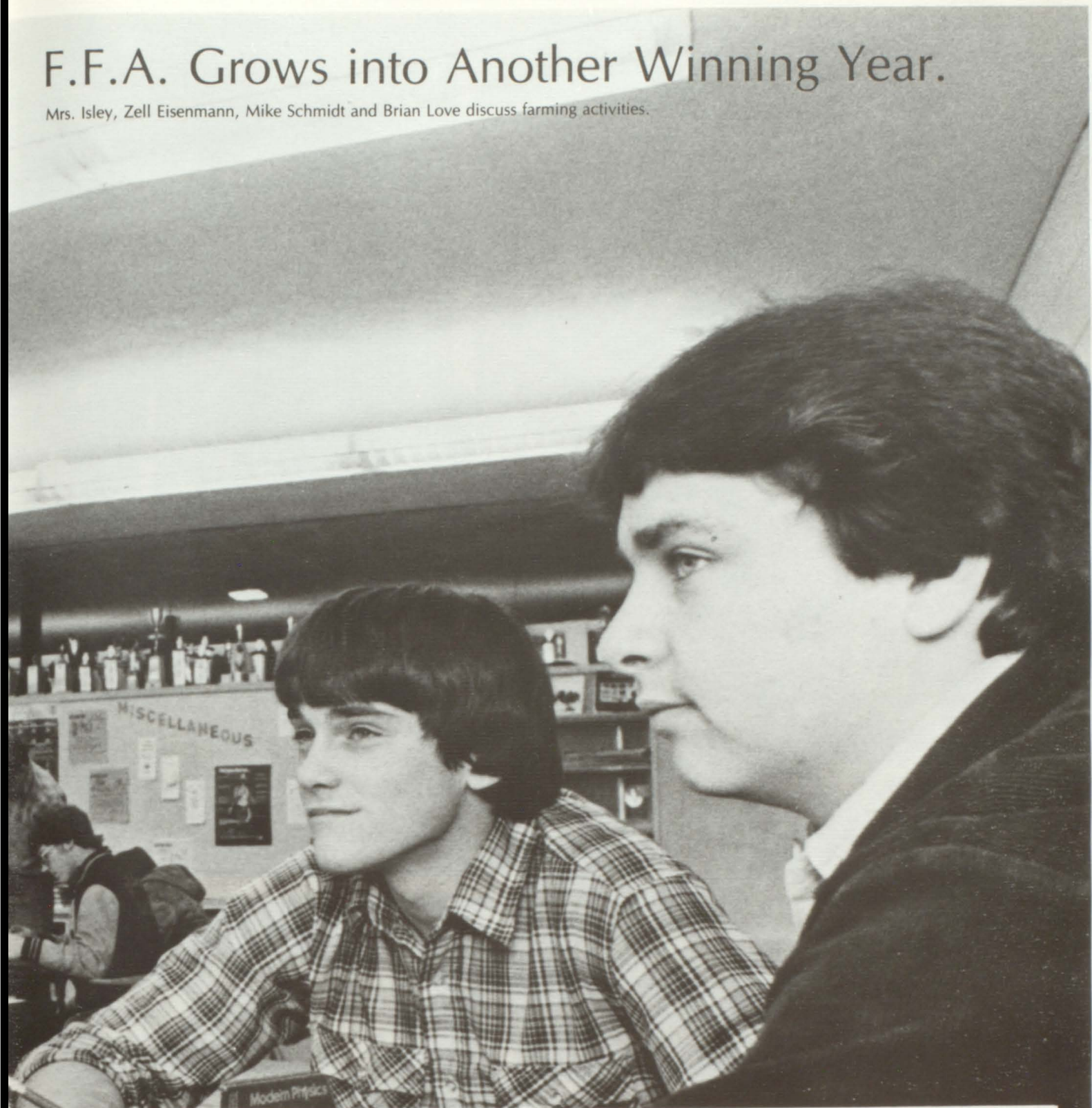

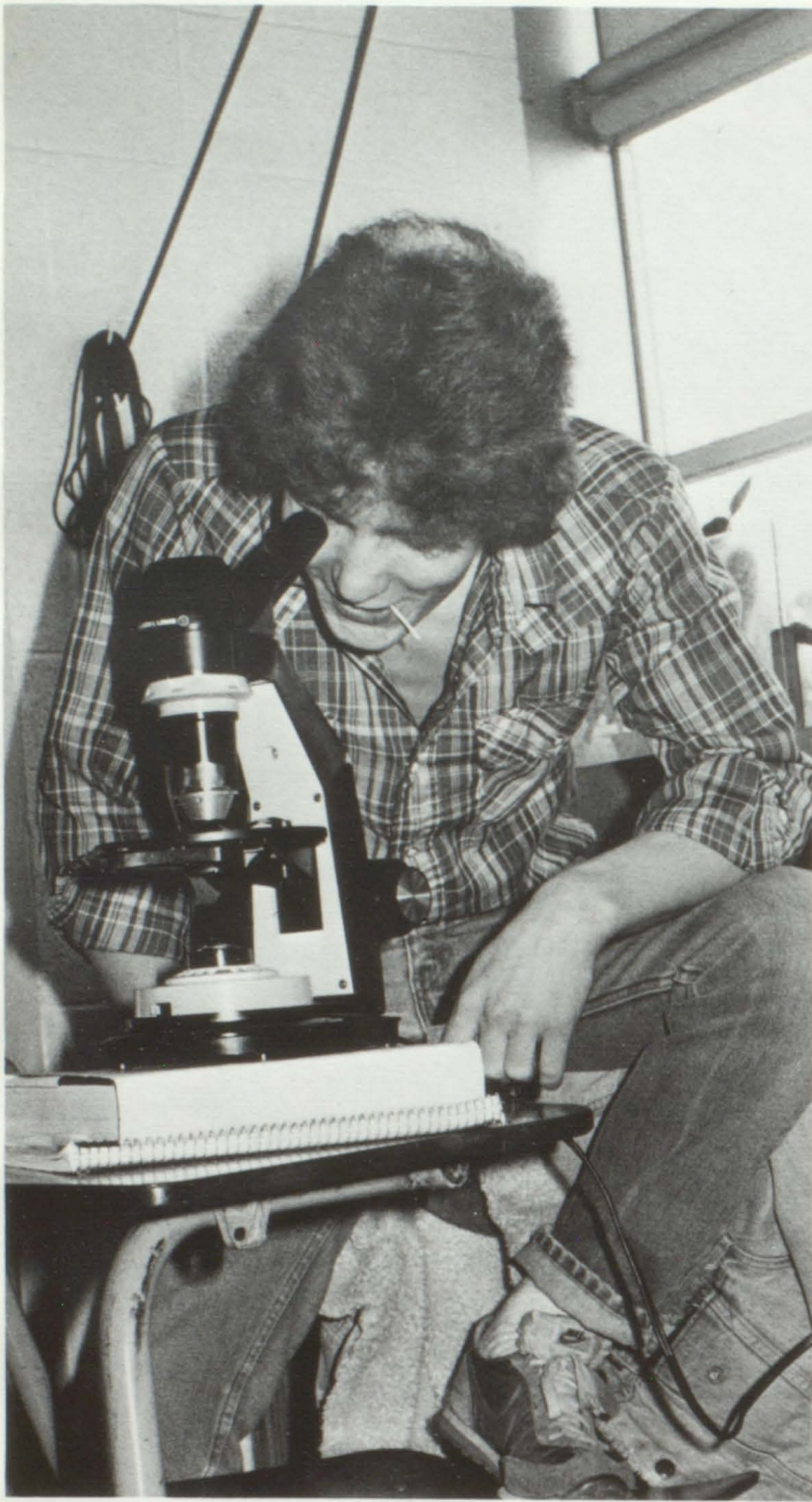

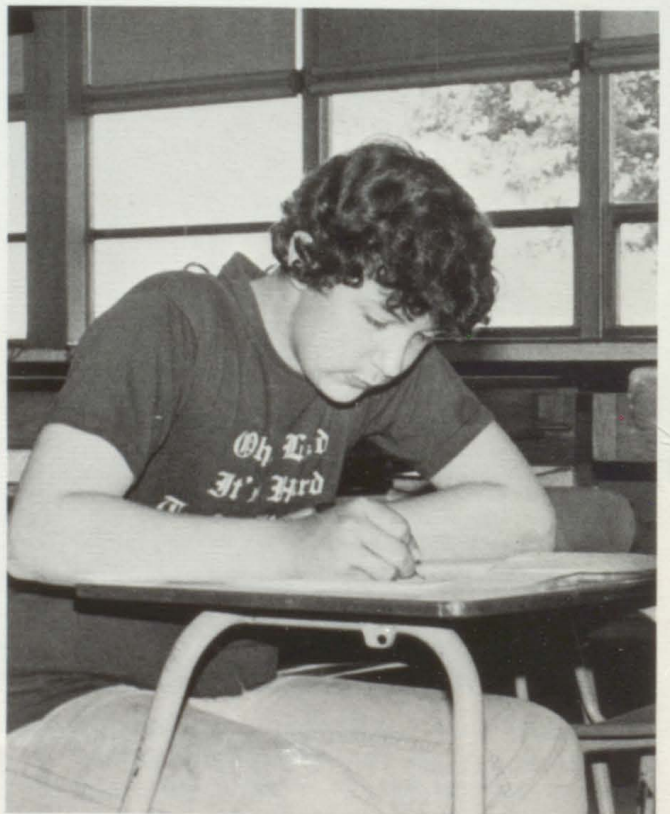

