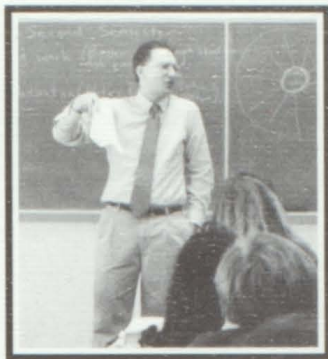
**Just as our world has become more complex, so has education.**

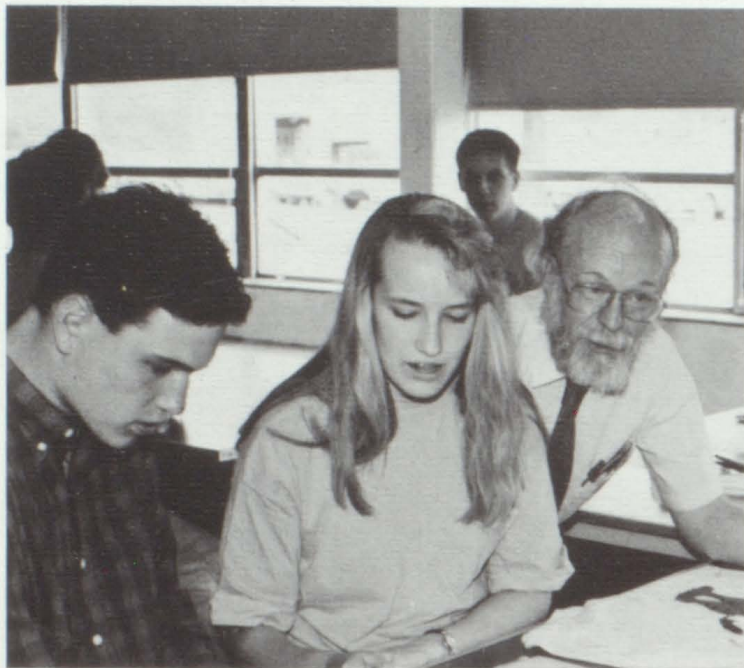

Senior class officers were vice-president Michelle Mowrey, secretary Becky Reaume, treasurer Howie Winkler, and president Alissa Karg.



