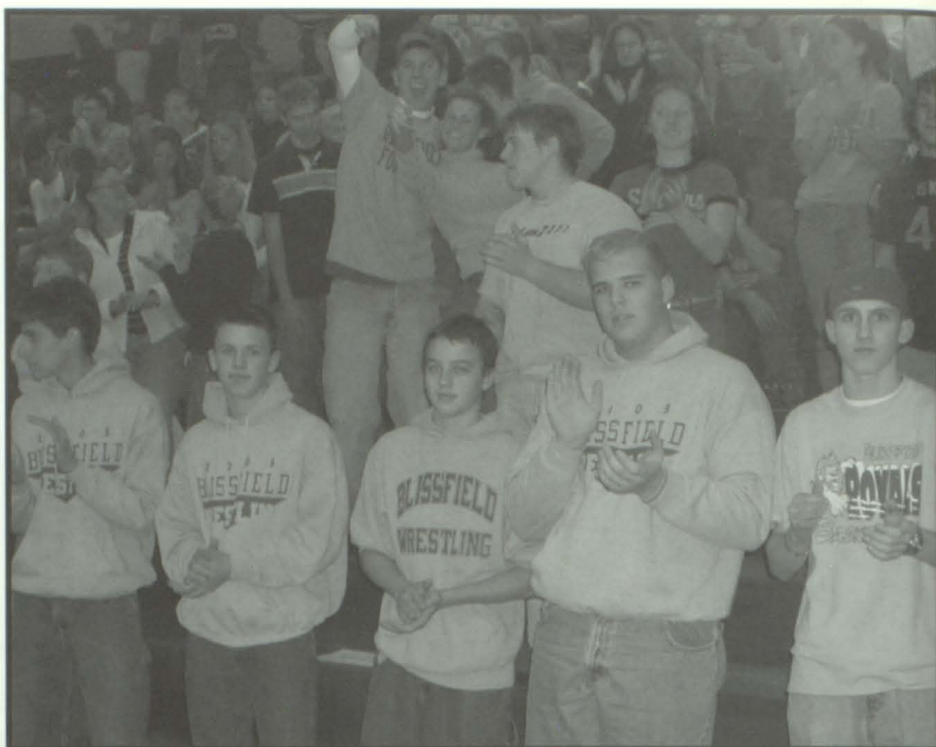

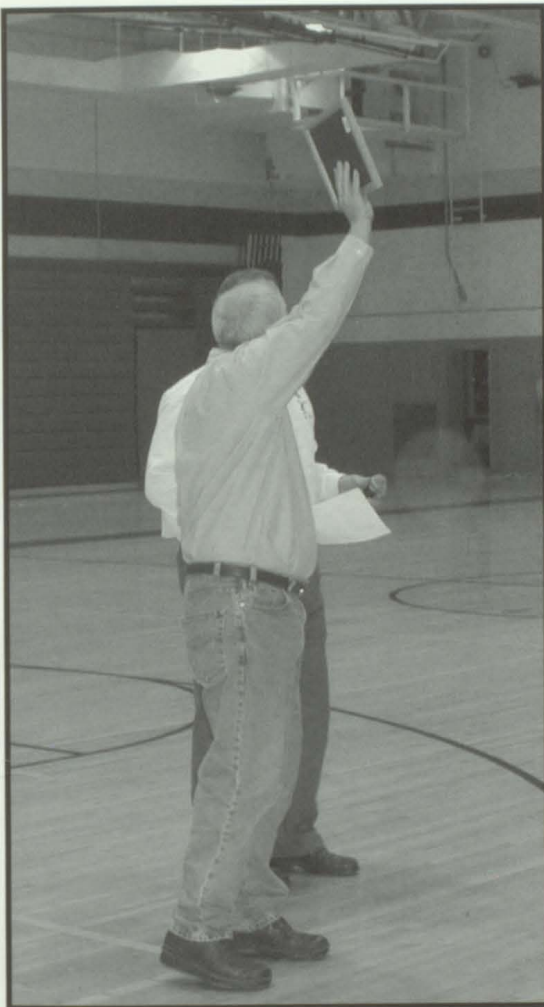

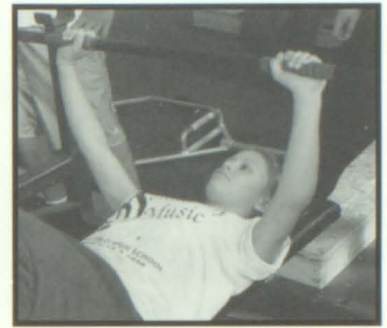

# A Taste Of Victory Football 2002

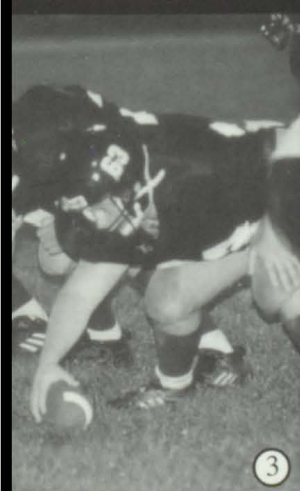

The Royals had a great season this year. We look forward to see what they bring in the future.