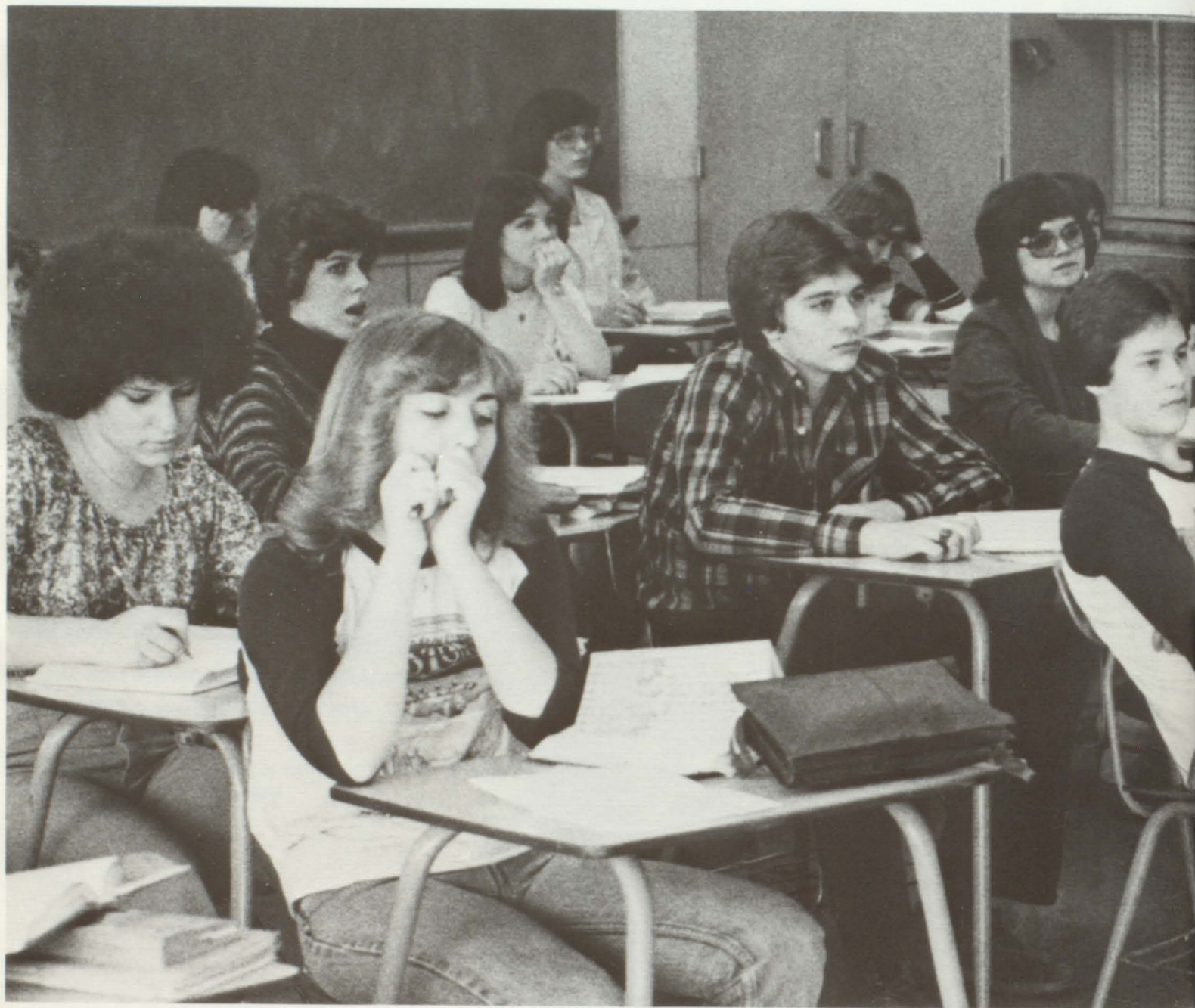

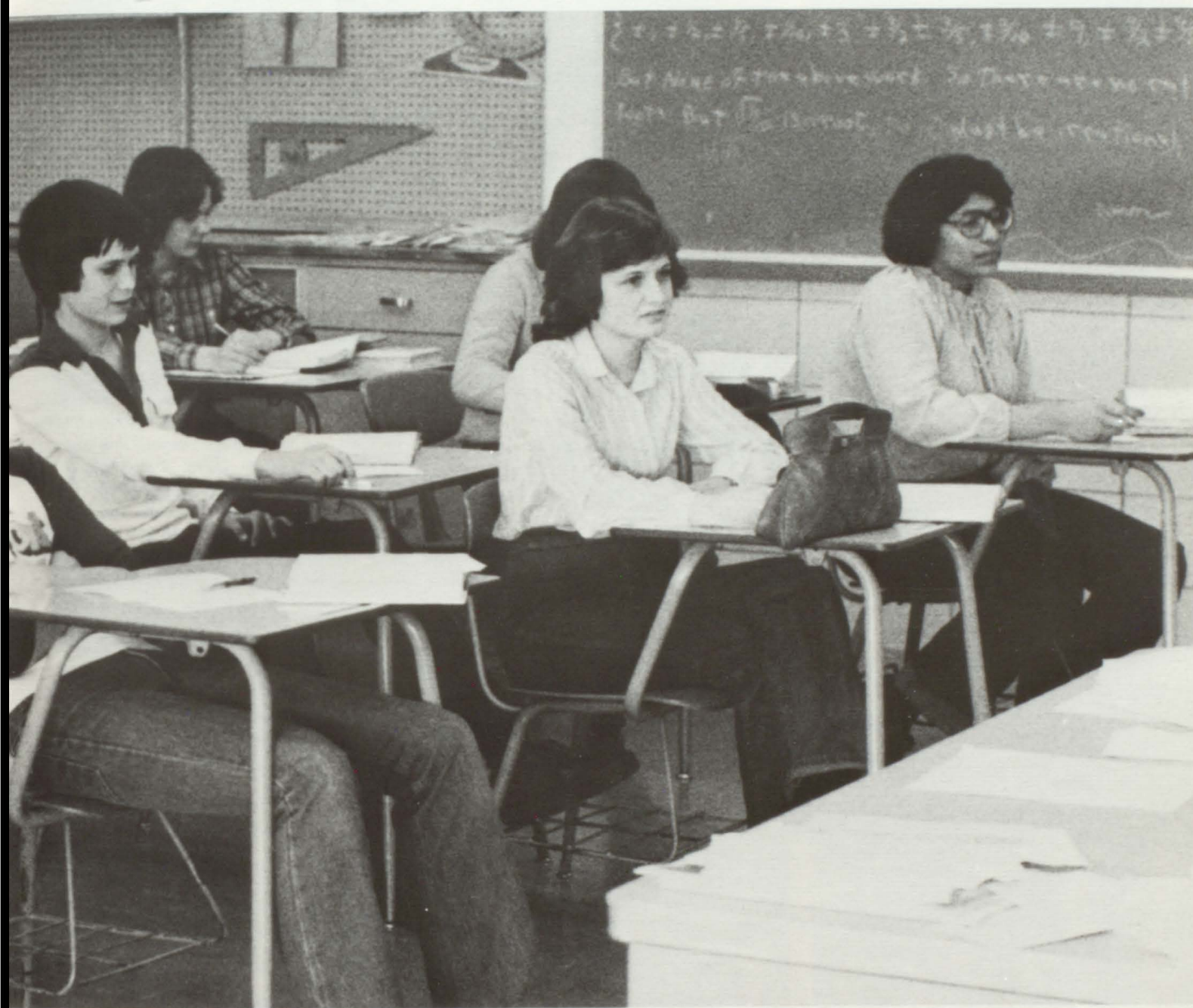