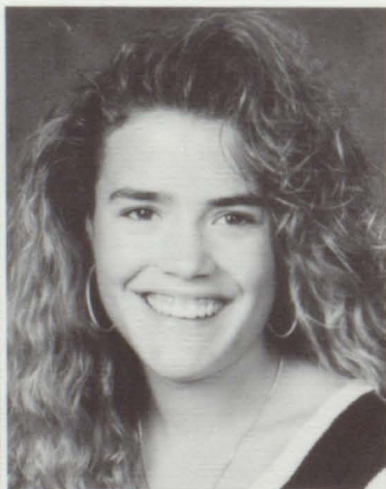

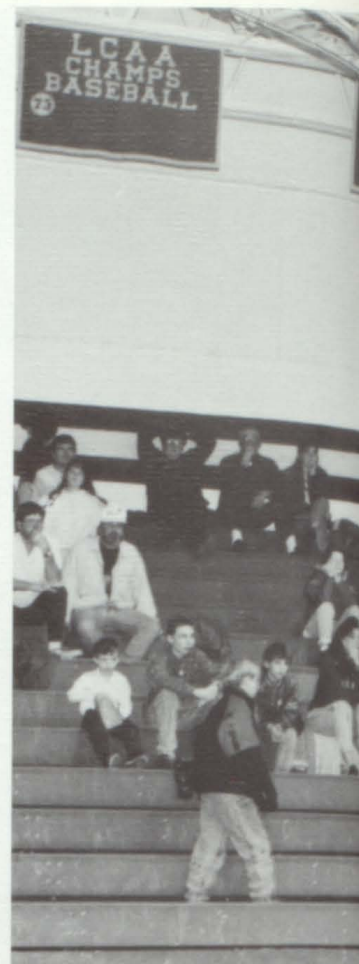


# Cardiac Kids Play a Spectator's Game

*Starting out rough, the royal golfers pull together*

