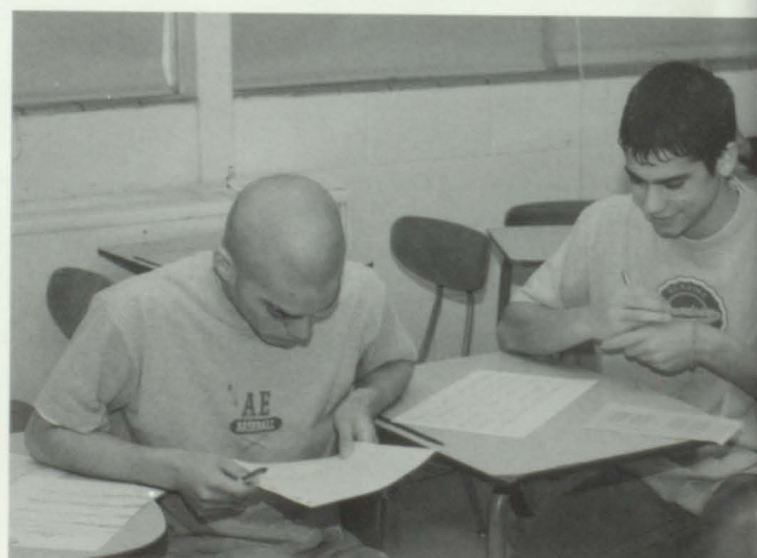

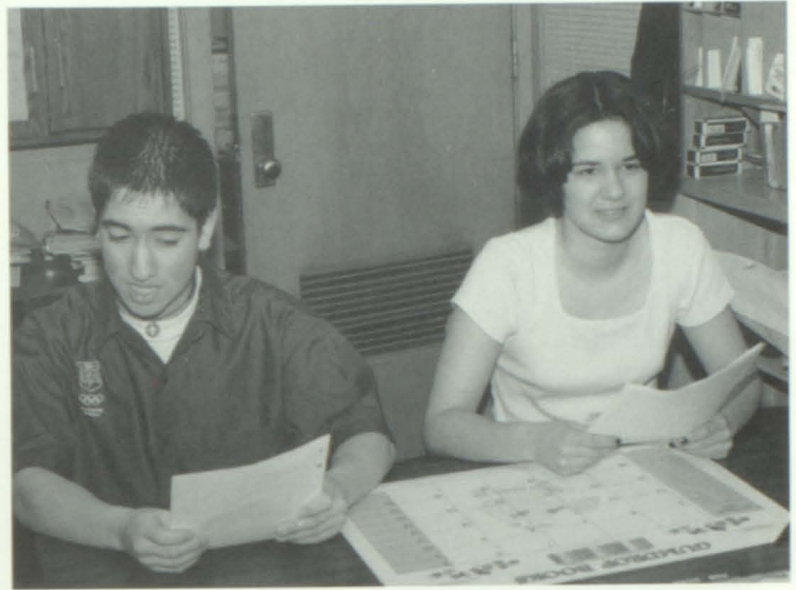

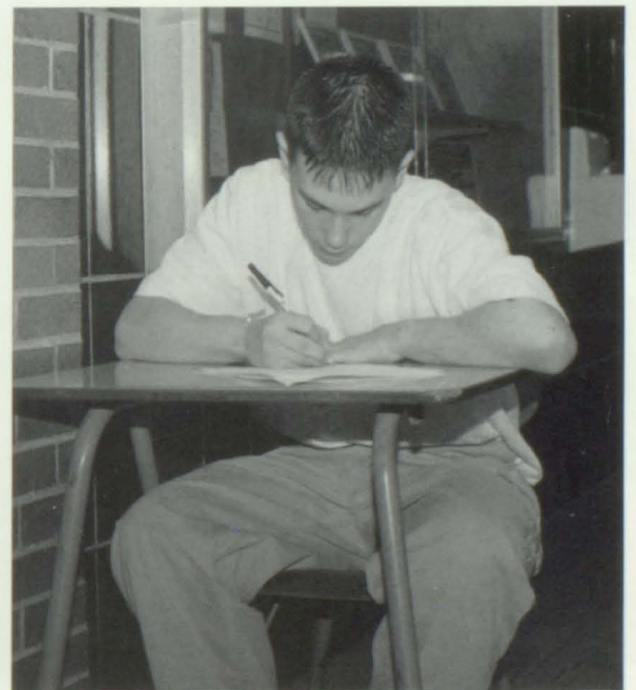
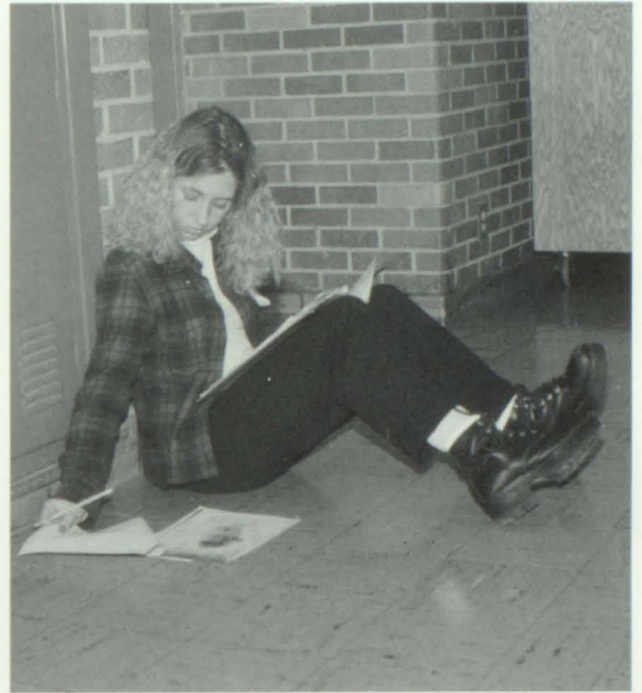