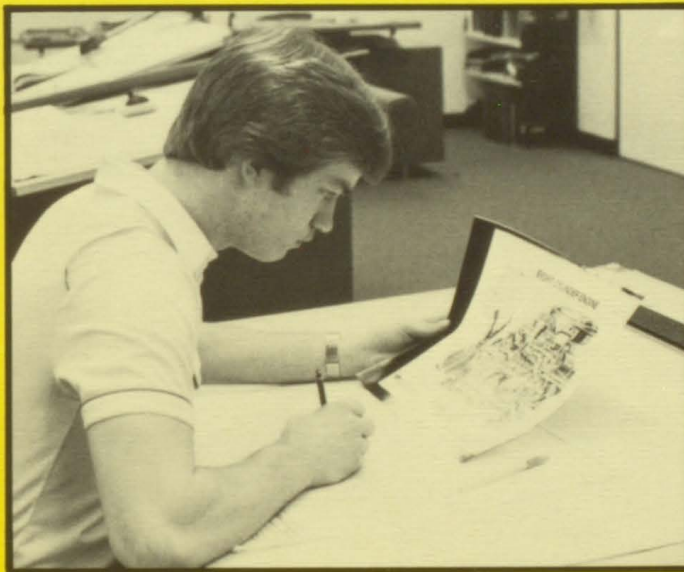

The Freshmen have been very active in fund-raisers for their class. They had the concession stands for the last five basketball games and sponsored the Post Valentines Day dance.