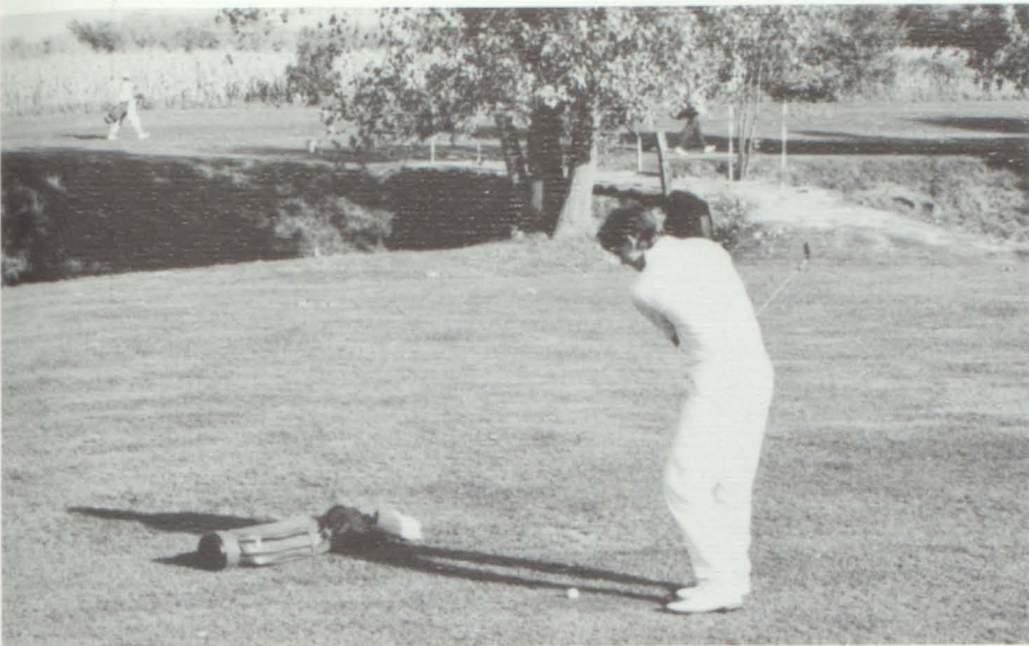

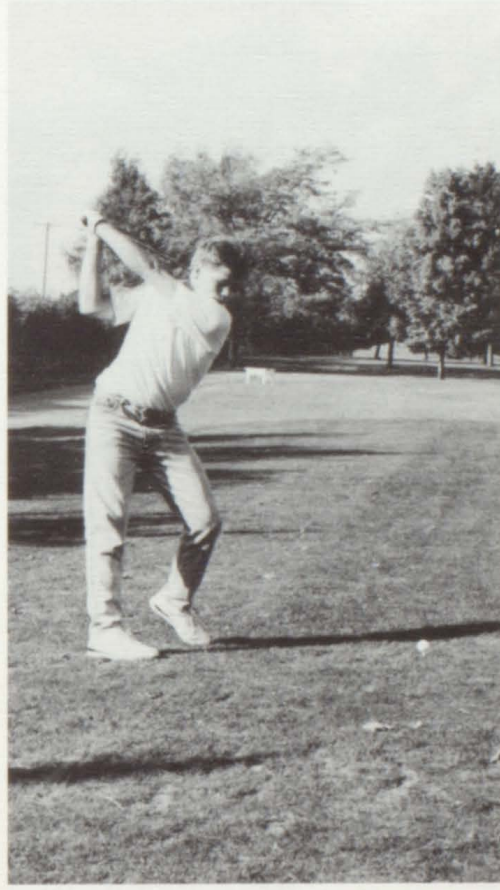

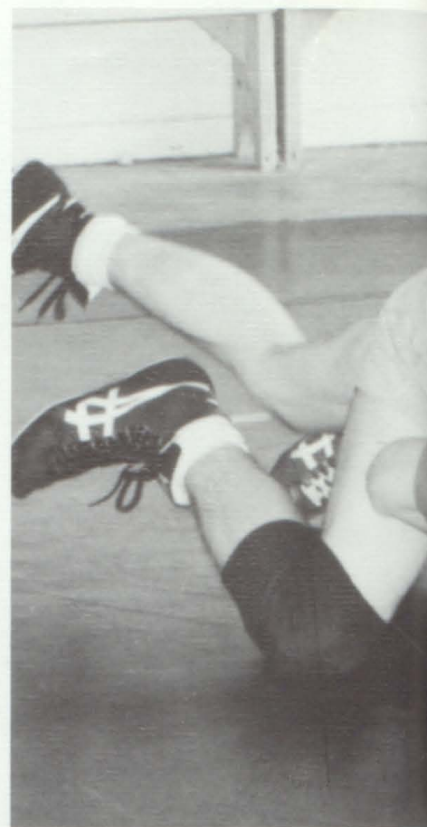

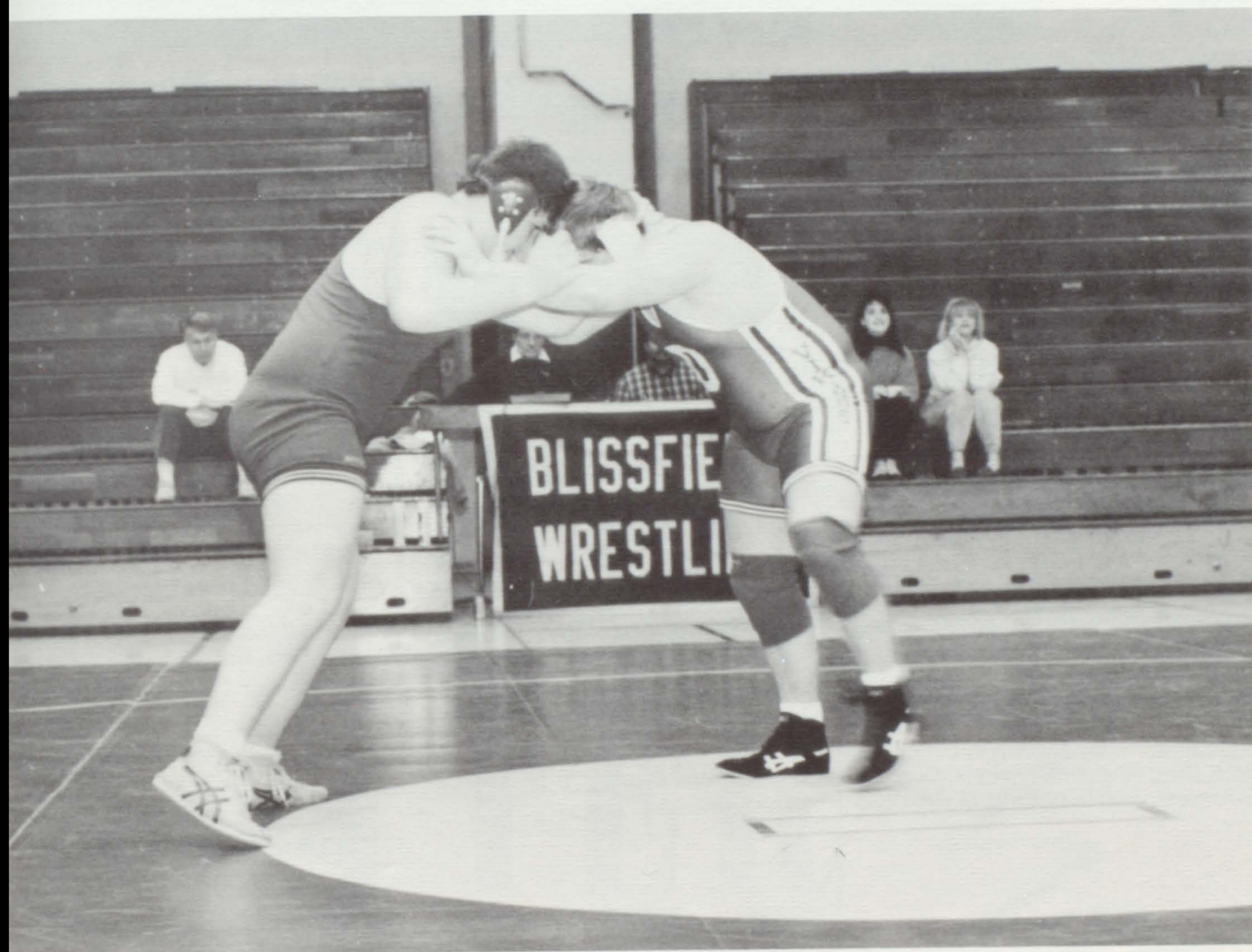