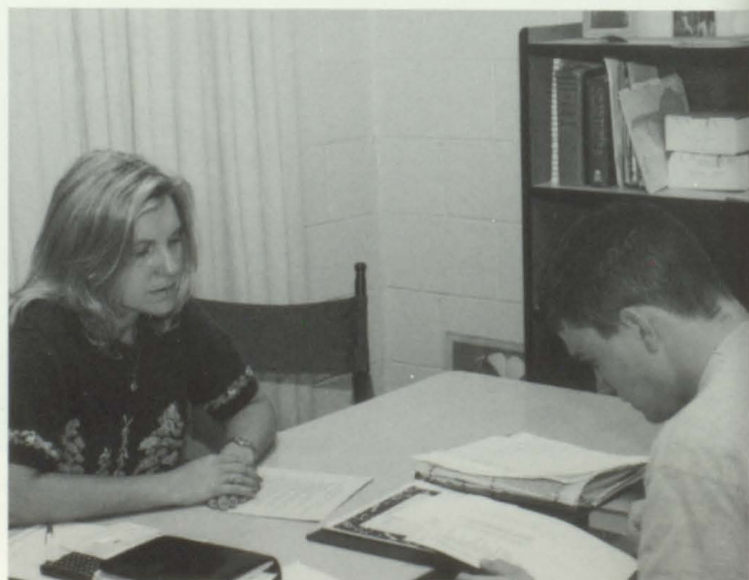

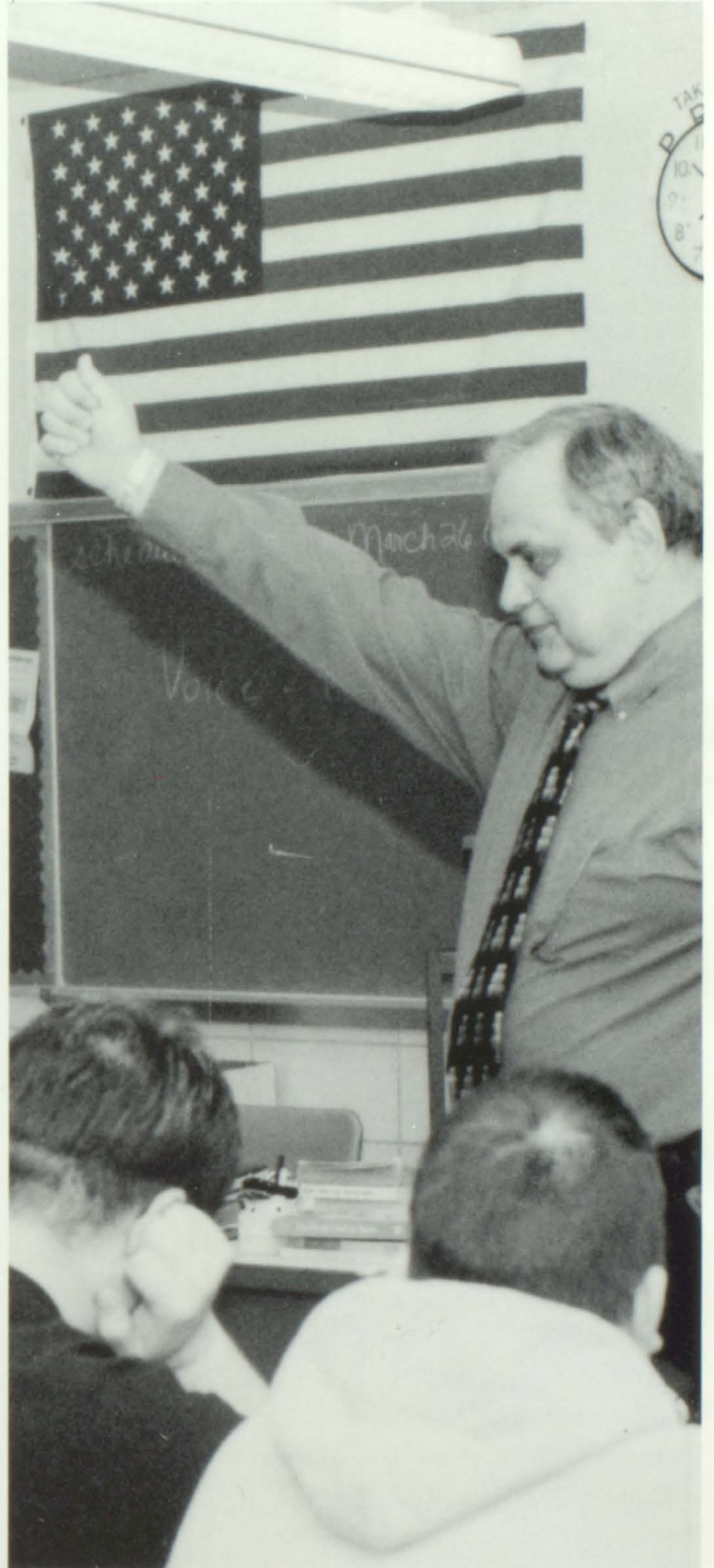

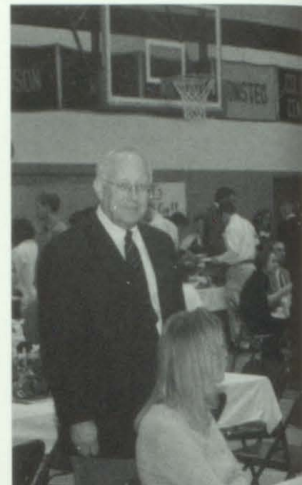

