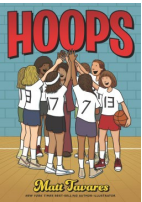

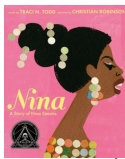
Endlessly Ever After

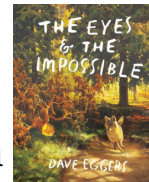
Sleuths, #1 by Natasha Deen

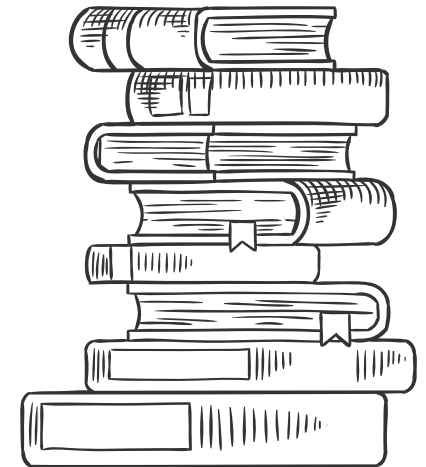

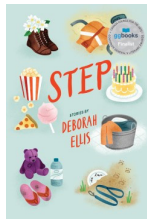

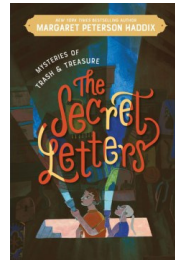
Swim Team by Johnnie Christmas

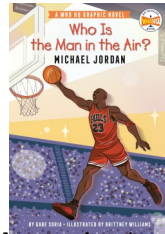
The Secret Letters, #1 by Margaret Haddix Peterson

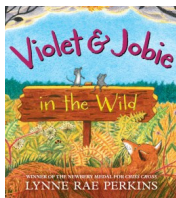
New Dragon City by Mari Mancusi