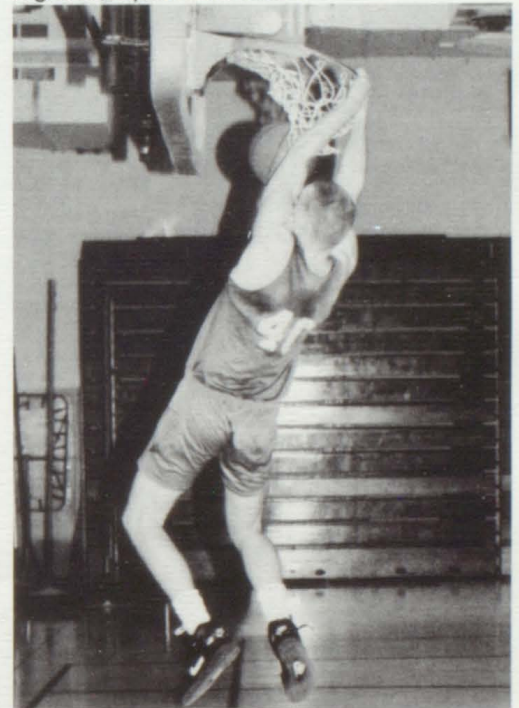


## Back to Back

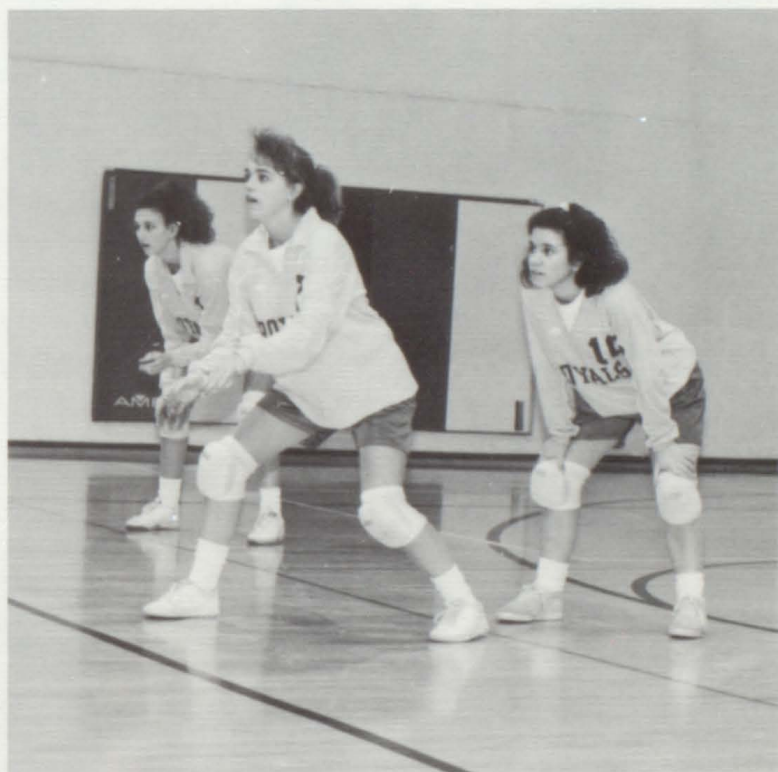
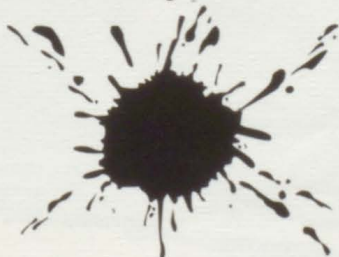