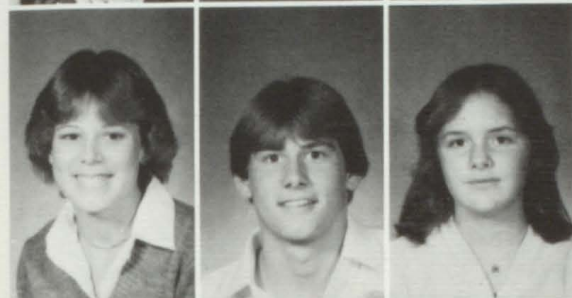

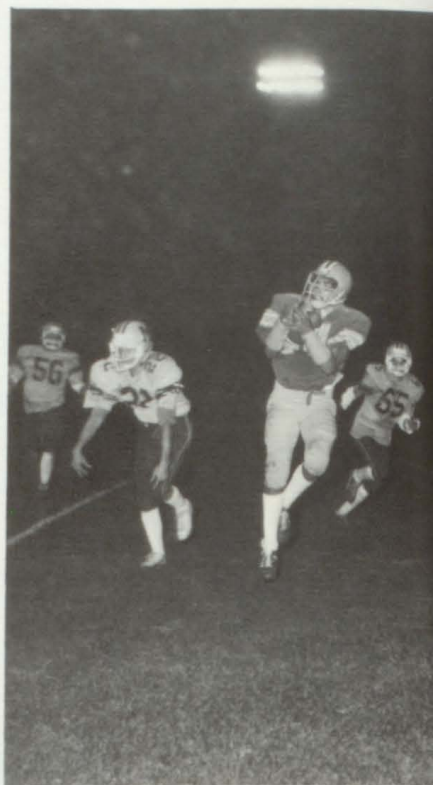
