













"15 men, 1 team, one goal."

This was the slogan of Blissfield's 1996 men's cross country team. It graced the back of the warm up shirts, and was in every runner's mind each time he stepped to the line. The goal was simple: be the first team in 23 years to qualify for the state meet. Coach Tom Durbin set his men to the feat, running the Royals at tough Ohio invitationals to prepare them for local racing. Though an invitational title eluded them, they never finished lower than six place in the team standings. Duel meets went smoothly, with only one loss going to the Royals. League Jamborees proved to be another story, however, with the team going in to the LCAA meet with a sixth-place standing. Tough running got them a final fifth place. At the Regional meet, the Royals knew what they had to do, and regrouped and focused on the state qualification goal. Many team members ran their individual bests, but the Royals fell short 43 points, finishing sixth. 1996 MVP Kyle VanSchovck was an individual qualifier to the state meet. Finishing with a 9-1 record, the team completed a season that went far beyond the expectations of many, but surprised few.





This year's basketball team brought Blissfield back to the standard of play which fans are used to. Using a balanced attack, and having five players averaging double figures at points in the season, the Royals were nearly impossible to defend. Led by the one-two punch of co-captains Kyle VanSchovck and Neil Terry, the team was very efficient on offense and rolled through the regular season with a 15-5 record. When the curtain closed, the Royals sat atop the LCAA standings at 11-1, clinching the league championship at Onsted in an exciting game.

The Districts' opening round would be a test, as Blissfield looked to avenge an earlier loss to Morenci. The team responded ferociously and blew out the Bulldogs, advancing to the finals. In the finals, the Hudson Tigers proved to be a worthy advisary, matching Blissfield stride for stride into overtime. Hudson managed an early lead, but Jason Bradshaw sunk a three-pointer at the buzzer to win it.

The District crown was sweet. The team played valiantly against defending state champ St. Martin de Porres, but an early 18 point defecit was insurmountable, as they could never completely overcome the quickness and athleticism of de Porres.


























Parent's Day






She received a "1," which is the highest a contestant can receive. That rating also qualified Erin to go on to compete at the state level.




"It's a marshmallow world in the winter..." Choir students sing old and new Christmas favorites at the winter concert.