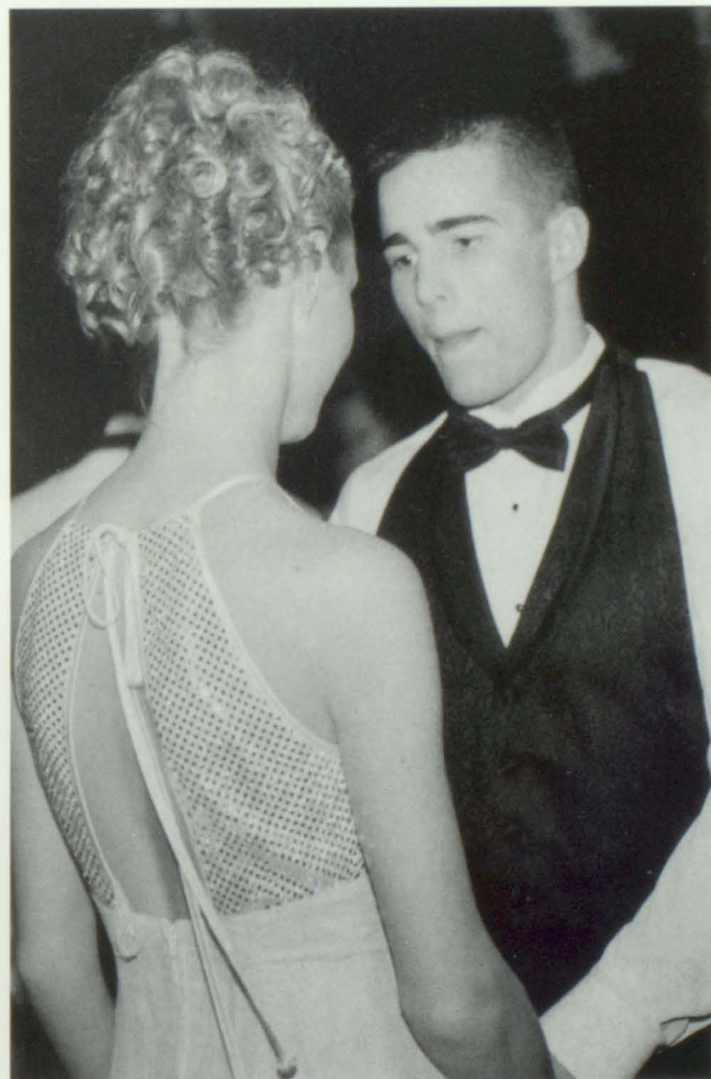

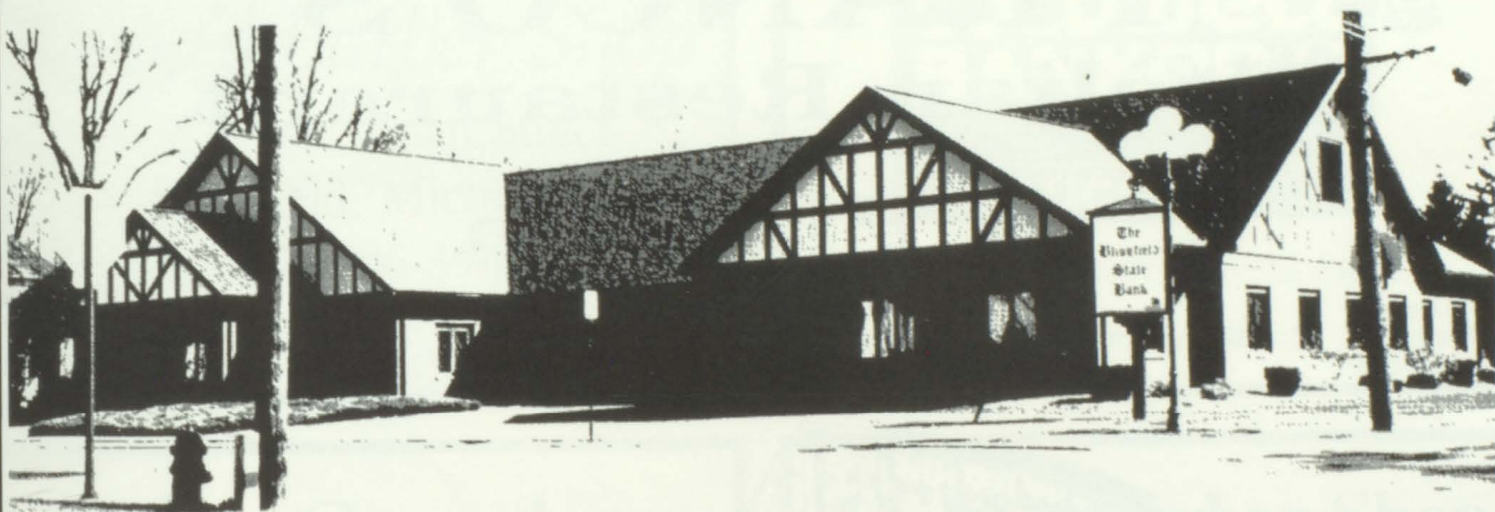

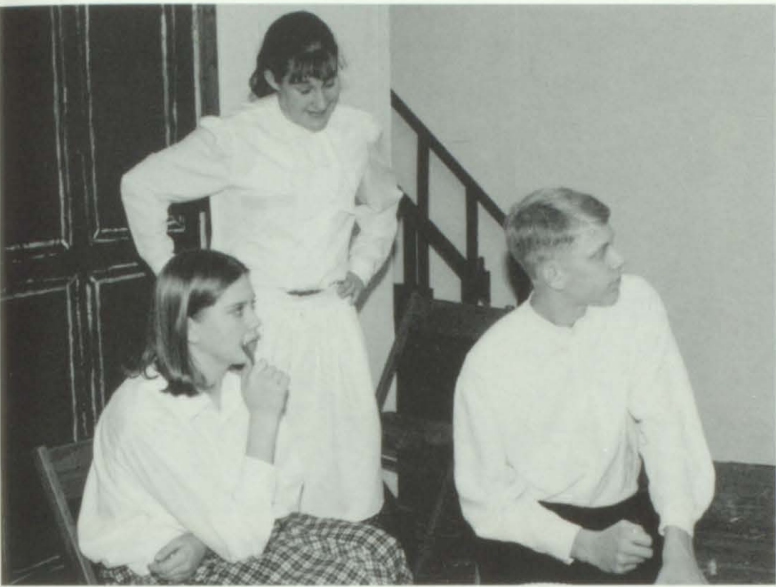

