


who they really are, as well as their true loves. When they find Shirley, the sisters realize that "she" is really a "he", and "he" falls in love with Daphne. Ain't love awful?





#### SKI CLUB

outweighed the occasional bruise. The club went on several outings to Crystal Mountain, Bittersweet Ski Area, and Mount Holly.













to win. The squad gave B.H.S. a brief glimpse of their talents, and look forward to putting it all together next season.






The season began slowly with the team








