
Wednesday, June 30, 6:00 PM: The Henna Artist by Alka Joshi

Wednesday, July 28, 6:00 PM:

The Last Painting of Sara De Vos by Dominic Smith

In 1631, Sara de Vos is admitted as a master painter to the Guild of St. Luke's in Holland, the first woman to be so recognized. Three hundred years later, only one work attributed to de Vos is known to remain. An Australian grad student, Ellie Shipley, struggling to stay afloat in New York, agrees to paint a forgery of this last painting, a landscape, a decision that will haunt her.

Chocolate Chip Mug Cake!

Recipe from Create Yum on Pinterest

Ingredients:

- 1/4 cup All-Purpose Flour
- 2 tablespoon Brown Sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon Baking Powder
- 3 tablespoon Milk
- 3 tablespoon Melted Butter
- 1/2 teaspoon Vanilla Extract
- 2 tablespoon Chocolate Chips

Directions:

Whisk together flour, sugar, and baking powder in a bowl.

Stir in milk, butter, and vanilla extract until smooth.

Fold in the chocolate chips into the batter.

Pour the batter into a microwave-safe mug, leaving space from the top to keep the batter from overflowing as it cooks. Microwave on high for 1-2 minutes.
