They've been periodically scraped, reglazed, and repainted. But they're essentially unchanged since 1888. The windows are now failing because of age. 
Join Miss Rachel for songs, short picture-book stories, and more. This story time will focus on routine, repetition, and early literacy skills like ABCs and 123s.

The Gale Free Library is fortunate to be able to offer discounted passes to the Museum of Fine Arts (MFA), Boston. With over half a million works of art, the MFA welcomes more than a million visitors a year. Notable works on display include John Singleton Copley's "Paul Revere" (1768), Vincent Van Gogh's "Houses at Auvers" (1890), and King Menkaura (Mycerinus) and Queen, one of 65,000 works of art primarily from Egypt and Sudan, dating from 6500 BCE to 600 CE.

A Late Opening for the Gale Free Library?

As many of may know, especially if you attended the 125th Anniversary Celebration of the Damon Memorial—Gale Free Library in 2013, the Memorial and Library were dedicated on August 29, 1888. What you may not know is that the Library did not open on Dedication Day. In fact, the Gale Free Library didn't officially open for circulation until November 30, 1888.*

Why do you think three months passed before Holden's longawaited town library threw open its doors to the community? Most likely, for several reasons. First of all, the original staff of the Library consisted of one person, Librarian M. Addie Holden (today's staff numbers 19!). And second, Addie had her hands full. Now that the Town had a public library, The Holden Library Association (housed on the Second Floor of Town Hall) turned over their sizeable collection to the Gale Free and disbanded. Founders Samuel C. Gale and Susan (Damon) Gale contributed \$3,000.00 toward the purchase of new volumes, while John Wadsworth of Chicago provided \$100.00 for the same purpose.** Addie chose to wrap each volume in brown paper, and applied her own numbering system to the protective paper, using a dip pen and bottle of ink. Periodical and magazine subscriptions were purchased and the first new issues, catalogued. A system for circulating materials also had to be developed and put in place. And, of course, Addie had administrative duties to perform, including meeting with the Damon Memorial Trustees, responding to mail, and developing a way to present each item in the Library's collection in one place (the latter project took another two years). Not to mention that at least some of Addie's work was done under the light of kerosene-fueled lamps. So we say, "Hats off to Addie!"

*Holden High School, which was on the Second Floor of the Damon from 1888 to June 1926, opened in its new quarters in September 1888.

**\$3,100.00 for library books doesn't sound like much of a budget to modern ears, but in the 1880s hardcover volumes usually sold for less than \$2.00 apiece.