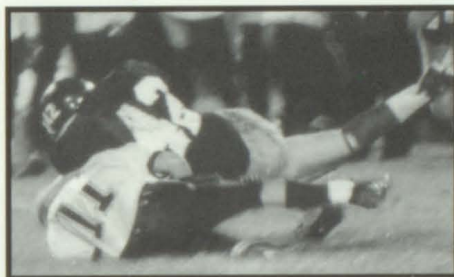

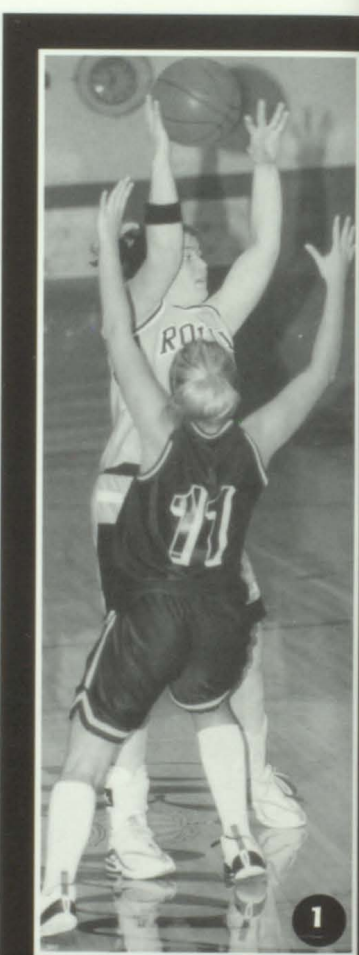

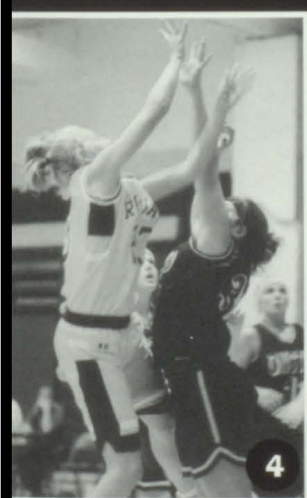




# Commitment to Excellence Girl's Basketball 2002

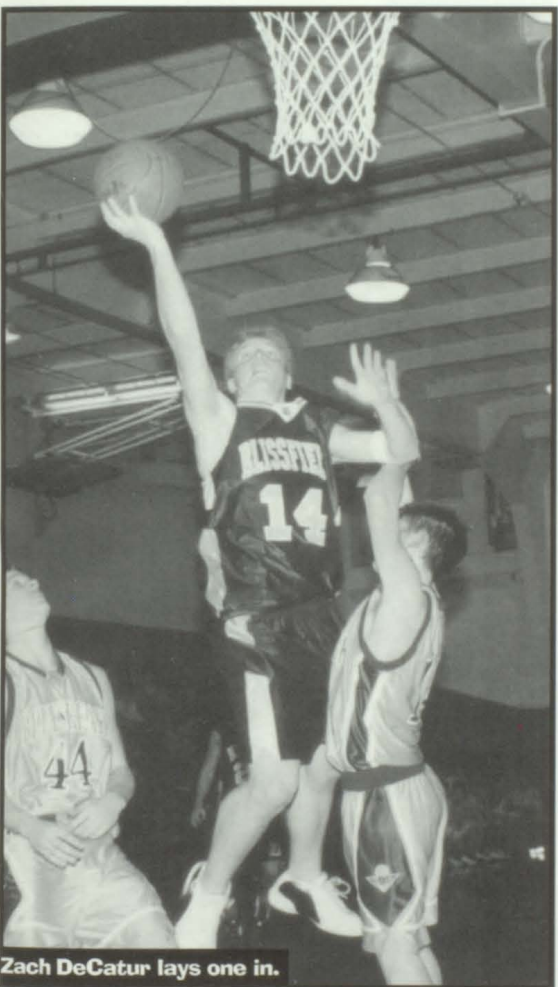

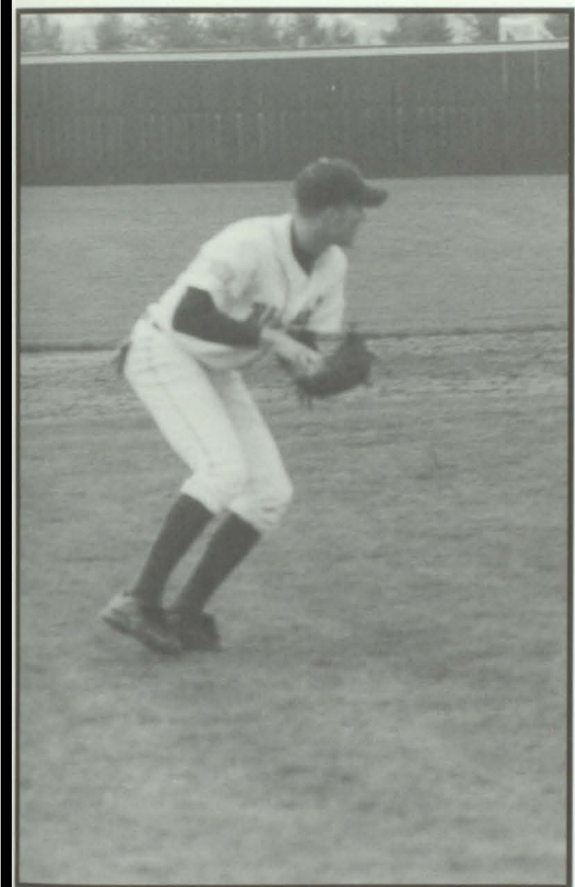


# A Tradition of Excellence Baseball 2003

Blissfield baseball once again had a standout season, with the varsity winning districts, regionals, and state. All of the teams also had outstanding records.

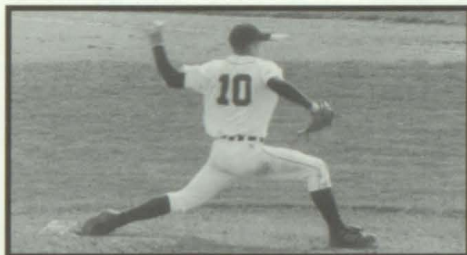