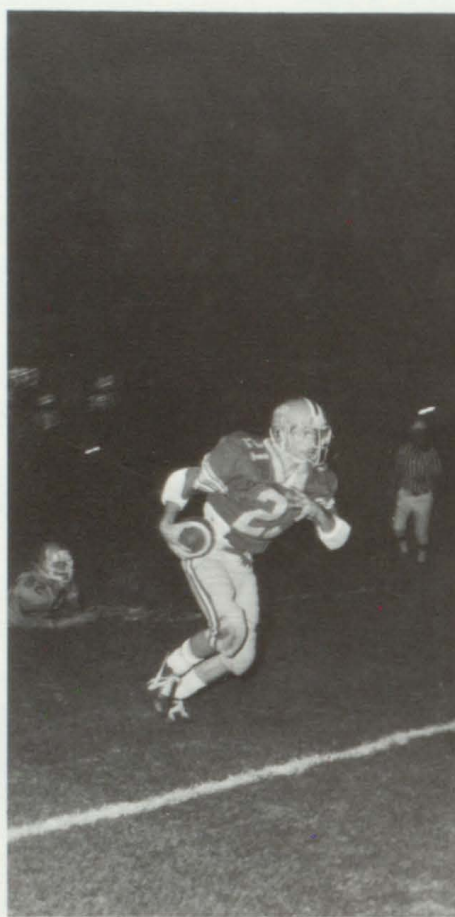

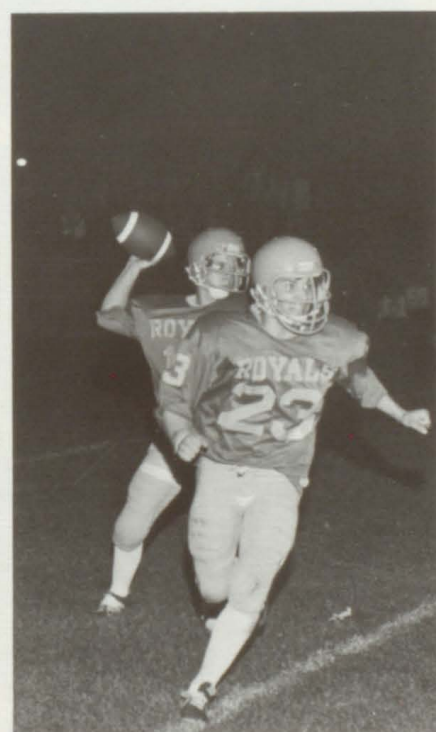

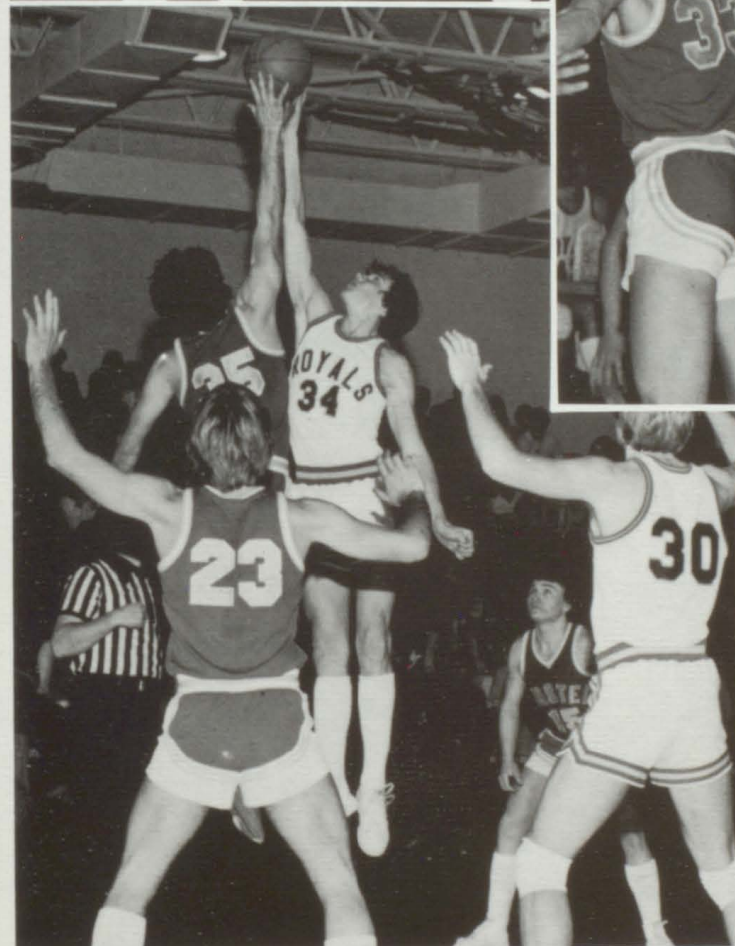