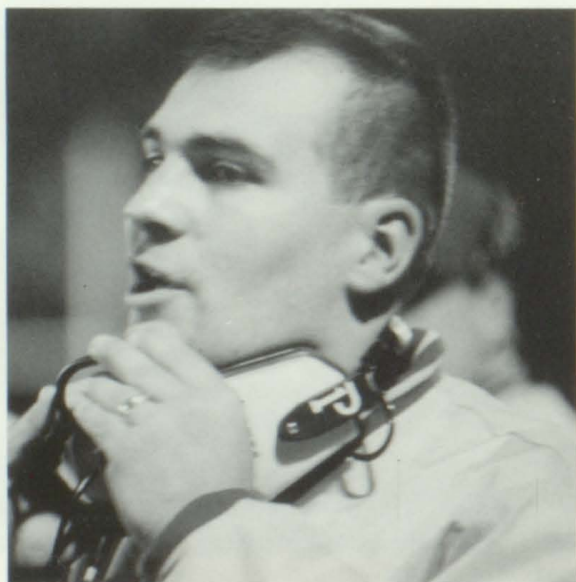

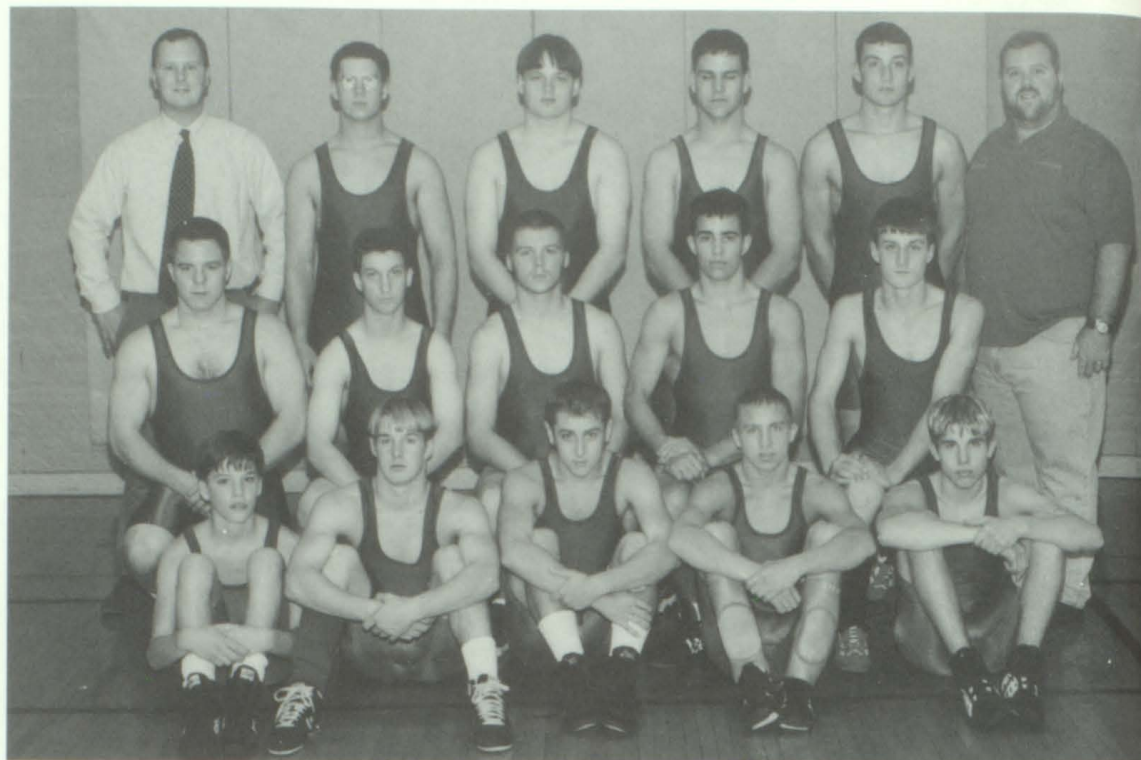