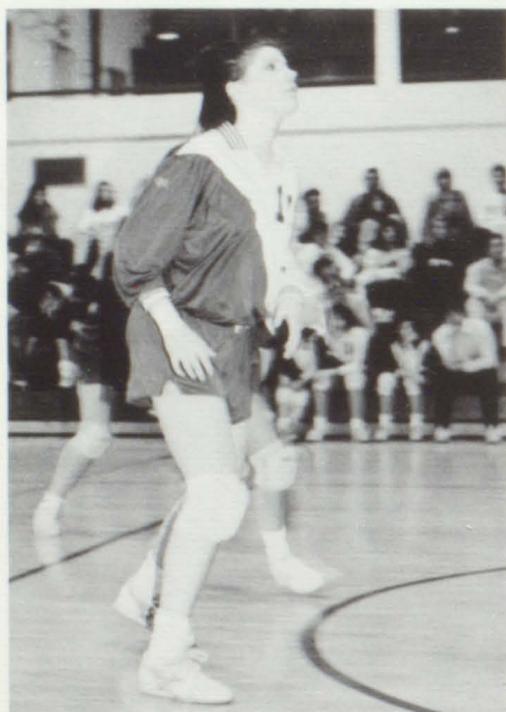

## Despair Forges Unity

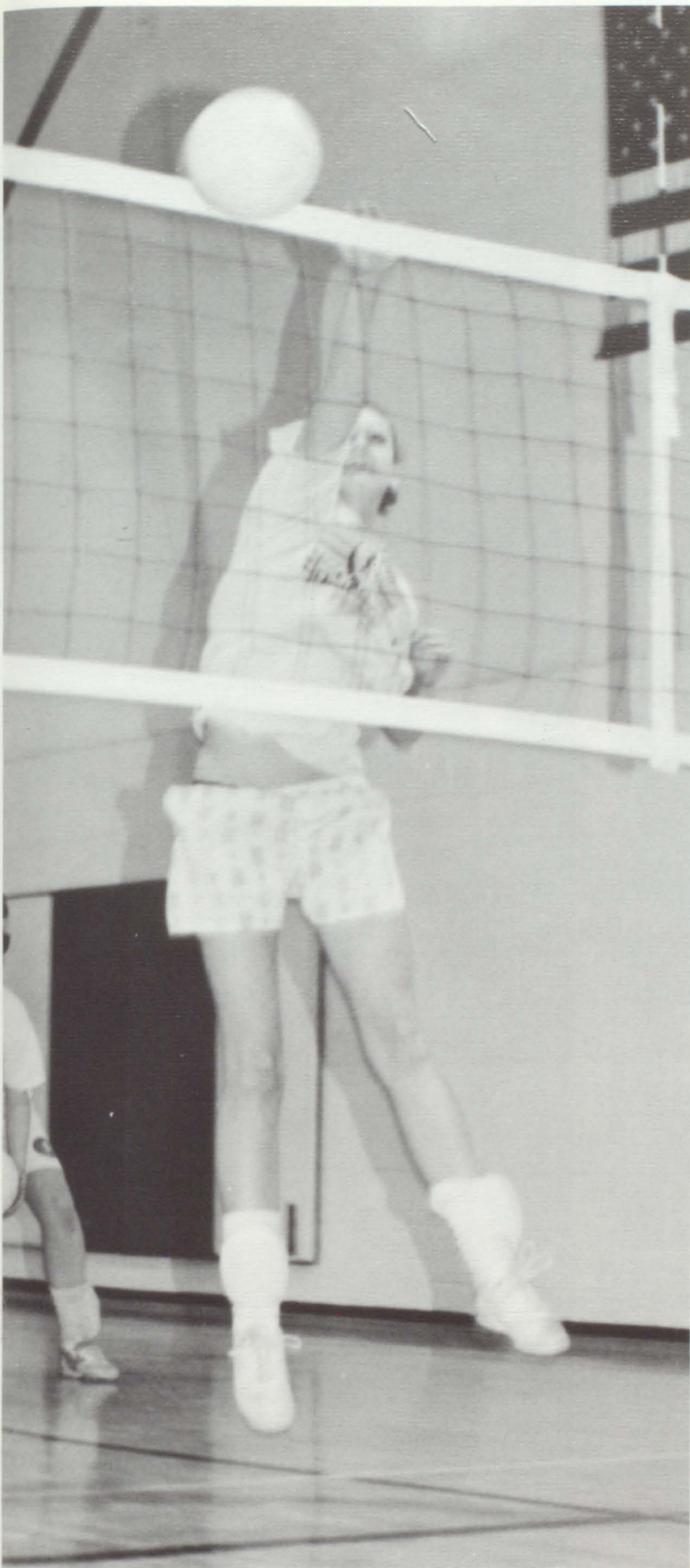

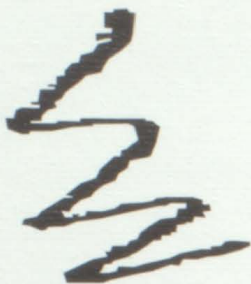