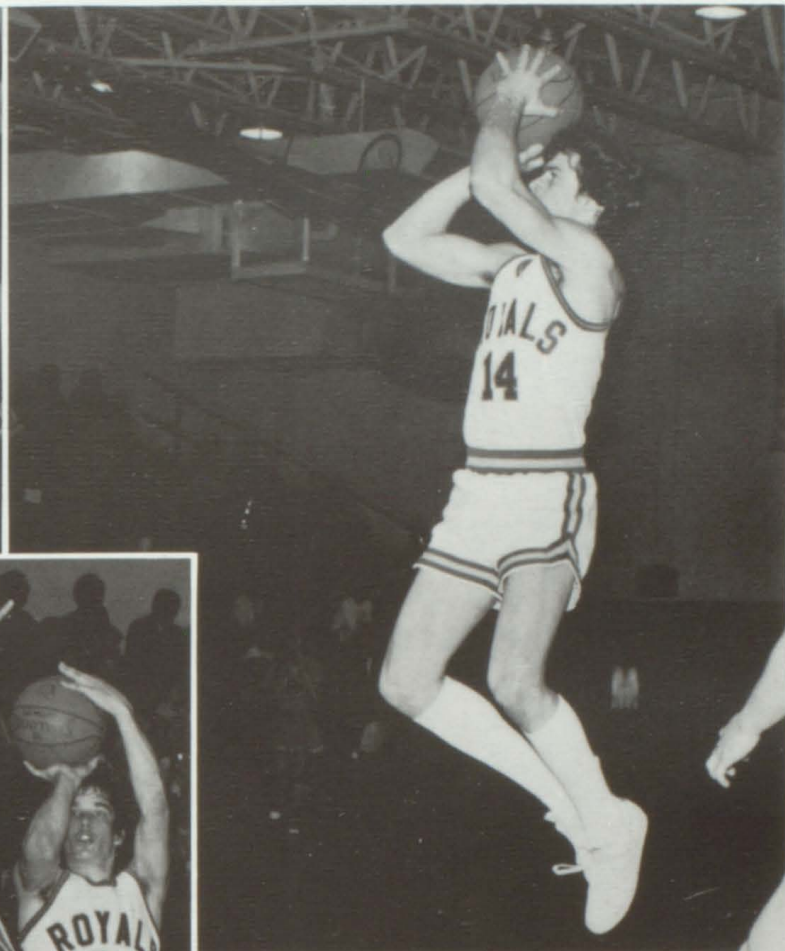

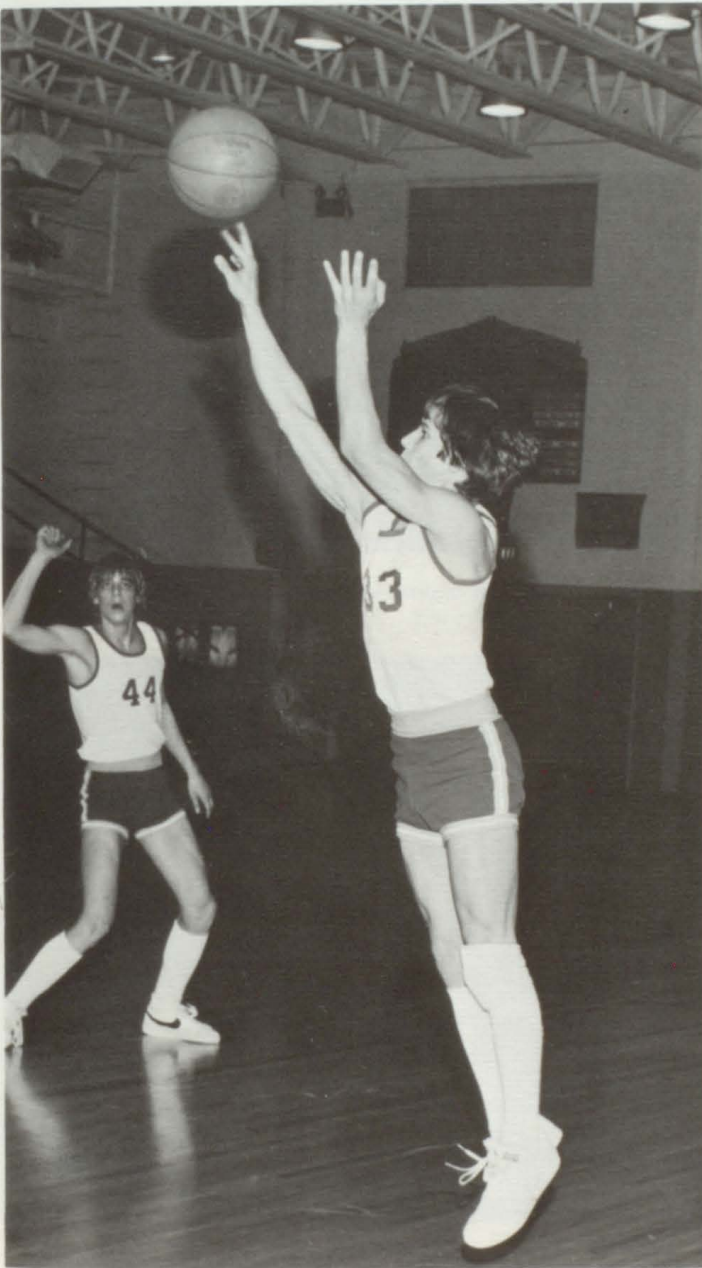

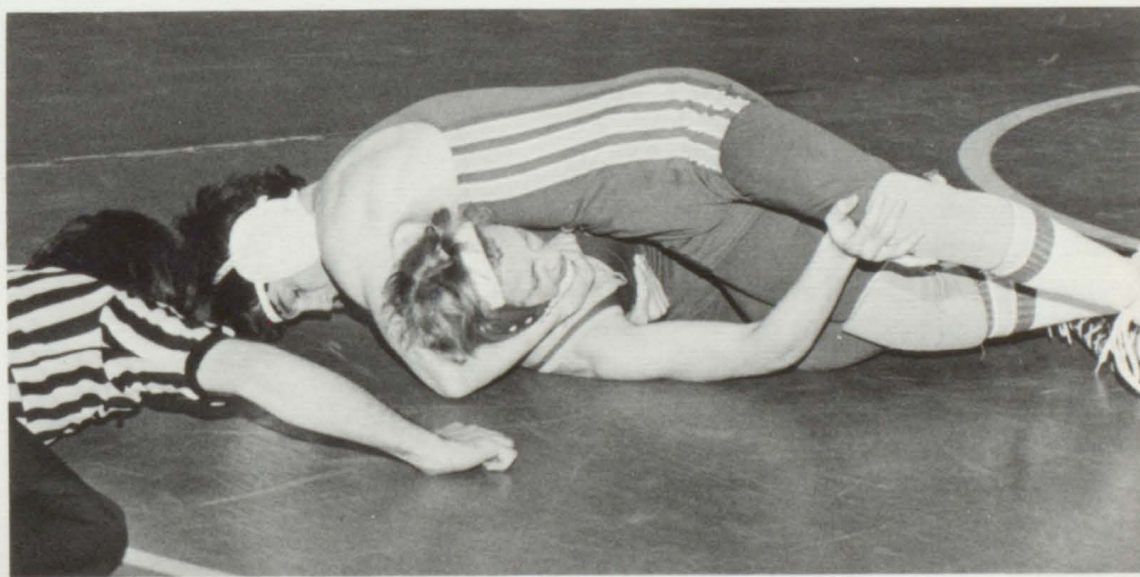