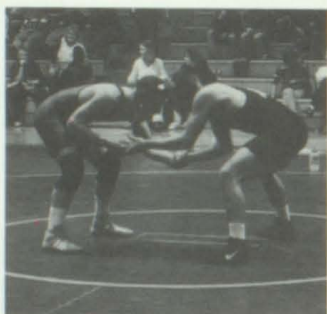

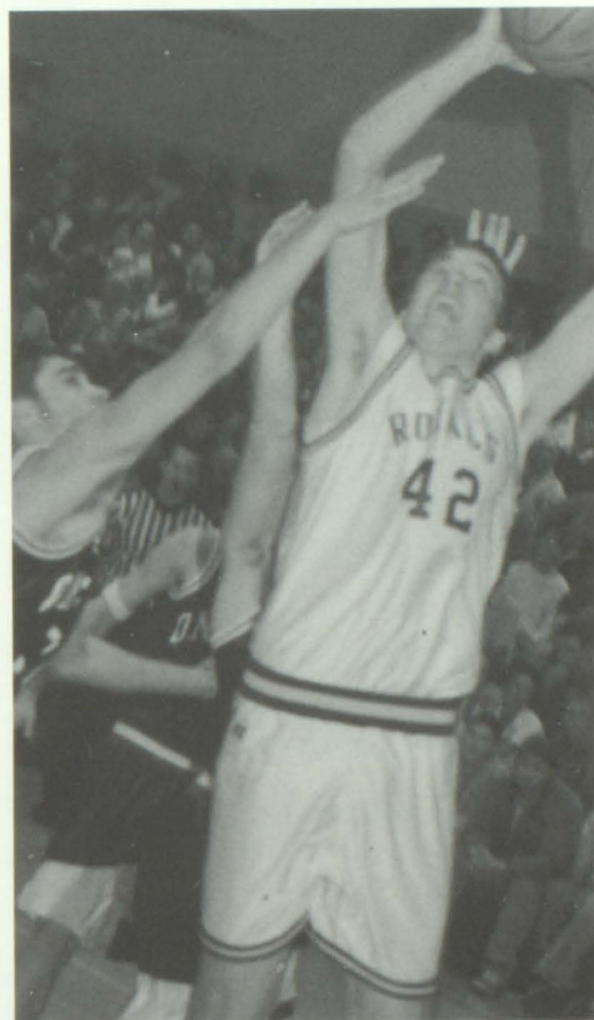

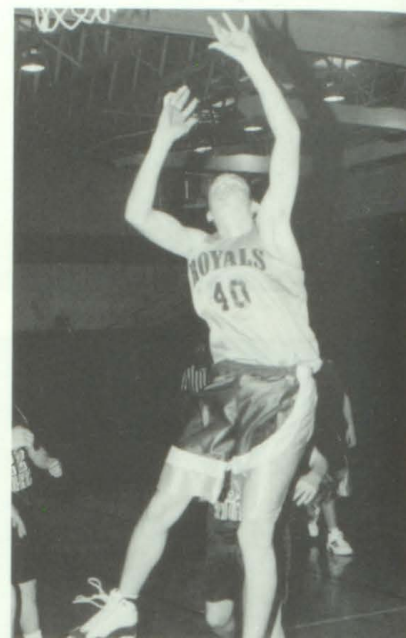