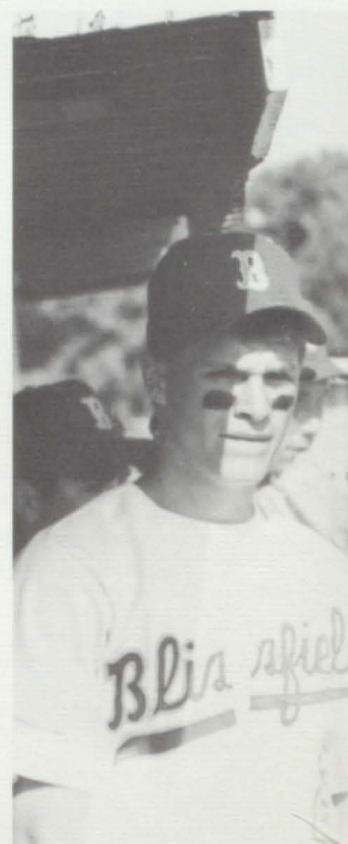

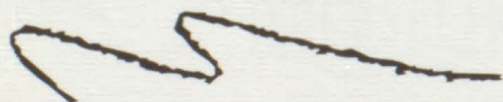

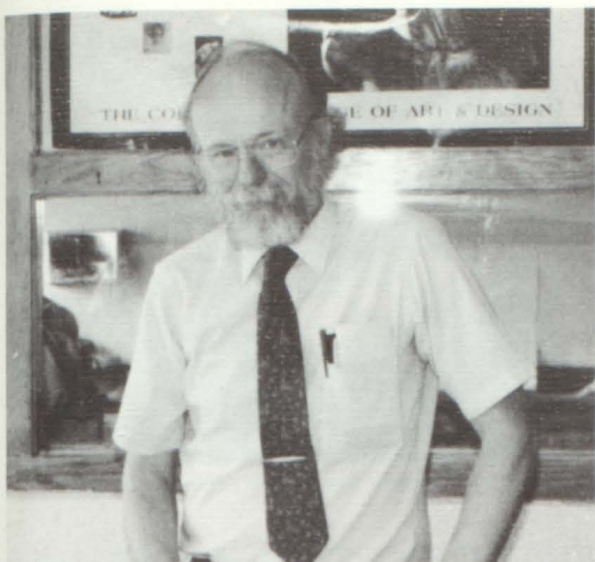