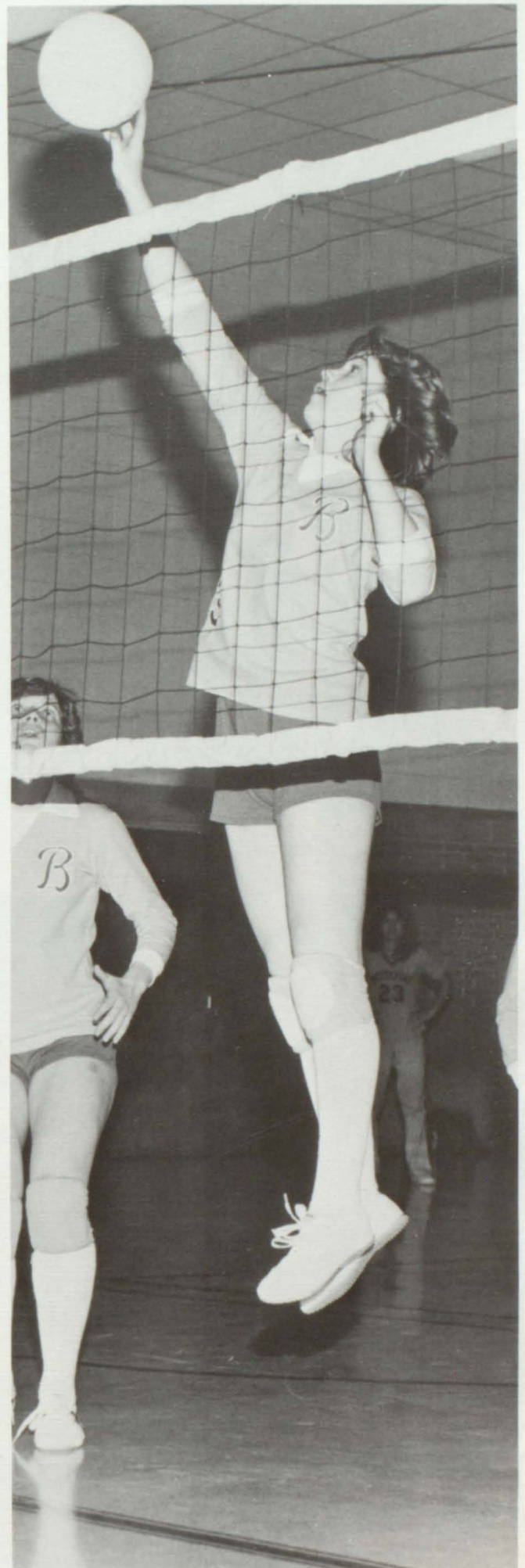

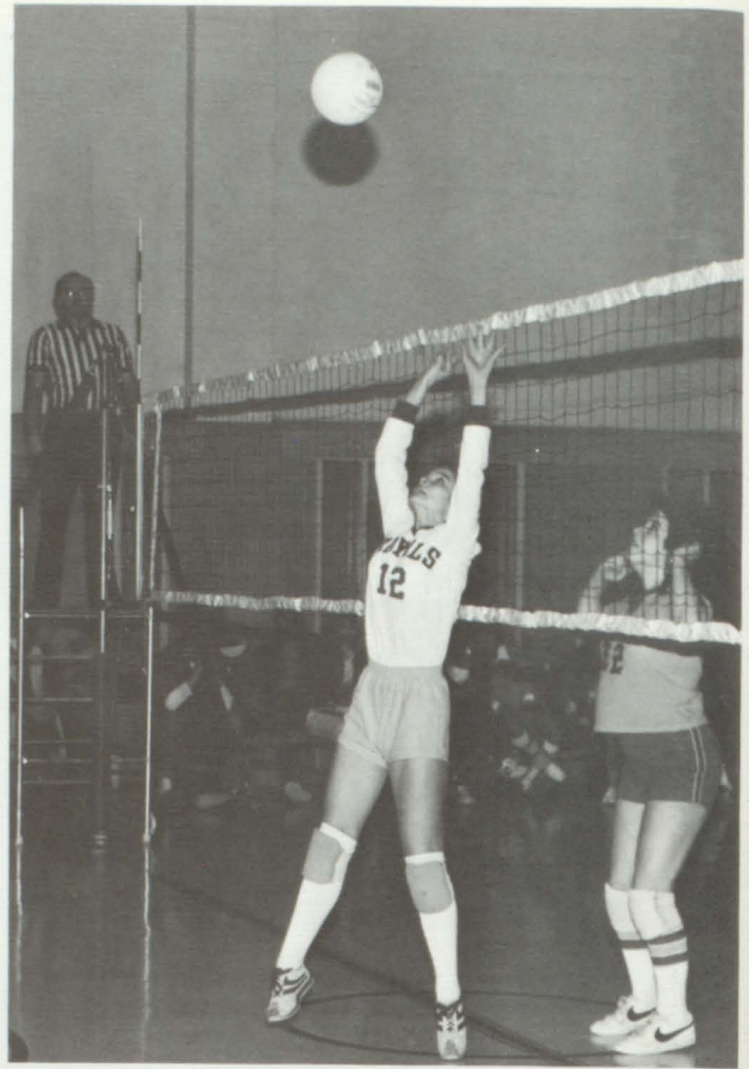