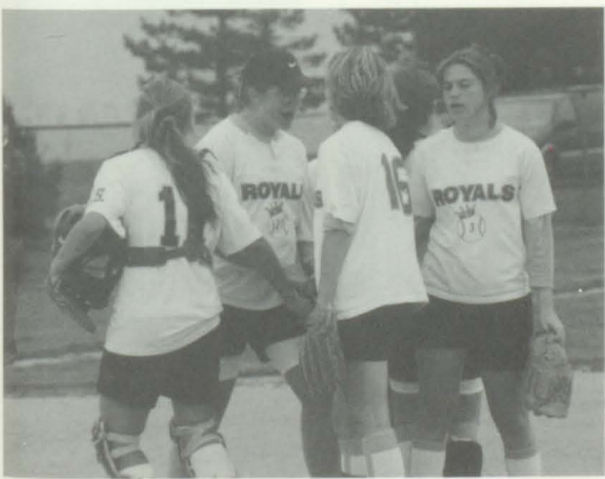

play the game. Now they make the Final Move from the game of learning and fun, to a much larger game, THE GAME OF LIFE.

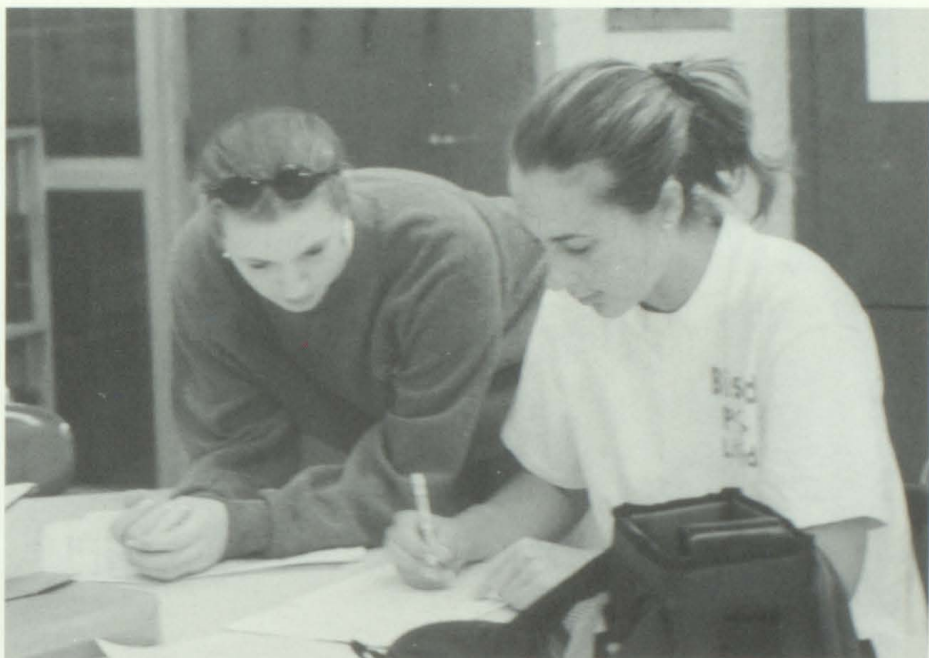

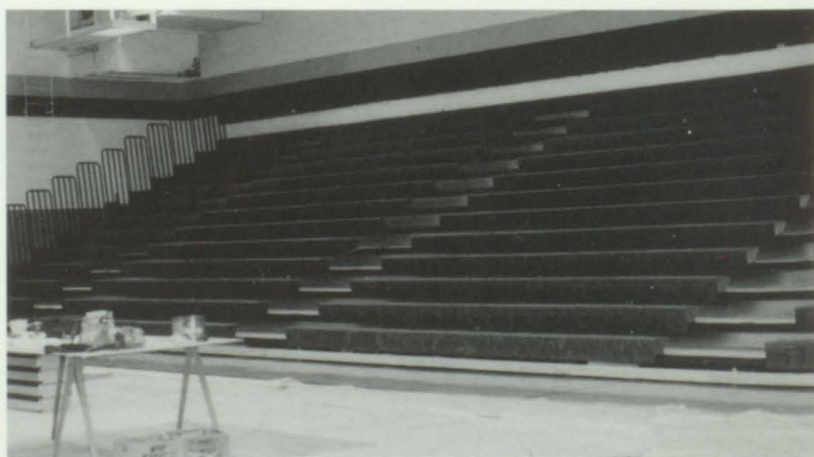
